THE Right Honourable the Lords of the
Committee of Privy Council for Trade have re-
ceived from the Secretary of State for Foreign
Affairs the following copy of a despatch from Her
Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Hamburgh:—

*Hamburgh,
March 1, 1864.*

MY LORD,

THE following additional information respect-
ing the lights on the east coast of Sleswig and
Holstein has reached me this morning from a
reliable quarter in Kiel.

The light at Bülck, the principal night-signal
for navigation on the headland at the north-east
entrance of the bay, still burns regularly. The
light on the sandbank, close to Friedrichsort, has
ceased, on account of the beacon in which it was
fixed having been destroyed by ice.

The light in the fortress of Friederichsort, which
usually burned when the beacon-fire could not be
lighted, is not now burning, but this is not con-
sidered of much importance to the navigation.
The light inside the harbour of Kiel, near the
baths, is, I understand, not usually lighted in the
winter season.

In Holstein there is only one other light-house
on the east coast, namely, St. Mary's Light, on the
Island of Fehmarn, which continues to burn.

On the east coast of Sleswig the principal light-
house is at Kekeniskoi, in the Island of Alsen,
and is still in possession of the Danes.

It thus appears that the only light which has
ceased to burn—since the Prussians have occupied
Sleswig, is that at Friedrichsort.

The blockade of the east coast, although officially
published at Copenhagen, has not yet been notified
to the Foreign Consuls resident at Kiel.
