REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentation shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain,

in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

THE following Despatch, with its inclosures, has been received from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires in Japan:—

Yokohama,
January 13, 1865.

MY LORD,

IT is with great satisfaction that I find it my duty to bring to your Lordship's notice two additional instances of the humane and hospitable treatment, by the Japanese authorities and people, of shipwrecked crews, and of pains taken by them to preserve or recover property or gear belonging to stranded vessels.

In November last, the British barque "Ashmore," proceeding to Hakodadi from this port, was wrecked at Benten sama or Low Island, in the Straits of Tsungaru, and Mr. Interpreter Enslie, who started from Hakodadi on the 27th November, and was only able to reach the scene of the disaster several days later, refers in the highest terms to the kind attentions shown by the Prince of Nambu, who, immediately on hearing of the wreck, issued orders to render to the ship's company every possible assistance.

Secondly, in December last, the British barque "Onward," chartered to take the place of the "Ashmore," was, on her voyage to Hakodadi, wrecked at Kashima, about 250 miles distant from Yokohama. The captain, his wife, two children, and crew were treated with the utmost kindness by the Hatamoto (squire of the village),—the property saved from the wreck, including all their clothes. A box of treasure (5,000 dollars) was carefully guarded, and finally placed on board Her Majesty's steam despatch-gunboat "Coquette" sent to their relief.

It is also incumbent on me to point out the zealous and praiseworthy services of the gentlemen belonging to Her Majesty's Civil Service who proceeded to the assistance of these wrecks, and the risks to which the faithful performance of

such duties exposes them. Mr. Ensle was seven days in reaching the "Ashmore." Throughout this time he was in an open Japanese boat, exposed to the rigours of a commencing winter and the dangers of a stormy strait. Indeed, during his absence, the rumours of the boat being driven out to sea and cast away were so alarming and persistent, that I deemed it right to ask Mr. Consul Vyse, who was here on unexpired leave, to return to his post on service in the "Osprey," which Sir Augustus Kuper was good enough, on my representation, to despatch to Hakodadi.

In the case of the "Onward," Mr. Satow, Student-Interpreter of this Legation, proceeded in the "Coquette" to Cape Kona, and made his way on shore in the gig through a tempestuous surf, which they were only able to recross after their boat had been transported for four miles across a neck of sand to a more protected starting point.

The procedure of the Japanese Government, in these cases, is so uniformly distinguished by genuine hospitality and kindness, and is in such marked contrast to the inhumanity and rapacity almost everywhere shown by the kindred race on the opposite coast of China, that I trust your Lordship will hold me excused for occupying your Lordship's time with details of events which are otherwise of ordinary interest.

The following is the evidence of Captain Jenkins, of the British barque *Ashmore*, wrecked off Cape Sarawasaki, on the 24th November:—

Left Yokohama on Monday, the 15th November, 1864. Strong winds, fine weather, and at last arrived on the evening of the 24th, off Cape Sarawasaki. At eight o'clock, bearing south, distance seven miles, strong wind and thick weather, took in top-gallant sails, double reefed the top-sails, and about half-past nine a man sung out breakers on the starboard bow. I saw a passage between Low Island and the Cape; tried to steer the vessel between, and about five minutes after the vessel struck heavily. The yards were immediately backed in order to move the ship off, but could do nothing, the seas making a breach over her, which hove her stern right on to the rocks and took the rudder off. I ordered the Carpenter to sound the pumps about half-an-hour after she struck, and found five feet of water in the hold; got the hands turned to, and got some provisions on shore; took a couple of sails to make a tent. At 4 A.M. found the water up to the lower deck beams. All hands went on shore by ropes. At daylight went on board and tried to save some of our effects. The mate and four hands got the whaleboat and tried to go to Hakodadi to report the wreck; I and the remainder of the crew stopped trying to save all we could. Saved the treasure at great risk. At 8.30 the ship sank in 4½ fathoms water. On Friday afternoon the ship went to pieces. On Thursday morning at 9.30, some Japanese came off bringing rice. Assistance from the Consulate arrived, but nothing could be done till Tuesday morning, on which day H.B.M.'s Acting Consul came himself. We left for Hakodadi in junks the following morning.

I, Ferdinand C. Kreeft, late Master of the British barque "Onward," of Melbourne, which was wrecked on the east coast of Nipon on the 29th December, 1864, wish to express my thanks for the great kindness and protection received by myself, crew, and family, from the Japanese authorities at Kasima, where the vessel was wrecked.

During nine days, and until relieved by Her Majesty's steamer "Coquette," every want and necessary was supplied to us.

The magistrate or chief Yakonin of that locality was so civil and attentive as to personally escort us on board the "Coquette," and further to render great assistance to Mrs. Kreeft and children, and also to the officers and crew of the "Coquette's" gig, detained during two days by an impassable bar, and eventually had the boat and treasure carried over a distance of four miles to another part of the coast, to enable them to get off; the said head Yakonin himself seeing the last safely on board the "Coquette."

I have no hesitation in saying, from my experience, that the kind treatment and efficient assistance which I received from those Japanese authorities could not have been surpassed in any part of the world.

