

in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter sixty; of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation for altering the boundaries of the district chapelry of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-sixth day of the same month and year, a part of the parish of Saint Peter, Bradford, in the said county and diocese, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mary, situate at Laister Dyke, in the said parish, and such district chapelry was called 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke.'

"And whereas it has been proposed to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said district chapelry should be altered and extended so as to include within the limits of such district chapelry an additional portion of the said parish of Saint Peter, Bradford, and a portion of the adjacent parish of Calverley, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and also a portion of the adjacent parochial chapelry of Pudsey, within the said parish of Calverley, as hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Ripon, as Bishop of the said diocese, and also as the patron in right of his see of the vicarage of the said parish of Calverley; of the Reverend William Carus, Canon Residentiary of the Cathedral Church of Winchester; of the Reverend John Venn, the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Peter, in the city of Hereford; of the Reverend Edward Auriol, the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Saint Dunstan-in-the-West, in the city of London; of the Reverend Edmund Hollond, of Hyde-park-gardens, in the county of Middlesex, Clerk; and of the Reverend William Cadman, the district rector or incumbent of the district rectory of the Trinity district rectory, in Saint Marylebone, in the county of Middlesex, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Peter, Bradford; and also as the patrons of the perpetual curacy of the district chapelry of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke aforesaid; of the Reverend John Burnet, the vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the parish of Saint Peter, Bradford; of the Reverend Alfred Brown, the vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the parish of Calverley aforesaid, and as such vicar the patron of the perpetual curacy of the parochial chapelry of Pudsey aforesaid; and of the Reverend Henry John Graham, the incumbent of such perpetual curacy; and of the Reverend George Collins, the incumbent of the perpetual curacy of the said district chapelry of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke aforesaid (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we humbly represent that in our opinion it would be expedient that the boundaries of the said district chapelry of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, should be

altered and extended, so as to include within the limits of such district chapelry all that additional portion of the said parish of Saint Peter, Bradford; and also all those portions of the adjacent parish of Calverley, and of the adjacent parochial chapelry of Pudsey, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, and which are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, and are thereon colored blue, pink, and green respectively, and that the said portions so to be added to, and so to be included within, the limits of the said district chapelry of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke aforesaid, should become and form part of such district chapelry.

"And we humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"Territory proposed to be added to the District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke:—

"All those several portions of the parish of Saint Peter, Bradford, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, of the parish of Calverley, in the same county and diocese, and of the parochial chapelry of Pudsey, also in the same county and diocese, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line, commencing upon the boundary dividing the said parish of Saint Peter, Bradford, from the district chapelry of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, some time part of such parish, in the middle of that branch of the Leeds and Halifax turnpike-road which passes through Bradford and Horton, at a point opposite to the middle of the south-western end of a certain foot-path which connects such road with the old turnpike-road to Leeds, such point being distant one hundred and sixty-eight yards, or thereabouts, to the east of the middle of the northern end of Pratt-street, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the middle of the said footpath (passing thereby to the east of the houses called Bower Green), and to the west of the house called Bower Green Farm, to the junction of such foot-path with the old turnpike-road to Leeds aforesaid, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road, as far as its intersection by the Dudley Hill, Killinghall, and Harrogate Turnpike-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named turnpike-road, as far as a point opposite to the middle of the south-western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the Bradford Moor Cavalry and Infantry Barracks, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the middle of such wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the same barracks, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-described wall or fence to a point in the middle of the old turnpike-road to Leeds aforesaid, opposite to the middle of the north-western end of the last-described wall or fence, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the same road, as far as the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Peter, Bradford, from the parish of Calverley aforesaid, and extending thence north-westward along the last-described boundary to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish of Calverley from the district chapelry of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, in the same county and diocese, and extending thence north-eastward along the last-described boun-
