PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. HEREAS by an Order, dated the thirtieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that from and after the first day of September then next, it should be lawful for Horatio Nelson Lay, one of Her Majesty's subjects, and Sherard Osborne, a Captain in Her Majesty's Navy, to enter into the military and naval service of the Emperor of China, and to accept any commission, warrant, or other appointment under the said Emperor, and to accept any money, pay, or reward for their services, and to fit out, equip, purchase, and acquire ships or vessels of war for the use of the said Emperor, and to engage and enlist British subjects to enter the military and naval service of the said Emperor: and it was thereby further ordered, that it should be lawful for every British subject to enlist and enter himself by engaging and enlisting himself with the said Horatio Nelson Lay and Sherard Osborne, and no other person or persons whatsoever, in the military and naval service of the said Emperor, and to serve the said Emperor in any military, warlike, or other operations, either by land or by sea, and for that purpose to go to any place or places beyond the seas, and to accept any commission, warrant, or other appointment from or under the said Emperor, and to accept any money, pay, or reward for his service: Provided always, that the license and permission thereby given should be in force only for the term of two years from the said first day of September then next, unless, by Order in Council made in manner aforesaid, such period should be further extended:

And whereas by another Order in Council, dated the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, Her Majesty was further pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that from and after the sixteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, it should be lawful for all military officers in Her Majesty's service to enter young Prince may long be spared, and that he into the military service of the said Emperor, and

to accept any commission, warrant, or other appointment under the said Emperor, and to accept any money, pay, or reward for their services: and it was thereby ordered, that it should be lawful for all officers in Her Majesty's military service to serve the said Emperor in any military, warlike, or other operations, and for that purpose to go to any place or places beyond the seas, and to accept any commission, warrant, or other appointment from or under the said Emperor, and to accept any money, pay, or reward for their services: Provided always, that the license and permission thereby given should be in force only until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, unless by Order in Council made in manner aforesaid, such period should be further extended:

And whereas it has seemed fit to Her Majesty

to revoke the said Orders:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that so far as relates to any acts to be done in Great Britain or Ireland, the said several Orders in Council, bearing date respectively the thirtieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, shall be, and the same are hereby revoked as from the day of the date of this present Order; and that, so far as relates to any acts to be done within the dominions of the Emperor of China, or elsewhere than in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the said several Orders in Council, bearing date respectively the thirtieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, shall be, and the same are hereby revoked, as from the expiration of three calendar months from the day of the date of this present Order.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by the Act twenty-four and twenty-five Victoria, chapter one hundred and twenty-nine, Her Majesty was empowered to avail herself of the services of a certain number of Officers of the Merchant Service of the United Kingdom, and of the Colonies and Dependencies of Great Britain, as Officers of Reserve to the Royal Navy; and whereas certain Regulations have been made under the said Act, and in pursuance of the said Act and of the said Regulations made thereunder a considerable number of such Officers have been enrolled as Officers of Reserve; and whereas by the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, twenty-six and twenty-seven Victoria, chapter sixty-nine, it is enacted as follows, viz.:—

lows, viz.:—

"1. It shall be lawful for Her Majesty to accept from time to time the offers of any persons who have been, are, or shall be Masters, Mates, or Engineers of Ships in the Merchant Service aforesaid, or of other British Ships not belonging to Her Majesty, or of any persons who have been Commissioned Officers, Masters, or Engineers in the Indian Naval Force of Her Majesty, or in the Naval Force of the East India Company, to serve as Officers of Reserve to the Royal Navy, upon such terms and conditions as to Her Majesty may from time to time seem fit.

"sioners for executing his office, hereinafter "called the Admiralty, may enrol as Officers of "Reserve to the Royal Navy so many of such "persons as aforesaid as the Admiralty may from "time to time deem expedient, under and sub-"ject to such rules, orders, and regulations as "the Admiralty may, with the consent of Her "Majesty in Council, from time to time establish; and such persons so enrolled shall bear such rank in respect to the Officers of the "Royal Navy as the Admiralty may from time to "time direct, and shall when called out for training or exercise, or on actual service, be subject to all the laws, regulations, and customs for the time being in force for the government and discipline of the Royal Navy.

"3. Such persons so enrolled as Officers of

Such persons so enrolled as Officers of Reserve shall be entitled to receive such pay and allowances as the Admiralty, with the con-" sent of Her Majesty in Council, may from time "to time appoint; and if any such person is disabled or receives any hurt or wound in actual service, he shall be entitled to the same allow-" ance or pension in respect thereof as an Officer " of the Royal Navy of corresponding rank would " be entitled to under similar circumstances; and " if any such person is killed in action, or dies from any wound or accident resulting from the performance of his duty, his widow (if any) shall be entitled to the same pension as the widow of an officer of the Royal Navy of corresponding rank would be entitled to under

" 5. All rules, orders, and regulations relating to persons enrolled as Officers of Reserve to the "Royal Navy made before the passing of this Act by the Admiralty, with the consent of Her " Majesty in Council, shall, with respect to all persons enrolled before the passing of this Act, continue in force as if this Act had not been passed, and shall also extend and apply, as far as may be (mutatis mutandis), to all persons so enrolled after the passing of this Act, but so that any rules, orders, and regulations made as aforesaid from time to time under this Act may repeal or alter all or any part of any rules, "orders, and regulations made before the passing of this Act, and shall, unless otherwise ex-" pressed, extend and apply as well to persons so "enrolled before the passing of this Act as to "persons so enrolled after the passing of this " Act.

"6. On the passing of this Act the Act of the Session of the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of Her Majesty (chapter one hundred and twenty-nine), 'to enable Her Majesty to 'accept the services of Officers of the Merchant Service as Officers of Reserve to the Royal Navy,' shall be repealed; but this repeal shall not affect the past operation of the said Act, or the validity of anything already done, or any right, title, obligation, or liability already

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING ORDER.

1. Number, Class, and Rank.

The Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve on the Active List shall not exceed the total number of seven hundred, and shall consist of four classes, Viz. :-

1. "Lieutenants" of the Royal Naval Reserve, whose number shall not exceed one hundred and thirty, and who will, as to seniority and command, rank with, but after, Lieutenants

and Masters of the Royal Navy.
"Sub-Lieutenants" of the Royal Naval Reserve, whose number shall not exceed two hundred and seventy, and who will, as to seniority and command, rank with, but after, Sub-Lieutenants and Second Masters of the Royal Navy.

3. "Engineers" of the Royal Naval Reserve, whose number shall not exceed one hundred, and who will rank with, but after, Engineers

of the Royal Navy.