The Universal Horticultural Exhibition of 1865,
 to be held under the Patronage of Her
 Majesty the Queen of Holland and His Royal
 Highness the Prince of Orange, in the Palace
 of Industry at Amsterdam.

A DESPATCH has been received by Earl
 Russell from the Minister of the Netherlands,
 stating that the Royal Society of the Netherlands
 for the Encouragement of Horticulture, intends
 holding an Exhibition in the spring, and inviting
 the British Government to name delegates to be
 present at the Exhibition, and to serve on the
 juries.

THE RULES, &c., OF THE UNIVERSAL HORTICUL-
 TURAL EXHIBITION, TO BE HELD IN THE
 PALACE OF INDUSTRY, AMSTERDAM, UNDER
 THE PATRONAGE OF HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN
 OF THE NETHERLANDS AND THE PRESIDENCY
 OF THE PRINCE OF ORANGE.

The Royal Society of the Netherlands for the
 Encouragement of Horticulture, under the protec-
 tion of His Majesty the King of the Netherlands,
 proposes, together with the greater number of
 horticultural and agricultural societies and insti-
 tutions of the Kingdom, to open, in the spring of
 the present year, an Universal Exhibition of the
 products of horticulture, and of objects of art and
 industry connected with that pursuit, at the Palace
 of Industry at Amsterdam.

Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands has
 condescended to grant her patronage to this Exhi-
 bition, and His Royal Highness the Prince of

Orange has graciously consented to be elected President of the Committee of Management.

The regulations which follow will be completed at a future period, and at the same time the days of the opening and closing of the Exhibition and of the reception and carrying away of products, as well as all other necessary details, will be decided.

The Exhibition will probably be opened towards the middle of April next.

An International Congress of Botanists and Horticulturists will be convened at Amsterdam, and will be held at the same time as the Exhibition.

The Botanical, Horticultural, and Agricultural Societies of the kingdom, as well as those of foreign countries, are requested to communicate the contents of this programme to their members as soon as possible.

The editors of newspapers and periodical publications are requested to insert in their columns the following programme, and to give as much publicity as possible to this Universal Exhibition.

THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

RULES.

1. Amateurs, horticulturists, merchants, artists, and artisans, together with the societies and institutions of the Netherlands and foreign countries, are invited to send their products to the Exhibition, and to take part in the competitions.

2. There are separate competitions opened for amateurs and professional horticulturists. All competitions which are not thus restricted are open to all the world.

3. The programme is divided into three special sections—plants and flowers, fruits and vegetables, objects of art and industry connected with horticulture.

4. Distinguished Dutch and foreign botanists and horticulturists will be invited to form an international jury to judge the products sent.

5. The rewards will consist of gold, silver gilt, and silver medals, of different sizes, the dies of which are to be used on this occasion only, and will be broken up after the distribution has taken place.

6. Exhibitors who may obtain prizes will be allowed to have their choice between the above-mentioned medals or their value in money, which is fixed at 100 florins (Dutch), for the grand gold medal, and 50 florins (Dutch), for the second gold medal. The value of the silver and silver gilt medals will be fixed at a later period.

7. Exhibitors of plants, which will be presented as newly introduced, will, besides giving the name of such plants, have to communicate the date of their introduction, the locality of their origin, and the names of the authors who have described them.

8. Exhibitors must, with each object sent, state the class in which they are desirous of having it entered.

9. No object will be allowed to compete more than once.

10. In competitions where the number of samples has been fixed, more than that number must not be presented.

11. No one will be admitted as an amateur, and at the same time as a professional horticulturist.

12. All plants must be carefully labelled with their botanical or horticultural names.

13. No award will be made to any object sent which does not possess sufficient merit to gain the prize fixed.

14. Exhibitors are forbidden to place their names, or any other distinguishing sign, upon

the objects sent by them, before the decision of the jury has been made known.

15. The Managing Committee will take every precaution for the safety of the objects exhibited, but it does not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage beyond its control.

16. The Committee reserves to itself the right of making rules to meet all cases not provided for by the present regulations.

NOTE.—All letters, communications, and information concerning the Exhibition are to be addressed to Mr. J. H. Krelage, First Secretary to the Managing Committee for the Universal Horticultural Exhibition, Harlem.

The Rules and Programme will be sent gratis and post paid, on application being made, *by letter prepaid*, to the Secretary.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 96, for the regulation of the duties of postage, certain scales of weight and rates of postage were fixed and made chargeable and payable upon, for, or in respect of letters, newspapers, parliamentary proceedings, and printed papers, transmitted and forwarded by the post; and various regulations were made for facilitating the transmission of such letters and papers by the post; and by the same Act powers were given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of postage therein mentioned.

And whereas further powers were given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury by

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another Act of Parliament passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 85, for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office.

