The Queen has been pleased to grant unto James Robert Alexander Haldane, of Westbourne-terrace, in the district of Trinity, in the parish of Paddington, in the county of Middlesex, and of Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, Bachelor of Laws, Her Royal licence and authority, that from and immediately after the solemnization of his marriage with Anna Elizabeth Frances Margaretta Chinnery, only child and heir-expectant of Sir Nicholas Chinnery, of Flintfield, in the county of Cork, and of Hyde Park-square, in the said county of Middlesex, Clerk and Baronet, he may take and use the surname of Chinnery, in addition to and after that of Haldane:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise to be void and of none effect.

10th Regiment of Foot, Ensign Arthur William King to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice George Henry Stace, who retires. Dated 23rd August, 1864.

Ensign Edwin Redding, from the 31st Foot, to be Ensign, vice Osborne, who exchanges. Dated 23rd August, 1864.

Eustace Beaumont Burnaby, Gent., to be Ensign by purchase, vice King. Dated 23rd August, 1864.

14th Foot, Gentleman Cadet Gerald James Paterson, from the Royal Military College, to be Ensign, without purchase, vice Lingwood, transferred to the 16th Foot. Dated 23rd August, 1864.

15th Foot, Lieutenant John Hely, from the 87th Foot, to be Lieutenant, vice Moore, who exchanges. Dated 23rd August, 1864.

Ensign Henry Evan Pateshall Thomas to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice Samuel Adams, who retires. Dated 23rd August, 1864.
