THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General at Bucharest, enclosing the following translation of a Decree imposing Customs Duties on Articles exported from the United Principalities of Moldavia and Wallachia.

ALEXANDER JOHN I.

By the Grace of God and the National Will, Prince of the United Rouman Principalities:

To all present or to come, salutations on the Report of our Minister Secretary of State of the Department of Finance, No. 27,216, with reference to the re-establishment of a duty on exportation;

Seeing the journal of the Council of Ministers of the present month of August;

Having heard the opinion of our Council of State;

In virtue of the Statute of the $\frac{2}{14}$ July;

We have sanctioned and sanction, promulgated and promulgate, as follows :----

ART. I.—The duty on Exportation, suspended by the Law of the 1st of April, 1862, until the voting of the Budget, is provisionally re-established, commencing from October 1st of the present year, 1864.

AET. II.—Cereals, cattle, tallow, hides, wool, and, moreover, all natural produce and raw materials (unmanufactured), the produce of the United Rouman Principalities, are subject to the payment of a duty on exportation.

ART. III.—The duty on exportation is fixed at five per cent. on the average value, established for each article; the average price will be settled for each year, according to the official prices current.

After that verification a special Tariff shall be drawn up for the collection of the duty, and published in conformity for each year.

ART. IV.—Are excepted from the payment of export duty;

(A) Manufactures and foreign articles subjected to payment on importation.

(B) Manufactures and articles of home make and manufacture. (C) Salt and coal of local produce.

(D) Wool, cheese, milk, curds, butter, and everything belonging to the migratory Austrian shepherds, the production of their flocks during their passage through the United Rouman Principalities, in conformity with the special law. Those productions are to be calculated according to the number and nature of the animals belonging to each.

(E) Articles for the necessary provisioning of passengers.

(F) Articles necessary for lighting, for the food of the crew, and the use of vessels afloat with cargo, anchored in the ports of the United Rouman Principalities. Sea-going vessels are excepted from paying the export duty on the articles necessary for lighting, provisioning, and the use of the vessel on their departure from the ports of the United Rouman Principalities.

(G) Articles of daily necessity bought by the inhabitants of the neighbouring States, at the markets, when at the different Customs' stations.

(H) Papers in whatever language printed in the United Rouman Principalities.

ART. V.—Forms for collecting the duties on exportation, and for controlling the exportation of produce, will be established by a special regulation.

AET. VI.—All dispositions contrary to the present law are abrogated. We make known and ordain that the present, bearing the Seal of the State, and published in the official "Moniteur," be addressed to all courts, tribunals, and administrative authorities, to be inscribed on the registers, that they may be observed and made to be observed, and our Minister, Secretary of State for the Department of Justice, Worship, and Public Instruction, is ordered to see to their publication.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Acting Consul-General in Columbia, enclosing a translation of a Decree adding 15 per cent. to the import duties of the 4th class of the tariff annexed to the Customs' code of Columbia, which was published in the London Gazette of the 23rd September last.

WHEREAS it appears to me, the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the use of Locomotives, unless restricted as hereinafter mentioned, on or along the Turnpike Roads and Highways in the Isle of Ely, is dangerous and inconvenient to the public;

I do hereby, by virtue of the provisions of "The Locomotive Act, 1861," by this Order, under my hand, prohibit the use of any kind of Locomotive whatever, propelled by steam, or any other than animal power, on the above roads, except between the hours of twelve o'clock at night and six o'clock in the morning.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of Postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage, or inland postage, payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant, and from time to time by Warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof, and from time to time, by Warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the rates which might be payable were to be paid, and the power thereby given, to alter and fix rates of postage,

was to extend to any increase, or reduction, or remission of postage.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury by another Act of Parliament, passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office."

And whereas it is expedient to alter the rates or postage now payable on certain letters transmitted by the post between the United Kingdom and the Netherlands.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the power or authority in us for such purpose vested in and by the said recited Acts of Parliament, or either of them, and of all other powers and authorities, enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant (under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. On every letter not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post from any part of the United Kingdom addressed to any part of the Netherlands, or from any part of the Netherlands addressed to any part of the United Kingdom, and conveyed viå Belgium direct by packet boat, and on every letter, not exceeding one half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post between any foreign country through the Netherlands, and any part of the United Kingdom, and conveyed between the United Kingdom, and conveyed between the United Kingdom and the Netherlands, viå Belgium direct by packet boat, there shall be charged and taken, for the conveyance of such respective letters to or from the United Kingdom, and through the Netherlands, an uniform rate of postage of threepence.

