CEREMONIAL observed at the BAPTISM of HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCE ALBERT VICTOR CHRISTIAN EDWARD, Grandson of HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN and of HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE CONSORT, Son of THEIR ROYAL HIGHNESSES ALBERT EDWARD, PRINCE OF WALES, and THE PRINCESS OF WALES, on Thursday, the 10th day of March, 1864, at One o'clock, in the Chapel within Buckingham Palace.

**T**HE Foreign Ministers, Cabinet Ministers, and others invited to the Solemnity, assembled in the Lower Dining Room at Buckingham Palace, at half past Twelve o'clock, and soon after their arrival were conducted to Seats provided for them in the Chapel.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, The Bishop of London (Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal), The Bishop of Oxford (Lord High Almoner), The Bishop of Chester (Clerk of the Closet), with The Reverend Henry Howarth, Rector of St. George's, Hanover-square, The Honourable and Very Reverend Gerald Wellesley (Dean of Windsor, and Resident Chaplain to Her Majesty), and The Very Reverend Dr. Arthur P. Stanley, Dean of Westminster (Chaplain to His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales), assembled in the Ladies' Breakfast Room, and took their places in the Chapel shortly before the Procession moved.

When the Visitors were seated, The Queen, attended by the Mistress of the Robes, The Duchess of Wellington, by the Lady in Waiting, The Lady Churchill, by the Honourable Mrs. Robert Bruce, Bedchamber Woman, and by the Lord and Groom in Waiting, The Lord De Tabley, and Lieutenant-General Sir Henry Bentinck, K.C.B., having previously been conducted from Her Majesty's Apartments to the Chapel, through the State Dining Room, by the Lord Chamberlain, took Her place in the seat prepared for Her Majesty as one of the Sponsors.

The Queen was accompanied and led by His Majesty The King of the Belgians, attended by The Count de Moerkerke, and Lieutenant-General the Honourable Sir Edward Cust, K.C.H., and by Her Royal Highness The Princess Helena, attended by the Lady Augusta Stanley.

The King of the Belgians and Her Royal Highness The Princess Helena, representing Her Royal Highness The Crown Princess of Prussia, also took their seats as Sponsors.

Count Fürstenstein, Chamberlain to Her Royal Highness The Crown Princess of Prussia, and specially despatched by Her Royal Highness to attend the Christening, followed Her Royal Highness The Princess Helena.

During the entrance of the several Processions the March from Handel's Oratorio of "Scipio" was performed by the Organ and Her Majesty's Band.

The Royal Personages having been conducted to their seats, and the Great Officers and other attendants having taken their appointed places on either side of the Chapel, the Service commenced with a Chorale composed by His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, followed by an Hymn by Palestrina.

When the Music ceased, The Lord Chamberlain, accompanied by The Groom of the Stole to His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, and The Chamberlain to Her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales, conducted The Infant Prince into the Chapel, His Royal Highness being carried by the Head Nurse, and attended by The Countess of Macclesfield, one of the Ladies of the Bedchamber to Her Royal Highness The Princess of Wales.

When the Archbishop of Canterbury commenced the Prayer "Almighty ever-living God," The Countess of Macclesfield placed The Infant Prince in the arms of The Queen, who handed His Royal Highness to The Archbishop, and received The Prince from His Grace when His Royal Highness had been baptised.

His Royal Highness received the Name of Albert Victor Christian Edward.

The Countess of Macclesfield then received The Prince, who, after the Service, was reconducted from the Chapel in the same way.

The Ceremonial concluded with Haydn's Chorus "The Heavens are telling" from "The Creation."

As soon as the Ceremony was concluded, The Queen, accompanied and attended as on entering the Chapel, was conducted by the Lord Chamberlain to Her Majesty's Apartments.

When the Queen had retired, The Sponsors were reconducted to the State Apartments in the same order as on entering the Chapel.

The Royal Personages, with their attendants, and all others forming The Royal Procession, then retired from the Chapel, and proceeded to the State Apartments, followed by the Foreign Ministers, the Cabinet Ministers, and all others invited to the Ceremony.

Whilst the Processions returned, Spohr's March from "The Fall of Babylon" was performed.

The Queen afterwards received The Royal Family and Her Majesty's Royal Guests in the White Drawing Room.

At two o'clock Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales with The Royal Personages and all others invited to the Baptismal Ceremony, proceeded to The Supper Room, and partook of a Collation after which The Lord Steward gave the following Toasts :—

The Yeomen of the Guard were stationed in the Grand Hall of the Palace, in the Passages leading from the Lower Dining Room to the Approach to the Chapel, and upon the Grand Staircase.

The Knights of the several Orders wore their respective Collars.

The Dress worn was Full Dress with Trowsers.

A Guard of Honour mounted in front of the Palace.

An Escort of the Second Regiment of Life Guards accompanied Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales with the Infant Prince from Marlborough House to Buckingham Palace.
