It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at these Levees shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.

"The Godstone Highway District—consisting of the following parishes and places in the said county, which separately maintain their own highways: Bletchingly, Caterham, Chelsham, Crowhurst, Farleigh, Godstone, Horne, Limpsfield, Lingfield, Oxted, Tandridge, Tatsfield, Titsey, Warlingham, and Woldingham.

"Now it is hereby ordered by this Court, under the authority of the said Act, 25 and 26 Vict., cap. 61, after due consideration of the premises, that the Provisional Order above mentioned be,

and the same is hereby confirmed and made Final without alteration.

"And it is hereby further ordered, that the first Meeting of the respective Highway Boards of the said several Highway Districts be held severally and respectively at noon on Saturday, the 9th day of April, 1864, at the following places, namely:—The Chertsey Highway Board, in the Petty Sessions Room at Chertsey, in the said county; the Croydon Highway Board, in the Petty Sessions Room at Croydon, in the said county; the Dorking Highway Board, in the Petty Sessions Room at Dorking, in the said county; the Epsom Highway Board, in the Petty Sessions Room at Epsom, in the said county; the Farnham Highway Board, in the Petty Sessions Room at Farnham, in the said county; the Godstone Highway Board in the Petty Sessions Room at Godstone, in the said county; the Godalming Highway Board, in the Townhall of Godalming, in the said county; the Guildford Highway Board in the County Petty Sessions Room at Guildford, in the said county; the Blackheath Highway Board, at the Sea Horse Inn, at Shalford, in the said county; the Reigate Highway Board, in the County Petty Sessions Room at Reigate, in the said county; and the Kingston Highway Board, in the County Petty Sessions Room, at the Court House at Kingston-upon-Thames, in the said county."