First Class "Assistant Engineers," of the Royal Naval Reserve, whose number shall not exceed one hundred, and Second Class "Assistant Engineers" of the Royal Naval Reserve, whose number shall not exceed one hundred. First Class Assistant Engineers will rank with, but after, First Class Assistant Engineers of the Royal Navy; and Second Class Assistant Engineers will rank with, but after, Second Class Assistant Engineers of the Royal Navy.

2. Appointment.

The whole of these Officers shall be appointed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty; but their applications for appointment shall be made through the Board of Trade, Whitehall, London.

3. Qualification.

The following Officers shall be eligible for Commissions as Lieutenants of the Royal Naval

Reserve, viz.:-

1. Masters of British Merchant Ships or of other British Ships not belonging to Her Majesty, under 45 years of age, who hold certificates of competency under the "Mercantile Marine Act, 1850," or the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and who have commanded vessels of not less than 500 tons gross burthen for not less than two years, and who are actually afloat and in command at the time of making their application for a commission.

2. Officers under 45 years of age, who have attained the rank of Master, or a higher rank, in the Indian Naval Force of Her Majesty, or in the Naval Force of the East

India Company.

The following Officers shall be eligible for Commissions as Sub-Lieutenants of the Royal Naval

1. Chief Mates of British Merchant Ships, or of other Ships not belonging to Her Majesty, under 35 years of age, who hold Masters' or Chief Mates' Certificates of Competency under "The Mercantile Marine Act, 1850, or "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and who have sailed as Masters or as Chief gross burthen for not less than two years, and who are actually afloat as Masters or Chief Mates at the time of making their application for a commission.

2. Officers under 40 years of age, who have attained the rank of Second Master, or a higher rank in the Indian Naval Force of Her Majesty, or in the Naval Force of the

East India Company.

The following Officers shall be eligible for Commissions as Engineers of the Royal Naval

Reserve, viz.:-

1. Engineers of British Merchant Ships, or of other British Ships not belonging to Her Majesty, who hold First Class Engineer's Certificates of Competency under "The Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," whose age does not exceed 40 years, and who at the time of making their applications are actually afloat in charge of engines of upwards of 100 nominal horse power.

2. Engineers who have attained the rank of Engineer, or a higher rank, in the Indian Naval Force of Her Majesty, or in the Service of the East India Company, and

whose age does not exceed 40 years.

The following Officers shall be eligible for Commissions or Appointments as Assistant Engineers of the Royal Naval Reserve, viz. :-

(1.) For First Class Assistants of the Royal

Naval Reserve, viz. :-

(a.) Engineers of British Merchant Ships, or of other British Ships not belonging to Her Majesty, who hold First or Second Class Engineers' Certificates of com-petency under "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," whose age does not exceed 40 years, who have served as First Engineers of Home Trade passenger steam ships with engines of 100 nominal horse power or upwards, for not less than 3 years, or as Second Engineers of foreign-going steam ships, with engines of 100 nominal horse power or upwards for not less than 3 years, and who, at the time of making their application, are actually affoat.

(b.) Engineers who have attained the rank of Engineer or First Class Assistant Engineer, or a higher rank, in the Indian Naval Force of Her Majesty, or in the Service of the East India Company, whose

age does not exceed 40 years.

(2) For the Second Class Assistant Engineers of the Royal Naval Reserve :-

(a.) Engineers having similar qualifications to those required of a First Class Assistant Engineer, excepting that they need not have served affoat for a period of 3

Engineers and Assistant Engineers of the Reserve will not be required to undergo drill.

In selecting applicants for Commissions, preference will be given to those possessing Extra Certificates of competency, provided their merits appear to be equal in other respects.

Qualification for a Lieutenant's Commission will be a qualification for a Sub-Lieutenant's Commission, and a qualification for an Engineer's Commission will be a qualification for an

Assistant Engineer's Commission.

After the 1st January, 1865, no person will be eligible for a Commission as Lieutenant on the Active List in the Royal Naval Reserve until he has held a Commission as Sub-Lieutenant on the Active List of the Reserve for one year or apwards. And after the same date no person Mates in vessels of not less than 500 tons will be eligible for a Commission as Engineer in the Royal Naval Reserve until he has held; Commission or Appointment as Assistant Engineer of the Reserve for one year or upwards.

4. Honorary Commanders, Chief Engineers, Lieutenants, and Sub-Lieutenants.

In addition to the Officers of the Reserve on the Active List there shall be a class of Honorary Officers of the Reserve not exceeding in the whole 160 in number, and of the ranks named

below, viz.:—

(a.) Honorary Commanders of the Reserve not exceeding 30 in number, and consisting of the second beautiful to t Officers of the Reserve who have held Lieutenants' Commissions for not less than 5 years and who are not less than 50 years of age. Honorary Commanders of the Reserve will rank with, but after, Staff Commanders of the Royal Navy

(b.) Honorary Chief Engineers of the Reserve not exceeding 30 in number, and consisting of Officers of the Reserve who have held Commissions as Engineers of the Reserve for not less than 10 years and who are not less than 50 years of age. They will rank with, but after, Chief Engineers of the Royal Navy.

(c.) Honorary Lieutenants and Sub-Lieutenants of the Reserve not exceeding 100 in number and

consisting of;

(1.) For Honorary Lieutenants; Masters of Vessels actually affoat and in command, and possessing qualifications similar to the qualifications of the Lieutenants on the Active List, except that they must be above 45 years of age, and need not be in possession of Certificates of competency; and

(2.) For Honorary Lieutenants; Owners of sea-going pleasure yachts of 50 tons register or upwards, who command and act as Masters

of their own yachts; and
(3.) For Honorary Lieutenants; Superintendents of Mercantile Marine Offices who have served as Masters in the Merchant Service; and

(4.) For Honorary Sub-Lieutenants; Deputy Superintendents of Mercantile Offices who have served as Chief Mates, or who have attained a higher rank in the Merchant Service.

Honorary Lieutenants of the Reserve will rank with, but after, Lieutenants and Masters of the Royal Navy, and Honorary Sub-Lieutenants of the Reserve will rank with, but after, Sub-Lieutenants and Second Masters of the Royal Navy.

The Officers on the Honorary List will not be required to undergo drill, nor will they be liable to be called out for active service, except in cases of emergency, and not then, unless they have been at any time on the Active List.

6. Promotion.

Officers of the lower rank in the Active List will, if qualified, be eligible for promotion to the higher rank on that list, at the discretion of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Officers who, when in actual service, may, by the character or length of their service, obtain the special approbation of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, will be eligible to receive Commissions as Officers in the Royal Navy, of the same grade as that with which they may rank They will then be considered in all at the time. respects as Officers on the permanent strength of the Navy.

