NAVAL KNIGHTS OF WINDSOR.

Isle of Thanet Union.—Parish of Saint Peter.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Peter, in the county of Kent;—

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate;—

And to all others whom it may concern;—

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Saint Peter, in the county of Kent, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas, at a meeting of the Vestry, held at the Vestry Room in Saint Peter's Church, after public notice in that behalf, on Wednesday, the 5th day of August last, it was resolved—

"That the Poor Law Board be requested to issue an Order, under their Seal of Office, directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled 'An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,' shall be applied to and put in force within this parish, as regards the appointment of a Vestry Clerk."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application, in writing, to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution,

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows; that is to say:

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish of Saint Peter.

And, at the request of the said Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish, we do hereby prescribe and direct, that the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, shall perform all the duties specified in the said Act, except the following, namely:—

"To prepare and issue the necessary process for recovering of arrears of such rates respectively before the Justices, and procure the summons to be served, and to attend the Justices thereon, and advise the Churchwardens and Overseers as to the recovery of such arrears."

ARTICLE II.—That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall, unless the Poor Law Board otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of Vestry Clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the Statutes in that behalf and this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of eight pounds per annum.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual Feast Days in the year, namely, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, Lady Day, and Midsummer Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

ARTICLE IV.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

Fulham Union.—Parish of Fulham.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Fulham, in the county of Middlesex;—

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate;—

And to all others whom it may concern;—

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Fulham, in the county of Middlesex, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting of Vestrymen of the said parish, convened under the provisions of the "Metropolitan Local Management Act," and held at the National School, Walham Green, in the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Friday,

the twenty-fourth day of July last, it was (among other things) resolved,—

“That it is expedient that the 13th and 14th
“Vic., c. 57, intituled, ‘An Act to prevent
“the holding of Vestry or other meetings
“in Churches, and for regulating the ap-
“pointment of Vestry Clerks,’ shall be put
“in force in the parish of Fulham, so far as
“it applies to the appointment of Vestry
“Clerk.”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows; that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Fulham.

And at the request of the said Churchwardens, we hereby prescribe and direct that the said Vestry Clerk shall perform the following duties, in addition to the duties set forth in the said last-mentioned Act; that is to say:—

1. To make out the rates raised in the said parish under the Metropolis Local Management Act, and to procure the same to be allowed, and to give all notices thereof required by law, namely,—

The General Rate,
The Lighting Rate,
The Main Drainage Rate,
The Local Sewers Rate, and
The Metropolitan Sewers Rate.

and to prepare and countersign the Rate Receipt Books.

2. To make out, keep, and enter the accounts of the rates raised in the said parish under the Metropolis Local Management Act, and to attend the auditing thereof.
3. To enquire into the settlements of paupers becoming chargeable to the said parish, and to report thereon to the Churchwardens and Overseers, and on receiving instructions from them to prepare all documents necessary to obtain the order of removal, and to adopt all such subsequent proceedings as the law may require for the removal of the pauper which he shall be legally qualified to perform.

ARTICLE II.—That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall, unless the Poor Law Board otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of Vestry Clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the Statutes in that behalf and this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, and Christmas Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators in case he shall die while holding such office.

ARTICLE IV.—That every person appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk in the said parish, shall

give to the Guardians of the Poor of the Fulham Union, in the county of Middlesex, a bond in the penal sum of five hundred pounds, in the names of himself and two sufficient sureties, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and every such officer shall give immediate notice to the said Guardians of the death, insolvency, or bankruptcy of either of such sureties, and shall, when required by the said Guardians, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his sureties are alive and believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die, or become bankrupt or insolvent;

Provided that the Guardians may, if they think fit, take the security of any Society or Company expressly authorised by statute to guarantee or secure the faithful discharge of the duties of any Poor Law Officer.

ARTICLE V.—That the Auditor of the District comprising the said Fulham Union shall, in the statement required by the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the seventeenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to be transmitted to the Poor Law Commissioners of the securities of the officers of the said Union, include the name of the Vestry Clerk for the said parish of Fulham for the time being, appointed under the authority aforesaid, together with the particulars in the said General Order required, and shall report thereon to the Board of Guardians of the said Union, in like manner as therein set forth with reference to the securities of other officers.

ARTICLE VI.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
