THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Hamburg, stating that a series of laws has been passed in Hamburg under date of the 7th instant, and which laws are to come into operation on the 1st of February next, whereby all the privileges of the guilds and trading fraternities are put an end to, and trades or industrial occupations may thenceforth be freely exercised, not only by Hamburg citizens but by foreigners not subjects of the Republic, who shall have obtained from the police permission to reside, upon proving their continued right of settlement in their mother-country, and upon payment of moderate fees.

Exceptions from the general liberty of carrying on business are made in the cases of advocates, translators, medical men, schoolmasters, theatre managers, pilots, gasfitters, brokers, emigration agents, &c., who are still to be governed by the special regulations hitherto applicable to them. Certain other trades, such as those of chimney-sweepers, hackney coachmen, hawkers, exhibitors, &c., continue subject to the special supervision of the police, as heretofore.

Persons desirous of carrying on trades or businesses within the Republic must give notice of their desire to the proper authorities. The right may be withdrawn from them by the sentence of a Court of Justice.

Foreigners may be admitted citizens of Hamburg upon proving—1st., that they have resided five years within the territory, and are in possession of a sufficient income; 2nd., that they are of full age according to Hamburg law (viz. 22 years old); and 3rd., that they are released from allegiance to the State of which they have been members; but the Senate is authorised to dispense with the 1st. and 3rd. of these conditions. The fees on admission to citizenship will be altogether 100 marks, or about £6.

The Jews are declared entitled to the rights of citizenship on the same conditions as other persons. They will no longer be forced to belong to the communities either of the German Israelites or of the Portuguese Jews established in Hamburg.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by another Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office."

And whereas it is expedient that regulations should be made for the transmission by the post of the letters hereinafter-mentioned:

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers vested in us, in and by the said recited Acts, or either of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided, order and direct as follows:—

1. On every letter not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight, posted in Alexandria addressed to Constantinople, or posted in Constantinople addressed to Alexandria, and transmitted by the post between Alexandria and Constantinople, by British or by French packet boat, there shall be charged and taken an uniform rate of postage of fourpence.

2. All such letters so transmitted as hereinbefore-mentioned, if exceeding one half of an ounce in weight, shall be subject to the several further

and additional and progressive rates of postage hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

On every such letter, if exceeding one half of an ounce, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid two rates of postage;

And on every such letter, if exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding one ounce and one half of another ounce in weight, three rates of postage;

And on every such letter, if exceeding one ounce and one half of another ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage;

And for every additional half of an ounce in weight of any such letter above the weight of two ounces, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, one additional rate of postage; and every fractional part of such additional half of an ounce in weight shall be charged as an additional half of an ounce in weight; and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant, if not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight.

3. Nothing herein contained shall be construed in anywise to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions or privileges granted by or under the said recited Acts, or either of them, or by or under any other Acts of Parliament relating to the Post Office, or any of the privileges which officers, seamen, and soldiers, employed in Her Majesty's Service, are by law entitled to, of sending and receiving by the post letters subject to the regulations and restrictions in respect of the same.

4. The several terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said recited Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty.

5. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may by Warrant under their hands, duly made at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, or revoke any of the rates of postage hereby fixed, or any of the orders, directions, regulations, and conditions hereby made, and may, make and establish any new or other rates, orders, directions, regulations, and conditions in lieu thereof, and from time to time appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.
