**NOTIFICATION OF BLOCKADE.**

IT is hereby notified, that Earl Russell, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received despatches from Her Majesty's Minister at Copenhagen, and Her Majesty's Consul at Stettin, enclosing the following official notification of the Blockade of the German Ports of the Baltic :—

“The Ministry of Marine notifies herewith that the Blockade of the Prussian Ports of Colberg, Cammin, Swinemünde, Wolgast, Greifswalde, Stralsund, and Barth, is effectuated the 27th instant, and that the Blockade of the Ports of Holstein and Slesvig, mentioned in the notification of the 25th instant, is likewise effectuated the 26th instant.

With respect to neutral vessels in the above-mentioned ports, it is officially notified that they may complete the lading of their cargoes and leave these ports without being interrupted up to the 16th of July, but that on the 17th of July and afterwards, all neutral vessels leaving these ports will be liable to seizure by the Danish blockading force.

With respect to the harbour of Pillau, Earl Russell has received a despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Königsberg, containing the following notification from the Captain of His Danish Majesty's frigate “Jylland,” certified by the Danish Consul at Pillau :—

Le soussigné a l'honneur de faire part à MM. les consuls résidant à Pillau que le blocus du dit port a été rétabli par les forces sous mes ordres. Les bâtiments neutres, se trouvant aujourd'hui dans le port, pourront compléter leur chargement et quitter Pillau sans obstacle jusqu'au 16 Juillet. Après cette époque, c'est-à-dire à partir du 17 du mois prochain, tout bâtiment neutre, sortant du port de Pillau, sera saisi par les bâtiments sous mes ordres.

THE Undersigned has the honour to inform the Consuls residing at Pillau, that the Blockade of the said port has been re-established by the forces under his orders. The neutral ships which are now in the port will be allowed until the 16th of July, to complete their freight and to leave Pillau. After that period, that is to say from the 17th of next month, every neutral vessel leaving the port of Pillau will be seized by the ships under my orders.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Note from the Russian Ambassador at this Court, enclosing a copy of a Decree of the Imperial Government to the following effect:

1. All merchant vessels masted, and foreign-going as well as those without masts and coasters, entering the port of Cronstadt, shall pay a special duty, to go to the municipal revenues of that town, for cleaning and the removal of their impurities.

This duty will be levied as follows:-

For vessels masted and foreign-going, 50 copecks per mast.

For vessels without masts and coasters, 10 copecks the vessel.

2. The arrangements for the cleaning of the vessels, as well as for the collection of the duties to which they are subject, are made according to the General Order in force, by the Municipal authorities of Cronstadt, either by lease in public auction or by trust (en regie), as may be judged convenient.
