NOTIFICATION OF BLOCKADE.

IT is hereby notified that Earl Russell, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Her Majesty's Acting Chargé d'Affaires at Caracas a Despatch, enclosing a copy of a Decree, dated the 13th of September, 1864, issued by the Head of the Venezuelan Government, declaring, that an insurrection having occurred in the State of Guayana the part of the coast extending from the mouth of Vagres to that of Navios, all the canals formed by the Delta of the Orinoco, and the margins of that river, including Ciudad Bolivar, are closed, and the ports, coasts, and villages of the same are blockaded by the Venezuelan Government.

The following is a copy of the Decree (and a translation thereof) above referred to :—

JOSE DESIDERIO TRIAS,

Encargado del Poder Ejecutivo Nacional.

Habiendo ocurrido en el Estado de Guayana una sublevacion á mano armada contra las instituciones políticas que se ha dado la Nacion, y debiendo el Poder Ejecutivo hacer uso de la fuerza pública para restablecer el órden constitucional y seguir cobrando en la aduana de Ciudad-Bolívar los impueostos destinados al Gobierno general exclusivamente,

Decreta :

Art. 1.º Se declaran cerrados la parte de costa que se extiende desde la boca de Vagres hasta la de Navios, todos los caños que forman el Delta del Orinoco y las márgones de este rio hasta Ciudad-Bolívar inclusive.

Art. 2.º Se declaram tambien en estado de bloqueo los mismos puertos, costas y lugares.

Art. 3.º Si se acercare algun buque á las costas, puertos y lugares bloqueados, la fuerza bloqueadora le notificará la existencia del bloqueo, anotando en sus papeles de navegacion el dia y el lugar ó la altura en que lo haya encontrado y tambien la notificacion hecha. En caso de insistir el buque en su pretension de entrar, no obstante el aviso, ó si vuelve á presentarse en dichos puntos, quedará sujeto á ser apresado y detenido para el juicio correspondiente.

Art. 4.º Para el apresamiento y detencion de las naves que traten de salir de las costas, puertos

y lugares bloqueados, no se necesitará la privia notificacion prescrita en el artículo anterior.

§ único. No se impedirá la salida de los bajeles que ántes de formado el bloqueo hayan entrado allí.

Art. 5.º Tambien serán apresados y detenidos desde la primera vez que se presenten los buques que conduzcan efectos de contrabando de guerra para lugares ocupados por rebeldes.

Art. 6.º Los comandantes de los buques bloqueadores procederán con los bajeles detenidos por violacion del bloqueo, ó por conduccion de géneros de contrabando, del modo prevenido en la ordenanza de curso de 1822, en lo que no se oponga á las disposiciones anteriores, debiendo traerlos presos al puerto de la Guaira para que los juzgue la Alta Corte federal.

Art. 7.º Este decreto se notificará á quienes corresponda, y el Ministro encargado de los Despachos de Guerra y Marina cuidará de su publicacion y cumplimiento.

JOSE DESIDERIO TRIAS :

In charge of the National Executive.

An insurrection against the institutions which the nation has given to itself having occurred in the State of Guayana, as the Executive must make use of public force to re-establish constitutional order, and continue to collect at the Customs of Ciudad Bolivar the duties destined exclusively to the general Government,

Decree :

Art. 1. The part of the coast extending from the mouth of Vagres to that of Navios, all the canals formed by the Delta of the Orinoco and the margins of that river, inclusive of Ciudad Bolivar, are declared closed.

Art. 2. The ports, coasts, and villages of the same are also declared to be blockaded.

Art. 3. If a vessel should approach the coast, ports, or blockaded villages, the blockading force will notify the existence of the blockade, noting in the log-book the day, place, or altitude at which the vessel is met, as also the notification made.

In case the vessel should persist in her pretensions to enter, notwithstanding the admonition, or present herself again at those points, she will become liable to seizure and detention for the corresponding judgment.

Art. 4. For the capture and detention of vessels which may try to leave the coast, ports, or blockaded villages, no prior notification is necessary.

No impediment shall be offered to the sailing of vessels which had entered these ports before the establishment of the blockade.

Art. 5. Vessels carrying contraband of war for the ports occupied by the rebels, will also be captured and detained from the moment they present themselves.

Art. 6. The commanders of the blockading vessels will deal with the vessels detained for violation of the blockade or for carriage of contraband, according to the Privateering Ordinance of 1822, in whatever does not contradict the foregoing dispositions, and shall bring the prizes to La Guayra, to be judged by the High Federal Court.

Art. 7. This Decree shall be notified to whom it concerns; and the Minister in the War and Marine Department will see to its publication and fulfilment.

Revolving Light at Puerto Cabello.

THE Government of the States of Venezuela has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of September, 1864, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Brava Point, Puerto Cabello, on the coast of Venezuela.

The light is a revolving light, showing alternately red and white faces at intervals of forty seconds. It is placed at an elevation of 79 feet

above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 14 miles.

Revolving Light on Texel Island.

THE Minister of Marine of the Hague has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of November, 1864, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the north-east extremity of Texel Island, on the coast of Holland.

The light will be a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every *minute*. It is placed at an elevation of 164 feet above the mean level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen at a distance of 18 miles. Beyond the distance of 16 miles the eclipses are total.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The tower is 98 feet high, and stands in lat. 53° 10' 58" N., long. 4° 51' 22" East of Greenwich. This light will serve principally to avoid the dangerous shoals called the Eijerlandsche Gronden.

Alteration of Vlieland Light.

Also, that on and after the 1st day of November, 1864, the light on the island of Vlieland will be *eclipsed* between the bearings of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. and S. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., or in the direction of the shoals at the entrances of Thomas Smit and N.O. Gats; it will show *red* when bearing from S. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. round by east to N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; and white from N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. round by north to S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. The *red* light will indicate the direction to the entrances of the channels of Stortemelk and Noordoostgat; but a portion of it will show over Vlieland.

Alteration of Terschelling Light.

Also, that on and after the 1st day of November, 1864, the revolving light exhibited from Terschelling lighthouse will be altered to a *fixed* white light of the first order, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 22 to 24 miles.
