NOTIFICATION OF BLOCKADE.

T is hereby notified that Earl Russell, Hcr Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Her Majesty's Consul at Santo Domingo, a Proclamation (dated 5th October, 1863), issued by the Governor Captain-General of the Spanish part of the island of Santo Domingo, notifying that various provinces of the territory of the Spanish part of this island of Santo Domingo, having declared themselves in rebellion against Her Catholic Majesty, Queen Isabella the Second, and against the mother country, &c., all the coasts of that island and its littoral waters are declared under blockade by the Naval Forces of Her Majesty (Queen Isabella the Second).

The following is a copy (and translation) of the Proclamation referred to.

BANDO.

Don Felipe Ribero y Lemoyne, Gobernador Capitan General de la parte Española de la Isla de Santo Domingo y General en Gefe del Ejército de la misma.

HABIENDOSE declarado en rebeldía contra S. M. Católica la Reina Doña Isabel II y la Madre Patria, varias provincias del territorio de la parte Española de esta Isla de Santo Domingo, y en el deber de adoptar las providencias correspondientes, para impedir que los revolucionarios reciban ausilios por las costas, usando de las facultades que por ordenanza me competen como Capitan General y General en Gefe de este Ejército.

Ordeno y Mando:

Art. 1°. Quedan declaradas en bloqueo por las fuerzas navales de S. M. todas las costas de la Isla y sus aguas litorales, y en consecuencia todo buque podrá ser requerido por sus papeles y documentos y examinado escrupulosamente. Los que viniesen cargados de gente, sea cualquiera su procedencia y destino, son desde luego sospechosos; pero si sus papeles y registro no lo confirman, serán únicamente obligados á alejarse : en el caso contrario, en el de faltas marcadas de documentos, en el de traer cargamentos de armas y municiones ó efectos que de alguna manera puedan contribuir á fomentar la rebelion, serán considerados como enemigos y tratados como tales con arreglo á las ordenanzas de la Real Armada.

Art. 2°. Este bando se publicará y circulará son libres los de Santo Domingo, Samaná y inmediatamente en la forma de costumbre para su puntual cumplimiento.

PROCLAMATION.

Don Felipe Ribero y Lemoyne, Governor Captain-General of the Spanish part of the Island of Santo Domingo, General-in-Chief, &c.

VARIOUS provinces of the territory of the Spanish part of this island of Santo Domingo, having declared themselves in rebellion against Her Catholic Majesty, Queen Isabella the Second, and against the mother country, and in the necessity of adopting the corresponding measures to prevent the Revolutionists from receiving assistance by the coasts, using the powers which by ordinance belong to me as Captain-General and General-in-Chief of this army,

I Order and Command :

ART. I. All the coasts of the island and its littoral waters are declared under blockade by the naval forces of Her Majesty, and, in consequence, every vessel may be required to show their papers and documents, and be scrupulously examined. Those that come laden with people, whatever may be their destination or the place whence they come, are at once suspicious; but if their papers and manifest do not confirm the suspicion, they shall only be obliged to go away; in the opposite case, when there are marked flaws in the papers, in the case of bringing cargoes of arms and ammunition, or effects, which may in any manner contribute to foment the rebellion, they shall be considered as enemies, and treated as such, according to the Ordinances of the Royal Navy.

ART. II. This proclamation shall be published and circulated in the usual manner for its due fulfilment.

Ordeno y Mando. Art. 1°. El bloqueo de las costas de la parte Española de la Isla de Santo Domingo solo comprende los puertos, fradas y ensenadas que no ocupen las tropas del Ejército, y de consiguiente

Puerto Plata, asi como los demas que irá ocu-pando en adelante el Ejército y las legitimas autoridades españolas. En su consecuencia los Cónsules españoles podrán espedir el correspondiente despacho á los buques que se dirijan con cargamentos lícitos á los puntos mencionados.

Art. 2°. Este bando se publicará y circulará en la forma debida para su puntual y exacto cumplimiento.

PROCLAMATON.

Don Carlos de Vargas y Cerveto, Governor Uaptain General of the Spanish part of the Island of Santo Domingo and General-in-Chief of the Army,

Some doubts have arisen respecting the exe-cution and understanding of the Proclamation of my predecessor, dated the 5th of October last, and, with the view of avoiding every indecision and uncertainty, using the powers which belong to me as Captain General and General-in-Chief of the Army,

F order and command :

ART. I.—The Blockade of the coasts of the Spanish part of the Island of Santo Domingo only extends to the ports, roads, and creeks which are not occupied by the troops of the army, and in consequence the ports of Santo Domingo, Samana, and Porto Plata are free, as well as those other places which the army and the legitimate Spanish authorities shall hereafter occupy. In consequence whereof Spanish Consuls may grant the necessary clearances to those vessels which may proceed to the said places with lawful cargoes.

ART. II.—This Proclamation shall be published and circulated in due form for its punctual and exact execution.

That Her Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of Madrid having, in consequence of directions from Earl Russell, communicated with the Spanish Government on the subject of the above-mentioned notifications, received from Señor Arrazola the Spanish President of the Council of Ministers and Minister for Foreign Affairs, a letter from which the following extract is made :--

(Extract.)

Translation.) Palace, January 27th, 1864. "Sir,-In addition to what I had the honour to state to you in my note of the 23rd instant, I hasten to inform you that, according to informa tion received in this Department from the Minister of the Marine, the most positive orders have lately been given to the Commandant-General of the Havannah Station, and to the Chief of Her Majesty's Naval Forces at Santo Domingo, to cause the blockade of the ports of that island occupied by the rebels, to be of the most effective nature.

"With reference to the Department of the Marine, I can assure you that the Blockade in question is maintained at the present moment by twenty-three vessels of war, frigates, and schooners, a number which, besides being sufficient for the purpose, could be increased by the squadron anchored at Cuba. "On the other hand, the insurrection is now

"On the other hand, the insurrection is now limited to the province of Seybo, the coasts of which are so strictly watched that all vessels endeavouring to aid the rebels have been captured."