Officers who, whilst on actual service, shall have distinguished themselves in action with the enemy, or by the character and length of their services, will be eligible, at the conclusion of their service in the Navy, for promotion to the higher hono-

rary ranks of Commander and Captain of the Naval Reserve, at the discretion of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Officers of the Reserve who shall have displayed zeal in promoting the efficiency of the Reserve will be favourably considered for promotion, at the discretion of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

7. Retirement.

Officers who wish to retire from the Active List may do so at the discretion of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty on consideration of their services; either

 (1.) Without rank; or
 (2.) On the Honorary List, with the rank they may hold at the time of their retirement:

(3.) On the Honorary List at a higher rank.

8. Uniform.

Officers to wear the same uniform as Officers of corresponding rank in the Royal Navy, with

the following exceptions, viz.:—
Commanders, Chief Engineers, Lieutenants, Sub-Lieutenants, and Engineers. - Instead of each stripe of half-inch lace round the sleeves of the coats there is to be a stripe formed of two waved lines of quarter-inch gold braid, intersecting each other, so as to form bands half an inch wide, the blue cloth to show between the curves.

The Engineers' Department are to be distinguished by purple velvet stripes, quarter inch wide, between the gold braid waved lines round the sleeves of the coat.

Engineers who are only entitled to one waved line, the velvet stripe is to be worn below the gold braid on the sleeves of the coat.

Assistant Engineers, one waved stripe of purple velvet, quarter inch wide, round the sleeves of the coat above the cuff, without any gold braid.

The buttons to be of the Royal Navy pattern, with the letters "R.N.R." in Old English

character, surmounted by a crown.

Instead of the anchor on the epaulettes and shoulder straps respectively, there is to be a badge consisting of a silver anchor in the centre, surrounded with the words "Royal Naval Reserve" embroidered in gold.

Instead of the bullion loop on the cocked hats, the loop to be formed of two gold braids,

twisted the same as for coat sleeves.

The badge for the caps to consist of a device similar to that on the epaulettes, embroidered on blue cloth and surmounted by a crown.

The plate for the sword-belt to be the same as for Officers of the Royal Navy, substituting the letters "R.N.R." for the anchor in the centre.

9. Drill.

Lieutenants and Sub-Lieutenants on the Active List of the Royal Naval Reserve will be required to undergo in each year a course of twenty-eight days' drill and gunnery instruction on board one of the District Drill ships, or if absent from England above a year and unable to take their drill on board a Drill Ship, they may perform it on board one of Her Majesty's ships abroad having a Gunnery Lieutenant.

But on a special report being made to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty by the Commander of such Drill or Gunnery ship in the United Kingdom, or by the Captain of such ship abroad, to the effect that a Lieutenant or Sub-Lieutenant of the Reserve is competent to instruct and drill men of the Reserve, then such Lieutenant or Sub-Lieutenant will be required | to undergo seven days' test drill each year, and if such test drill is performed to the satisfaction of the officer superintending the drill, the further twenty-one days will be dispensed with; but if the seven days' test drill is not satisfactory, the further twenty-one days drill must be performed.

10. Messing.

Officers, whilst on drill, will live on shore, and receive the following subsistence allowance, viz.:

- 10s. a-day. Lieutenants Sub-Lieutenants 7s. a-day.

All Officers called out for service will mess with Officers of their respective ranks in the Royal Navy.

11. Discipline.

Officers will be subject to Naval discipline when attending drill, and when called out for actual service; and will also at any time whilst belonging to the Reserve, be liable to lose their Commissions for conduct unbecoming the character of Her Majesty's service, at the discretion of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty. They are expected to provide themselves with a copy of the Queen's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

12. Service Afloat.

Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve will be called out for actual service by Royal Proclamation; and they will be liable to serve during the continuance of any national emergency, or until they may be regularly discharged by the direction of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

13. Pay and Allowances, and Pensions to Widows.

Officers will, whilst called out for actual service, receive the pay of their corresponding ranks in the Royal Navy.

Officers who may receive hurts or wounds whilst on active service in the Royal Navy or whilst undergoing drill, will receive the same pensions and allowances to which Officers in the Navy would be entitled under similar circum-

Widows of Officers who, whilst on actual service, may be killed in action, or die from accident resulting from the performance of their duty, will receive the same pensions as the widows of Naval Officers of corresponding rank would be entitled to under similar circumstances.

14. Repeal.

All Rules, Orders, and Regulations made in pursuance of the Act twenty-four and twenty-five Victoria, chapter one hundred and twenty-nine, shall be repealed from the date when these Regulations come into operation; but this repeal shall not affect the validity of any thing already done, or any right, title, obligation, or liability already accrued thereunder.

THEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament, held in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for facilitating the Union of Liberties with the Counties in which they are situate," it is enacted that where it shall seem expedient to the ! Peace, at Wakefield, in and for the said riding, on

Justices of any Liberty, or to the Justices of the county in which any Liberty is situate, that the union of the Liberty with the county in which the same is situated should be effected under this Act, it shall be lawful for such Justices in General or Quarter Sessions assembled, to resolve that a Petition shall be presented to Her Majesty, praying that such union take place, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such Petition until notice thereof shall be given, as thereinafter described; and that previously to the consideration of any such Petition, notice of the resolution of such Justices shall be advertised in a London newspaper, and also in some newspaper circulating in the county to which the Liberty is proposed to be united, for three successive weeks, and shall also unless the Clerk of the Peace of the county and of the liberty is the same person) be given to the Clerk of the Peace of the county, in case the resolution shall be the resolution of the Justices of the Liberty, or in case the resolution shall be the resolution of the Justices of the county, to the Clerk of the Peace of the Liberty, and such notice shall be so advertised and given by the Clerk of the Peace of the county or Liberty the Justices of which shall come to the resolution, and shall mention the time and place when the Petition for union will be taken into consideration by the Justices of the county or Liberty coming to the resolution; and the said Justices shall confer with any person who shall attend the meeting of the said Justices for that purpose, and who shall appear to the said Justices to be interested in the matter of the said Petition touching the said Petition, and such other circumstances as shall appear to the said Justices fit to be considered in effecting a union of the Liberty with the county under the provisions of this Act; and such Petition (which shall set forth the reasons upon which the same is founded, and also the terms and conditions upon or under which it is desired that the union shall take place, and particularly the mode in which the gaol and other property of the Liberty and the debt, if any, charged on the rates of such Liberty, is proposed to be dealt with, and the nature and amount of compensation, if any, to be paid to any Custos Rotulorum, Hereditary Sheriff, Clerk of the Peace, Coroner, Treasurer, or other person holding or entitled to any permanent franchise or office in or belonging to the said Liberty, and in what manner such compensation is proposed to be raised and paid, and such other matters and things as are proper to be provided for on the union of the Liberty with the county) shall be certified to Her Majesty under the hand of the Chairman of the Justices present when such Petition shall be agreed to.

