NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Admiralty and the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Despatch from the Governor of Queensland, notifying the establishment by the Government of Queensland of two new ports and settlements on the north-eastern coast of Australia, namely—at Cardwell, in Rockingham Bay, and at Somerset, near Cape York. The Governor states that the crews of vessels wrecked in Torres Straits and the neighbouring seas will now find safe Harbours of Refuge in the above ports, whilst captains of passing vessels can there procure fresh provisions and water, and other supplies, and (when necessary) the protection and assistance of police, magistrates, and other officers of Government.
