THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross on the undermentioned Seaman of the Royal Navy, whose claim to the same has been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for his gallant conduct in New Zealand, as recorded against his name; viz.:

Date of Act of Bravery, April 29th, 1864. For his gallant conduct at the attack at Te Papa, Tauranga, on the 29th of April last, in entering the Pah with Commander Hay, and when that Officer was mortally wounded, bringing him out, although ordered by Commander Hay to leave him, and seek his own safety. This man was at the time 'Captain of the Fore-top' of the "Harrier," doing duty as Captain's Coxswain; and Commodore Sir William Wiseman brings his name to special notice for this act of gallantry.

An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain Stamp Duties; and to amend the laws relating to the Inland Revenue.

An Act to amend the law relating the valuation of rateable property in Ireland.

An Act to amend the Penal Servitude Acts. An Act to vest the site of the India Office in Her Majesty for the service of the Government of India.

An Act to make provision for uniformity of process in summary criminal prosecutions and prosecutions for penalties in the inferior Courts of Scotland.

An Act for the Union of the Diocesan Courts and Registries in Ireland: for the regulation of the mode of procedure therein, and also in the provincial Courts of Armagh and Dublin; and for appeals therefrom.