And it was also enacted, that where any such Petition as aforesaid as well of the Justices of the county as of any Liberty situate therein, shall be certified as aforesaid to Her Majesty, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she shall think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration such Petition, and also any other Petition which may be presented to Her by any person concerning any proposed union of the Liberty with the county, to order the union of such Liberty with the county from such time, upon such terms and conditions, and subject to such restrictions, and generally in such manner as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem

expedient. And whereas, in pursuance of provisions afore-

said of the statute aforesaid, the Justices of the Peace for the West Riding of the county of York, assembled in General Quarter Sessions of the

Tuesday, the fifth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, have presented a Petition to Her Majesty, setting forth that there exists within the West Riding of the county of York a Liberty called the Liberty of Cawood, Wistow, and Otley, consisting of fifteen townships or places, namely, Cawood, Wistow, Baildon, Burley, Denton, Esholt, Farnley, Guiseley, Hawkesworth, Lindley, Menston, Newall-with Cliffon, Otley, Pools, and Timble Little with-Clifton, Otley, Poole, and Timble Little, which Liberty, by virtue of the Statute passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter eighty-seven, intituled "An Act for extinguishing the Secular Jurisdiction of the Archbishop of York and the Bishop of Ely in certain Liberties in the Counties of York, Nottingham, and Cambridge," is now vested in Her Majesty, Her heirs, and successors; that such Liberty has a separate Commission of the Peace, but is not an incorporated borough; that it was resolved by the Justices of the Peace for the said riding, assembled at the Quarter Sessions of the Peace, held at Leeds, in and for the said riding, on Tuesday, the twentieth day of October last, that it seemed expedient to the Justices of the Peace of the said riding, that the union of the said Liberty of Cawood, Wistow, and Otley with the said West Riding, in which riding the same liberty is situated, should be effected, under the said Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and five; and it was also further resolved and ordered, that a Petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying that such union should take place, and that the further consideration of such Petition should be adjourned until this Quarter Sessions, and that in the meantime notice should be given of the intention to take such Petition into consideration by the Justices of the said riding at this Sessions, at Wakefield afore-said, as required by the said Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and five, section two; that, in pursuance of the said resolution and order, and in conformity with the said Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and five, notice by the Clerk of the Peace of the said West Riding has been duly advertized in the London "Times newspaper, and also in the "Leeds Mercury," and "Leeds Intelligencer," being respectively newspapers circulating in the said West Riding, for three successive weeks previously to the holding of this Quarter Sessions; and notice has also been duly given by the said Clerk of the Peace of the said West Riding to the Clerk of the Peace of the said liberty, that the said resolution and order would be taken into consideration at this Sessions, being the time and place mentioned in the said resolution and order, and to which the further consideration of the said Petition was adjourned; that the reasons upon which the Petition was founded, and the terms and conditious upon or under which it is desired that the union of the said Liberty with the said West Riding shall take place, are the following :-

- That there is no gaol or other property of the said Liberty, and no debt charged on the rates of such Liberty to be dealt with;
- 2. That the said townships or places of Cawood and Wistow, part of the said Liberty, are situated at a distance of about thirty miles from Otley and the other parts of the said Liberty, and have been for some time and are now, in fact and in practice, separated from

and independent of the said Liberty; That no business arising within the townships or places of Cawood or Wistow is ever transacted in Petty Session or in Quarter Sessions of Justices of the Peace for the said Liberty;

3. That the said townships or places of Cawood and Wistow form, in fact, a part of the said West Riding, as being parcel of the Lower Division of Barkstonash, in the said riding, and that the inhabitants of the said two townships or places always transact their Petty Sessional business in the said Lower Division of Barkstonash, and their Quarter Sessions business at the Quarter or intermediate Sessions held for the said riding;

4. That the thirteen other townships or places above mentioned are all within and form part of the Petty Sessional Division of Otley, one of the Petty Sessional Divisions of the said riding, which said Petty Sessional Division of Otley consists of twenty-nine townships;

5. That all the fifteen townships or places constituting the said Liberty are rated, and contribute to the rates of the said riding in the nature of county rates;

 That Sessions of the Peace, for the trial of persons charged with felony or misdemeanour, are held every six weeks for and within the said riding.

7. That the Sessions of the Peace for the said Liberty being only held once in each quarter, (and then on the same day as the Quarter Sessions of the said riding), the persons committed for trial on such charges by the Justices of the Peace of the said Liberty, have frequently to remain in prison before trial for a much longer period than when committed for trial at the sessions of the Peace for the said riding, and on their trial are unable to obtain, without great expense and inconvenience, the assistance of members of the bar, whose duties require their attendance at the riding sessions;

8. That very few appeals can by law be tried at the Liberty Sessions, and, in fact, for a long period none have been tried there, and that the business of the Quarter Sessions for the said Liberty is so small as not to justify the summoning and attendance of jurors and other officers and persons at such Quarter Sessions, or the expenses of holding such Quarter Sessions separate and apart from the Quarter Sessions of the said riding;

 That at the last seventeen Quarter Sessions for the said Liberty an aggregate of only eleven prisoners has been tried;

10. That all persons remanded for examination by the Justices of the Peace for the said Liberty are confined, during such remand, in the lock-up at Otley, belonging to the said Riding, and that all persons committed for trial by such Justices on charges of felony or misdemeanour are confined until trial in the house of correction at Wakefield, in and for the said Riding;

11. That although there is a separate Commission of the Peace for the said Liberty, the Justices of the Peace for the said West Riding have and exercise concurrent jurisdiction with the Justices of the Peace for the said Liberty, but all Justices of the Riding acting for the Otley Petty Sessional Division not being Liberty Justices when Liberty cases are being heard, they can take no part in the proceedings, and that all or nearly all the acting Justices of the Peace for the said Liberty are also Justices of the Peace for the said Riding;

12. That there is no place belonging to the said Liberty in which Sessions of the Peace can be held, and that a room has to be hired for the purpose of holding such Sessions, the expense of which is paid out of the funds of the said Riding;

13. That there is no rate for the said Liberty in the nature of county rate to defray any of the expenses of summoning juries, or connected with the holding of the Quarter Sessions for the said liberty, or any other charges or expenses connected with the said Liberty;

