Board of Trade, Whitehall, May 9, 1864.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the Moniteur Belge, of the 15th ultimo, containing a Belgian Law, relating to the importation into Belgian Ports of Foreign ships, &c., of the provisions of which the following is a translation:

- 1. Ships and boats are declared free of duty on importation.
- 2. The import duties charged on wood, which shall be proved to have been employed for the construction of ships or boats, will be remitted.

The mode of the remission will be determined by the Government.

- 3. The purchase deeds of vessels for which value has been paid, will be registered at a charge of 2 francs 20 centimes.
- 4. The abolition, &c., of duties accorded by Articles 1 and 3 are applicable to the importation and purchase of vessels nationalized since the 1st March last.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Helsingfors, reporting that from the 1st instant, the duty on arrack, rum, cognac and French brandy, imported into the Grand Duchy of Finland in casks and not holding above 11 degrees strength, will be increased to 4 (four) rubles, or about twelve shillings per lispound (20lbs.) gross weight, which duty will be further increased with 35 (thirty-five) copeks or about thirteen pence per lispound for every degree above that of eleven, and when the article is imported in bottle the duty will be 75 copeks, or about two shillings and three pence per bottle, irrespective of strength.