2. On every letter not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post from, or addressed to, any part of the Netherlands, and conveyed between the Netherlands and any of Her Majesty's colonies, or any foreign country, through the United Kingdom, and on every letter not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post between any foreign country, through the Netherlands, and any of Her Majesty's colonies, or any foreign country, through the United Kingdom, the said respective letters being conveyed between the United Kingdom and the Netherlands, viâ Belgium direct, by packet boat, there shall be charged and taken a like uniform rate of postage of threepence for the conveyance of every such letter from, or to, or through the Netherlands and any part of the United Kingdom ; and for the conveyance of every such respective letter between the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet boat or vessel, not being a packet boat conveying the same, and the colony or foreign country to or from which the same shall be forwarded, such a further or additional rate of postage as shall from time to time be chargeable and payable for British postage on letters not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight posted or delivered at the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet boat or vessel not being a packet boat conveying the same, and transmitted direct between such port and any such colony or foreign country : provided that in all cases where such additional rate includes both inland and sea services there shall be deducted therefrom the sum of one penny in respect of the inland conveyance, under this clause, of every such letter sent through the United Kingdom.

3. All such respective letters, so transmitted, as is mentioned in this Warrant, if exceeding one half of an ounce in weight, shall be subject to the several further and additional and progressive rates of postage hereinafter mentioned; that is to say :--

- On every such letter, if exceeding one half of an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid two rates of postage;
- And on every such letter, if exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding one ounce and one half of another ounce in weight, three rates of postage;
- And on every such letter, if exceeding one ounce and one-half of another ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage;
- And for every additional half of an ounce in weight of any such letter above the weight of two ounces, there shall be charged, taken, and paid one additional rate of postage, and every fractional part of such additional half of an ounce in weight shall be charged as an additional half of an ounce in weight, and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant, if not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight.

4. On every letter posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Netherlands, or posted in the Netherlands addressed to the United Kingdom, the postage thereof shall be paid at the time of the same being posted, either in money, or by being duly stamped with the proper postage stamp or stamps affixed thereto, which stamp or stamps shall in every case be affixed or appear on the outside of every such letter, near the address or direction, and shall be of the value or amount of the postage duty payable thereon under or by virtue of this Warrant.

5. If any letter shall be posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Netherlands, or be posted in the Netherlands addressed to the United Kingdom, without any postage having been paid thereon, either in money or postage stamps, every such letter shall be charged with the postage to which it would have been liable under or by virtue of this Warrant if the postage had been fully paid thereon when posted, together with a further and additional rate of postage of threepence.

6. If any letter shall be posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Netherlands, or be posted in the Netherlands addressed to the United Kingdom, having thereon or affixed thereto a postage stamp or stamps the value of which shall be less in amount than the rate of postage to which the same would be liable under or by virtue of the provisions of this Warrant, every such letter shall be charged with the amount of the difference between the postage paid thereon and the postage to which it would have been liable under or by virtue of this Warrant, if the full amount of postage payable thereon had been paid when posted, together with the further and additional rate of postage of three pence.

7. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to extend to any letters passing by the post between the United Kingdom and the Netherlands, viâ France, which are to be charged with the same rates of postage as if this Warrant had not been signed, nor shall anything herein contained be deemed or construed to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions and privileges

granted by the said recited Acts, or by any other Acts of Parliament relating to the Post Office, or by any Treasury Warrant issued under any of such Acts.

8. In all cases in which any letter in respect of which any rate of postage is chargeable under or by virtue of the provisions of this Warrant shall be liable to any foreign postage, such foreign postage shall be charged and paid thereon, in addition to the British postage.

9. The term "weight" used in this Warrant shall mean British weight, and the several other terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

10. So much of a certain Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date the 9th day of December, 1853, as relates to the transmission by the post of any letters vià Belgium direct by packet boat, is hereby repealed, revoked, and annulled.

11. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands duly made, at any time hereafter alter, repeal, or revoke any of the rates of postage hereby fixed or altered, or any of the orders, regulations, conditions, and restrictions hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates, orders, regulations, 'conditions, or restrictions in lieu thereof, and from time to time may appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

12. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 96, for the regulation of the duties of postage, certain scales of weight and rates of postage were fixed and made chargeable and payable upon, for, or in respect of letters, newspapers, Parliamentary proceedings, and printed papers, transmitted and forwarded by the post, and various regulations were made for facilitating the transmission of such letters and papers by the post. And by the same Act powers were given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury from time to time by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of postage therein mentioned.

And whereas further powers were given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury by another Act of Parliament passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 85, for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office.

And whereas it is expedient to authorize the transmission by the post between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Liberia of certain packets, and for that purpose to make certain regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the Duties of Postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury from time to time; by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage, or inland postage, payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters, or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant, and from time to time, by Warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof, and from time to time, by Warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

1. On every letter posted in any part of the United Kingdom, addressed to any commissioned officer, whether in the Navy or the Royal Marines, or any warrant officer, midshipman, second master, or master's assistant, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any foreign or colonial station, the postage thereof shall be paid at the time of the same being posted, either in money, or by being duly stamped with the proper postage stamp or stamps being affixed thereto, which stamp or stamps shall in every case be affixed, or appear on the outside of every such letter, near the address, and shall be of the value or amount of the postage duty payable thereon.

2. On every letter addressed to any part of the United Kingdom, and sent from any commissioned officer (whether in the Navy or the Royal Marines) or any warrant officer, midshipman, second master, or master's assistant, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any colonial station, the postage thereof shall be paid at the time of the same being posted by means of the proper postage stamp or stamps being affixed thereto, which stamp or stamps being affixed thereto, which stamp or stamps being of the or appear on the outside of every such letter near the address, and shall be of the value or amount of the postage duty payable thereon.

3. If any letter shall be posted in any part of the United Kingdom, addressed to any commissioned officer (whether in the Navy or the Royal Marines), or any warrant officer, midsbipman, second master, or master's assistant, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels, on any station at any colony to which ordinary unpaid letters may be forwarded without any postage having been paid thereon, either in money or in postage stamps, every such letter shall be forwarded, charged with the amount of postage to which it would have been liable if the postage had been paid when posted, together with a further and additional rate of postage of sixpence.

4. If any letter shall be posted in any part of the United Kingdom, addressed to any commissioned officer (whether in the Navy or the Royal Marines), or any warrant officer, midshipman, second master, or master's assistant, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels, on any station at any colony to which ordinary unpaid letters may be forwarded and the postage paid thereon, or postage stamp or stamps affixed thereto, shall represent a less amount than the rate of postage to which such letter would be liable under and by virtue of the regulations in force relating thereto, every such last-mentioned letter shall be forwarded, charged with the amount of the difference between the postage so paid thereon, or postage stamp or stamps so being thereon, or affixed thereto, and the postage to which such letter would be liable as aforesaid, together with a further and additional rate of

If any letter addressed to any part of the United Kingdom, and sent from any commissioned officer (whether in the Navy or the Royal Marines), or any warrant officer, midshipman, second master, or master's assistant, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels, on any colonial station, shall be posted without any postage having been paid thereon, by means of the proper postage stamp or stamps being affixed thereto, every such letter shall be forwarded, charged with the amount of postage to which it would have been liable if the postage had been paid when posted, together with a further and additional rate of postage of sixpence.

6. If any letter addressed to any part of the United Kingdom, and sent from any commissioned officer (whether in the Navy or the Royal Marines), or any warrant officer, midshipman, second master, or master's assistant, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels, on any colonial station, shall be posted and the postage stamp or stamps affixed thereto shall represent a less amount than the rate of postage to which such letter would be liable under and by virtue of the regulations in force relating thereto, every such last-mentioned letter shall be forwarded, charged with the amount of the difference between the value of the postage stamp or stamps so being thereon, or affixed thereto, and the postage to which such letter would be liable as aforesaid, together with a further and additional rate of postage of sixpence.

7. The several terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

8. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands duly made, at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, or revoke any of the orders, directions, or regulations hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other orders, directions, or regulations in lieu thereof.