14. That all such expenses and charges are borne by and paid out of the county rates of

the said Riding;

15. That the Custos Rotulorum of the said West Riding is, by virtue of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter eighty-seven, section six, the keeper of the records of the Court of Sessions of the Peace of the said Liberty;

That there is no Hereditary Sheriff, Coroner, or Treasurer for the said Liberty; that the only persons holding or entitled to any permanent franchise or office in or belonging to the said Liberty are Henry Newstead, the Clerk of the Peace of the said Liberty, and James Dawson, the Chief Bailiff thereof; that the compensation to be paid to the said Henry Newstead on the union of the said Liberty with the said county has been fixed at the sum of thirty-two pounds (for life) per annum, and the compensation to be paid to the said James Dawson on the said union has been fixed at the sum of thirteen pounds (for life) per annum, the said respective sums as compensation to be paid by half-yearly payments, and to be raised and paid out of the rates of the said Riding, levied and collected in the nature of county rates; that the administration of justice would be facilitated by the union of the said Liberty with the said Riding, and there no longer exists any valid reason why the peculiar privileges heretofore belonging to the Liberty of Cawood, Wistow, and Otley should not now be extinguished, and that its inhabitants, receiving equally with the other inhabitants of the West Riding the benefit of the organization of police and accommodation for sessional purposes, should have at the expense of the Riding a Quarter Sessions of their own; and praying that Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, would take the Petition into consideration, and order the union of the said Liberty of Cawood, Wistow, and Otley with the said West Riding of the county of York, from such time, upon such terms and conditions, and subject to such restrictions, and generally in such manner as to Her Majesty with the advice aforesaid should seem expedient: which Petition was certified to Her Majesty, under the hand of the Chairman of the Justices at the Sessions when the said Petition was agreed to.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said Petition into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the union of the said Liberty of Cawood, Wistow, and Otley with the said West Riding of the county of York shall take place on the twenty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, upon all and every the terms and conditions set forth in the said Petition, upon and under which it is desired in the said Petition that the said union shall take place.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Calder Vale, in the parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, and of the parochial chapelry of Bleasdale, within the parish of Lancaster, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the church of the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, and from the church of the said parochial chapelry of Bleasdale.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous parts of the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, and of the said parochial chapelry of Bleasdale, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Calder Vale

aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the Right Reverend James Prince, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, of Thomas Pedder, of Finsthwaite House, Newton in Cartmel, in the said county of Lancaster, Gentleman, and of Richard Pedder, of Winckley Square, Preston, in the same county, Gentleman, the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, of George Marton, of Capernwray Hall, in the said county of Lancaster, Gentleman, the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Lancaster, and of the Reverend Joseph Turner, the vicar or incumbent of such last-mentioned vicarage, and, as such vicar or incumbent, the patron of the perpetual curacy of the said parochial chapelry of Bleasdale (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous parts of the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, and of the said parochial chapelry of Bleasdale, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Calder Vale aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale.'

"And we further represent that it has been mutually agreed between the said Thomas Pedder, Richard Pedder, George Marton, and Joseph Turner (testified as aforesaid), that the right of presenta-tion and appointment to the church of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale, shall belong to and be exercised alternately by the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, and by William James Garnett, of Quernmore Park, in the said county of Lancaster, Esquire, his heirs, and assigns, and that the first such right of presentation and appointment, as aforesaid, which shall arise shall belong to and be exercised by such last-mentioned vicar or incumbent.

"We, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your

Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale, being :-

"All that part of the parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, which is comprised within those portions of the township of Claughton, and of the township of Barnacre-with-Bonds, and within that detached portion of the township of Catterall which are situate to the northeast of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary dividing the said township of Claughton from the township of Bilsborough, in the same parish, at a point in the centre of Walmsley Bridge, which carries a certain lane leading to Sandholme Mill over the River Brock, and extending thence in a direction mainly northwestward along the middle of the said lane, passing Duckworth Hall and Langtrees and Crab Tree Nook, and crossing the boundary which divides the said township of Claughton from the township of Barnacre-with-Bonds aforesaid, to the southern end of Sandholme Bridge, near Sandholme Mill aforesaid, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said bridge crossing the River Calder to the middle of the southern end of Sandholme-lane, and extending thence in a direction mainly northward along the middle of the last-named lane to its junction with Park Headlane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane to its junction near Cross House with the road called Smithy-hill, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road to its junction with Pasture-lane, and extending thence first northwestward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane to a point in the middle of its northern extremity, and extending thence first westward to a point in the middle of the fence which divides Barnacre Moor from Woodscre Pasture, and extending thence northward along the middle of the same fence to its junction with the fence dividing Upper Pasture Wood from Woodacre Pasture aforesaid and Lower Pasture Wood, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-described fence to the boundary which divides the said township of Barnacre-with-Bonds from the township of Nether Wyersdale, in the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang.

"And also all that part of the parish of Lancaster, in the said county of Lancaster, and diocese

of Manchester aforesaid, which is comprised within that portion of the parochial chapelry and town-ship of Bleasdale, which is situate to the northwest of an imaginary line, commencing on the boundary No. 22828.

which divides the said parochial chapelry and township from the parish of Slaidburn, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, at a point in the middle of the north-eastern end of Hunters Clough, and extending thence southwestward along the middle of the said clough to its junction with the River Calder aforesaid, and extending thence in a direction generally westward along the middle of the river last referred to as far as the point at which it is joined by East Grain Brook, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said brook as far as a point at which it is joined by a certain stream which divides Luddocks Fell from Calder Fell, and extending thence southward to and along the middle of the last-described stream to a boundary stone inscribed 'C. V. St. J. C. C. 1864, No. 1, and placed at the source of the same stream, and extending thence in a direct line due south to another boundary stone, inscribed 'C. V. St. J. C. C. 1864, No. 2,' and placed on the northern side of Calder Dyke, and continuing thence, still due south, to a point in the middle of the said dyke, and extending thence in a direction generally westward along the middle of the same dyke for the distance of rather more than a mile to a point opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'C. V. St. J. C. C. 1864, No. 3,' and placed on the northern side of the said dyke at a point due north of the northern corner of Bleasdale Tower Wood, and extending thence in a straight line due south, crossing Hazelhurst Fell, to the said northern corner of Bleasdale Tower Wood aforesaid, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the fence which forms the north-western boundary of the said wood to the south-western extremity of such fence near the quarry in the western corner of the same wood, and extending thence westward diagonally across the road leading from Hazelhurst Fell to Bleasdale Tower to the boundary which divides the said parochial chapelry and township of Bleasdale from the before-mentioned detached portion of the township of Catterall, in the parish of Saint Helen, Garstang aforesaid.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, situate in Bishopsgate

aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Archibald Campbell, Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Saint Botolph Without, Bishopsgate, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned to the said church, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Bishopsgate.'

"And, with the like consent of the said Archibald Campbell, Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified as aforesaid), we further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings, should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the

time being.

"We, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eleventh day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nine-teenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following

representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Leusden, in the parish of Widecombe-in-the-Moor, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient, that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at

Leusden aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Widecombe-in-the-Moor, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Leusden, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Leusden.'

"And, with the like consent of the said Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter (testified as aforesaid), we further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"We, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Leusden, being :-

"All that part of the parish of Widecombe-inthe-Moor, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter, which is situate generally to the south and west of an imaginary line commencing at a point upon the boundary dividing the said parish from the parish of Buckland-in-the-Moor, in the same county and diocese, such point being situate at or near the confluence of the two streams (the one flowing from the village of Widecombe, and the other flowing from the homestead and farm known as West Shallowford), which together form the River Webbern, and extending thence first westward and then northward along the middle of the last-mentioned of the same two streams to a point opposite to the middle of the south-western end of the fence dividing the inclosure numbered 1054 upon the tithe commutation map of the said parish of Widecombe-in-the Moor and upon the map hereunto annexed from the inclosure numbered 1058 upon the said maps, and extending thence first northward and then northeastward to and along the middle of such lastmentioned fence and of the fence or fences dividing the inclosures numbered respectively 1054 as aforesaid and 1049 upon the said maps from the inclosures numbered respectively 1056, 1055, and 1050 upon the same maps to the junction of the fence dividing the inclosure numbered 1049 as aforesaid from the inclosure numbered 1050 as aforesaid, with the fence dividing the inclosure numbered 1047 upon the said maps from the inclosure numbered 1050 as aforesaid, and extend-

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portion of the said parish of Easington hereinafter mentioned and described (such portion not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purpose of divine worship) should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Easington have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein-mentioned Acts.

"And whereas by an indenture, bearing date on or about the thirteenth day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and made or expressed to be made between Samuel Long, of Bromley-hill, in the county of Kent, Esquire, and Russell Ellice, of Leadenhall-street, in the city of London, Merchant, of the first part; Richard Lawrence Pemberton, of 'The Barnes,' in the county of Durham, Esquire, of the second part; and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the third part (which indenture is intended to be enrolled in your Majesty's High Court of Chancery, at Westminster); the said Samuel Long and Russell Ellice did, at the request of the said Richard Lawrence Pemberton, grant and con-firm unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and our successors, in aid of the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, a yearly rent charge of seventyfive pounds, issuing and payable out of and charged upon certain lands, tenements, and hereditaments situate in the township of Hawthorn, in the said parish of Easington.

"And whereas the Reverend James Manisty is the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Easington, and the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Durham, is in right of his see the patron of the rectory of the said parish of Easington.

"And whereas by an indenture, bearing date on or about the twenty-third day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and made or expressed to be made between the

T the Court at Windsor, the 1st day of | Charles, Bishop of Durham, of the second part; and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the third part (which last-mentioned indenture is also intended to be enrolled in your Majesty's High Court of Chancery, at Westminster); the said James Manisty, with the privity of the said Charles, Bishop of Durham, granted unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and our successors, in further aid of the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, certain tithe commutation rentcharges or portions of tithe commutation rentcharges, amounting in gross to the sum of twenty-seven pounds nine shillings and eleven pence per annum, issuing, arising, and payable out or in respect of certain lands and hereditaments situate in the township of Hawthorn aforesaid, and being portions of the tithe commutation rent charges belonging to the said rectory of Easington.

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us in each and every year said James Manisty, of the first part; the said I to the minister for the time being of the district so

recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed as aforesaid, the sum of fifty pounds by equal halfyearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister as aforesaid, and that in case a vacancy in the ministry of such district shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount then next thereafter payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister making the vacancy or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister succeeding to such district: Provided always, that if it shall appear to us to be expedient at any future time that instead of the annual sum then in course of payment by us to the minister of the said district, or instead of any part of such annual sum, any land, tithe, or other hered tament should be conveyed or secured to such minister and his successors, nothing herein or in any other schome contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing such a substitution.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted, and of the nomination of the minister thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Richard Lawrence Pemberton, his heirs and assigns, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The District of Saint Michael, Hawthorn being:-

"All that part of the parish of Easington, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, which is comprised within so much of the township of Hawthorn as is not included within the limits of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, South Hetton, in the county and diocese aforesaid."

HEREAS by the 333rd section of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, it is enacted that subject to the provisions contained in the fifth part of that Act, it shall be lawful for every pilotage authority, by bye-law made with the consent of Her Majesty in Council, from time to time, to do within its district all or any of the things specified in that behalf in the said section.

And whereas the Pilotage Commissioners of the Port of King's Lynn, being the pilotage authority for the Port of King's Lynn, within the meaning of the said recited Act, have made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty's certain regulations (which are set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed), with respect to pilots and pilotage within the district and under the jurisdiction of the said Pilotage Commissioners;

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty, that the said regulations are proper and reasonable;

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and signify Her consent to the said regulations of the said Pilotage Commissioners, with respect to pilots and pilotage within their district, and under their jurisdiction.

SCHEDULE.

BYE-LAWS FOR THE REGULATION OF PILOTS AND PILOTAGE AT THE PORT OF KING'S LYNN.

Duties of the Headsman.

- 1. The Headsman shall have the whole control of the pilotage in the channel, subject to the Merchant Shipping Acts, the Local Act of Parliament, the bye-laws, and the Board of Commissioners.
- 2. He shall by himself or deputy attend at the Pilot-office at all reasonable hours, and afford every possible facility, to owners and captains as to matters of pilotage.

3. He shall keep proper books and entries of pilot earnings, and distribute the same monthly as

prescribed.

4. He shall keep a register of all ships arriving at and leaving the port, and a journal in which shall be entered all accidents to vessels (however occurring) while in charge of a pilot, and report the same to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next after such accident.

5. He shall report to the Commissioners any case of misconduct or insubordination on the part

of the pilots.

6. He shall regulate the turns of ships applying for pilots and give orders to the masters as to boarding in the channel, and generally as to the several duties of masters and pilots.

7. He shall personally survey the channel at least once in every month, and at such other times

as he may think to be necessary.

8. He shall on the first notice of any vessel or vessels being on shore and in distress within the port (in preference to all other things) send all the assistance in his power, to such vessel or vessels. And all pilots having knowledge of such matters

whilst in the channel, shall do their utmost to relieve such vessel or vessels without first coming up to town for the Headsman's orders for that purpose, but no proceedings shall be taken in the Admiralty Court or otherwise by the pilots for recovery of salvage, without the consent of the Commissioners being first had and obtained.

9. He shall in all cases where it shall appear to him that keels or barges coming up the channel can get into town the same tide, and do not proceed thither, discharge the pilot or pilots from the said keels or barges unless sufficient cause be assigned to him for making the delay.

Duties of Masters.

10. The master of each sloop shall attend at the Pilot-office for instructions from the superintendent, and shall strictly adhere to such instructions while on board the sloops.

11. He shall be responsible for the orderly conduct of the pilots while on board, and for the proper boarding of vessels, and shall see that the requisite signals are hoisted and a proper watch kept, and generally that the bye-laws are enforced, so far as relates to matters in the channel.

12. He shall report any instance of improper conduct, on the part of any of the pilots, to the Headsman.

13. He shall in no case leave the pilot vessel while down the channel.

Duties of Pilots.

14. The pilots shall strictly conform to the instructions of the Headsman while on shore, and to the masters while on board the sloops.

15. They shall severally report any accident occurring to any vessel in their charge to the Headsman immediately on their arrival at Lynn.

- 16. They shall always on arriving at Lynn report immediately to the Headsman what ship they have been on board, and where they have left her.
- 17. The bell affixed on the Pilot-office shall be rung at all times when the Headsman shall think proper a quarter of an hour, for calling the pilots to attend and receive his orders for going down with the sloop, and for other matters. And such pilots as shall neglect or refuse to go to the office at the ringing of the bell, shall be deemed guilty of neglect of duty, and liable to the consequences thereof.

18. They shall take their regular turns in piloting ships or vessels either down or up the channel, as the Headsman or the master or deputed master of the pilot sloops shall direct.

19. They shall attend every day at the Pilotoffice, when not employed in piloting, from the beginning of flood until high-water, and at such other times of the day as are necessary, there to receive the orders and directions of their Headsman.

20. The pilot who shall have the charge of any ship or vessel lying in the roads, or at any place between the roads and the town, either inward or outward bound, shall not leave such ship or vessel and go on shore without first obtaining permission from the master of such ship or vessel.

21. Pilots appointed to pilot ships or vessels down the channel, shall on no account whatever, either at the request, or by permission, of the master of such ships or vessels leave or quit them (by allowing themselves to be put ashore) before their arrival in the roads.

22. When any pilot shall by accident or otherwise lay any ship or vessel aground which he shall have in charge, such pilot shall not of his

own accord, under any pretence whatever, leave the ship or vessel until she shall be affoat and in

23. The pilots shall at all times board ships and vessels bound to Lynn in preference to boarding vessels (being strangers) which may be in the roads bound to any other port, and they shall, if on board any vessel not bound to Lynn, quit such vessel immediately on the arrival in the roads of any vessel wanting a pilot bound to Lynn.

24. They shall not on any account anchor Humber keels or other vessels so as to obstruct the free navigation of ships or vessels going up

and down the channel.

25. Whenever any buoy or beacon shall be lost or out of its place, the pilots shall forthwith acquaint the Headsman with the circumstance, in order that it may be replaced with as little delay as possible.

26. All the pilots, but especially the masters, or deputed masters of the pilot sloops shall observe particularly any alteration which may take place in the channel, and report from time to time such alteration to the Headsman.

27. Each pilot shall be allowed a fortnight's leave of absence in every year, at the discretion of the Headsman as to time, such leave however shall not be granted between the 1st October and 31st May. Any pilot having leave granted, other than as above, shall pay to the Pilot Fund 3s. 6d. per day during his absence.

28. If any pilot, when in charge of any ship, by wilful breach of duty, or by neglect of duty, or by reason of drunkenness, does any act tending to the immediate loss, destruction, or serious damage of such ship, or tending immediately to endanger the life or limb of any person on board such ship, or if any pilot by wilful breach of duty, or by neglect of duty, or by reason of drunkenness refuses or omits to do any lawful act proper and requisite to be done by him, for preserving such ship from loss, destruction, or serious damage, or for preserving any person belonging to or on board of such ship from danger to life or limb, the pilot so offending, shall for each such offence be liable to suspension or dismissal by the Commissioners.

29. Any case of misconduct in regard to any of the pilots will be dealt with by the Board of Commissioners, and where necessary fines, suspension, or dismissal will be adjudged at the discretion of the Board.

The Pilot Sloops.

- 30. The pilot sloops shall be always at the disposal of the Headsman for the purposes of surveying, buoying, conveying pilots, and the general work in the channel, subject to the contract with the owners, and the special orders of the Commissioners.
- 31. One pilot sloop shall be always down the channel, and when at anchor in the roads shall ride by slip moorings, and from sunset to sunrise display a white light at the mast-head.
- 32. She shall be distinguished by the characteristics and signals prescribed by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, that is to say:—
 - (a) A black colour painted or tarred outside, with the exception of such names and numbers as are hereinafter mentioned.
 - (b) On her stern the name of the owner thereof, and the port to which she belongs, painted in white letters, at least one inch broad and three inches long, and on each bow the number of the license of such boat or ship.

(c) When afloat a flag at the mast-head or on a sprit, or staff, or in some other equally conspicuous situation, such flag to be of large dimensions compared with the size of the vessel carrying the same, and to be of two colours, the upper horizontal half white, and the lower horizontal half red.

33. When all the pilots have been boarded, a black ball shall be hoisted (in the day time) at the mast-head in the place of the ordinary signal.

34. The pilot sloops shall at all times when in town lay affoat, if possible, on the west side of the channel.

The Superannuated Fund.

35. The above fund shall be sustained as follows:

 (a) Every pilot shall contribute to it ten shillings monthly from his earnings.

(b) All fines levied upon pilots shall be paid to the account of the fund.

- (c) Ten per cent. shall be deducted from all amounts received from salvages and be paid to the account of the fund.
- 36. Each pilot, when superannuated, shall receive twenty pounds per annum from the Superannuated Fund.
- 37. The above amount of receipts and payments, in respect of the Superannuated Fund, may hereafter be varied according to circumstances by the Commissioners.
- 38. No pilot hereafter licensed shall be eligible to the Superannuated Fund until he shall have served at least twenty-five years as a working pilot.

General Regulations.

39. No person shall be accepted as a pilot, whether as an apprentice or otherwise, whose age

shall exceed thirty years.

40. The Headsman shall not excuse any pilot from the exercise of his duty, on account of, or under any pretence of illness, unless such illness shall be certified in writing under the hand of some known physician, surgeon, or apothecary.

41. Any pilot being excused as above shall produce a similar certificate monthly, and, at the end of three months from the date of the first certificate he shall, if still unable to discharge his ordinary duty, be put upon half-pay, and at the end of six months he shall, if eligible, be put on Superannuated allowance.

42. If the pilot be not eligible to the Superannuated allowance he shall remain on half-pay for twelve months, after which his pay shall cease, and if he shall be unable to resume his duties within two years after the date of his first certificate his name shall then be erased, and he shall cease to be a pilot of the port.

43. Not more than one pilot shall be put on board any foreign or other ship or vessel, unless such ship or vessel shall have a signal of distress

flying.

44. All masters of ships and vessels wanting pilots shall apply to the Headsman at the Pilot office, and there pay what shall be due for their pilotage both inward and outward, and for tideswork previous to a pilot being appointed to such ship or vessel.

45. Every master of a ship or vessel wanting a pilot shall produce to the Headsman the meter's or other officers certificate of clearance or discharge of the ship or vessel for which he applys for a pilot, and unless such certificate be produced to the Headsman, or he is otherwise satisfied that the ship or vessel has discharged her cargo he is not to appoint a pilot to such ship or vessel.

46. The pilots shall (unless impracticable) board inward bound vessels at the Bell Buoy. The first ship or vessel arriving at the Bell Buoy (such buoy bearing north-west) shall be entitled to the first pilot and every ship or vessel so arriving, and which cannot from her large burden proceed up the channel immediately, shall be boarded in her turn, and the pilot shall remain on board till the vessel can proceed to town.

47. All vessels bound to Lynn shall be free from the payment of pilotage in the event of such vessels not being able to obtain the services of a pilot, and in every case of inward or outward navigation, where a pilot has refused to go on board a vessel in any part of the channel, the

pilotage shall be remitted.

48. The shipowners of this port are requested to give strict charge to their several masters of ships or vessels to make a true report to the pilots, when boarded, of the time of their arrival at the Bell Buoy, such buoy bearing north-west, in order that the proper turns of their several vessels may be attended to.

49. When any ships or vessels are coming up the channel into town, and there are others in the harbour outward bound, wanting pilots, the first ship or vessel in turn shall claim the first pilot coming into town, and so on in turn, as pilots may afterwards come in with ships and vessels.

50. Every ship or vessel shall be piloted so far

down as the Bell Buoy.

51. All letters required to be delivered on board ships in the Roads shall be sent to the Pilot-office, and the Headsman shall provide a proper bag for the same, which shall be kept under lock and key. The Headsman shall be answerable for the custody of the said bag and for such steps being taken as shall secure the correct delivery of all letters placed in his charge. A register shall be kept at the Pilot-office of all letters received by the Headsman, the date of such receipts, and the date and mode of delivery. In case of the non-delivery of any such letters, within a reasonable time, the cause shall be stated in the register, and the Headsman shall not communicate to any person (other than the pilots) the address of any letter received by him.

52. A proper map of the channel showing all the buoys with a reference describing the size of each buoy shall be prepared, and a copy thereof kept at the Pilot-office, and also at the Town Hall, for the service of the Corporation and Commissioners.

53. Every pilot shall be furnished with a copy of the bye-laws, and a copy shall always be kept on board each sloop and at the Pilot-office, and shall be given on application to the shipowners.

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parishes,

without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials shall be discontinued therein:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the seventh day of January last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-second day of February last, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burialground shall be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued (except as is herein otherwise directed), as

follows; viz.:

Croydon.—Forthwith in the churchyard of the Ecclesiastical District of All Saints, Upper Norwood, except so far as compatible with the following conditions, viz.:-That with the exception of now existing family vaults and graves, the interments be restricted to the bodies of the parishioners of the Ecclesiastical District of All Saints, Upper Norwood, and of persons dying in that district; that the burials be conducted in accordance with Nos. 3, 4, 5, 6, and 8, of the official regulations for new burial-grounds; that in family earthen graves a layer of earth, not less than one foot thick, be left undisturbed above the previously buried coffin, and that, with the exception of family vaults and graves, no grave be re-opened.

ESCOMBE, BISHOP AUCKLAND. - In the old churchyard, except for widowers or widows

of those already buried therein.

HENSINGHAM, ST. BEES. - Forthwith in the church of St. John, and on and after the first of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, in the churchyard, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal, and separately enclosed by masonry or brickwork properly cemented.

CHADKIRK, STOCKPORT. - Forthwith in the

church and churchyard.

SWANSCOMBE, DARTFORD.—Forthwith in the parish church, and from and after the first of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, in the churchyard, with the exception of now existing family vaults and brick-graves, and also with the exception of now existing family earthen-graves, which can be opened without disturbing human remains, and in which no coffin shall be buried without a covering of four feet of earth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the churchwardens or such other persons as may have the care of the undermentioned place of burial do adopt, or cause to be adopted, the following measures, viz.:

That all those parts of the Whitfield burialground, in Tottenham-court-road, Middlesex, in which the earth has been excavated should be covered with a layer of earth of the thickness of eighteen inches; that on the whole of the surface of that burial-ground, not occupied by walks, flagstones, or monuments, a growing vegetation should be maintained; that no soil which has been buried in should be disturbed; and that the above works should be executed under the superintendence of the Medical Officer of Health of the parish of Saint Pancras.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Hamburgh:—

Hamburgh, March 1, 1864.

THE following additional information respecting the lights on the east coast of Sleswig and Holstein has reached me this morning from a reliable quarter in Kiel.

MY LORD,

The light at Bülck, the principal night-signal for navigation on the headland at the north-east entrance of the bay, still burns regularly. The light on the sandbank, close to Friedrichsort, has ceased, on account of the beacon in which it was fixed having been destroyed by ice.

The light in the fortress of Friederichsort, which usually burned when the beacon-fire could not be lighted, is not now burning, but this is not considered of much importance to the navigation. The light inside the harbour of Kiel, near the baths, is, I understand, not usually lighted in the winter season.

In Holstein there is only one other light-house on the east coast, namely, St. Mary's Light, on the Island of Fehmarn, which continues to burn.

On the east coast of Sleswig the principal lighthouse is at Kekeniskoi, in the Island of Alsen, and is still in possession of the Danes.

It thus appears that the only light which has ceased to burn since the Prussians have occupied Sleswig, is that at Friedrichsort.

The blockade of the east coast, although officially published at Copenhagen, has not yet been notified to the Foreign Consuls resident at Kiel.