And whereas it is expedient to authorise the transmission by the post between the United Kingdom and the island of St. Thomas, and the other Danish colonies in the West Indies, of certain packets, and for that purpose to make certain regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers reserved to us in and by the said hereinbefore recited Acts of Parliament, and every of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided, order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. All packets consisting of patterns or samples of merchandize, of no intrinsic value, posted in any part of the United Kingdom, addressed to any port in the island of St. Thomas, or the other Danish colonies in the West Indies, or posted in any port in the island of St. Thomas, or the other Danish colonies in the West Indies, addressed to any part of the United Kingdom, may be transmitted by the post between the United Kingdom and the island of St. Thomas, and the other Danish colonies in the West Indies, subject to the several rates of postage, and to the several orders, directions, regulations, and restrictions, hereinafter mentioned and contained, that is to say:—

On every such packet, if not exceeding four ounces in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, an uniform single rate of postage of three pence;

And on every such packet, if exceeding four ounces, and not exceeding one half of a pound in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, two rates of postage;

And on every such packet, if exceeding one half of a pound, and not exceeding one pound in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, four rates of postage;

And on every such packet, if exceeding one pound, and not exceeding one pound and one half of another pound in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, six rates of postage;

And on every such packet, if exceeding one pound and one half of another pound, and not exceeding two pounds in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, eight rates of postage;

And for every additional half of a pound in weight of any such packet above the weight of two pounds, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, two additional rates of postage; and every fractional part of such additional half of a pound in weight shall be charged as an additional half of a pound in weight; and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such packet would be charged with under this Warrant, if not exceeding four ounces in weight.

2. No such packet, which in length, or breadth, or depth, shall exceed the dimensions of two feet, shall be transmitted by the post under the provisions of this Warrant.

3. No pattern or sample being of any intrinsic value, or being an article or thing of a saleable

nature, or having a value of its own apart from its mere use as a pattern or sample, shall be transmitted by the post under the provisions of this Warrant.

4. There shall be no enclosure sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, nor any other enclosure not authorised by this Warrant, sent in or with any such packet.

5. There shall be no writing or printing in or upon any such packet, or on the cover thereof, except the address of the person for whom it is intended, the address of the sender thereof, a trade mark, and numbers and prices.

6. All such packets shall be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination; nevertheless, samples of seeds, drugs, and such other articles and things as cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or of other material; but bags so closed that they cannot be readily opened, even although they be transparent, shall not be used for that purpose.

If any packet sent or tendered, or delivered in order to be sent by the post, under the provisions of this Warrant, shall in length or breadth or depth exceed the dimensions of two feet, or shall consist wholly of patterns or samples of any intrinsic value, as in the third clause of this Warrant mentioned, or if there shall be any writing or printing in or upon any such packet, or on the cover thereof, except the address of the person for whom it is intended, the address of the sender thereof, a trade mark, and numbers and prices, or if any such packets shall not be sent in covers open at the ends so as to be easy of examination (except samples of seeds, drugs, and such other articles and things as cannot be sent in open covers, and which may be enclosed in bags of linen, or of other material), or in case of bags being used, if such bags shall be so closed that they cannot be readily opened, every such packet shall be treated in all respects as a letter, except that it shall be chargeable with such rate or amount of postage as the Postmaster-General shall think proper, not exceeding the rate or amount of postage to which it would be liable as a letter if the postage had been paid when posted.

8. If any packet sent or tendered, or delivered in order to be sent by the post, under the provisions of this Warrant, shall contain any enclosure, sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or any other enclosure not authorised by this Warrant, every such enclosure may be taken out by any officer of the Post Office, and either returned or given up to the sender thereof, or be forwarded to the address on the packet, charged not only with the full rates of postage as an unpaid letter, but also with a further and additional rate of three-pence, and the remainder of the packet, if duly prepaid by stamps, may be forwarded to the place of its address without any extra charge.

9. The postage of all such packets as aforesaid, posted in the United Kingdom, shall in every case be paid at the time of the same being posted, not in money, but by being duly stamped with the proper postage stamp or stamps affixed thereto, which stamp or stamps shall in every case be affixed or appear on the outside of every such packet, near the address or direction, and shall be of the value or amount of the postage duty payable thereon, under and by virtue of this Warrant.

10. The postage of all such packets as aforesaid, posted in the Island of St. Thomas, and the other Danish colonies in the West Indies, shall in every case be paid at the time of the same

being posted either in money or by the proper postage stamp or stamps being affixed thereto.

11. If any packet sent or tendered, or delivered in order to be sent by the post, under the provisions of this Warrant, shall be posted in the United Kingdom without having thereon or affixed thereto any stamp or stamps, or having thereon or affixed thereto a stamp or stamps, the value of which shall be less in amount than the rate of postage to which such packet would be liable, under and by virtue of this Warrant, every such last-mentioned packet shall and may be detained and opened at any place in the United Kingdom, and at the option of the Postmaster-General shall be dealt with and chargeable in like manner as is hereinbefore directed with respect to any packet, which in length, breadth, or depth shall exceed the dimensions of two feet.

12. If any packet sent or tendered, or delivered in order to be sent by the post, under the provisions of this Warrant, shall be posted in the island of St. Thomas, or in any other of the Danish colonies in the West Indies, without any postage being paid thereon, or the postage paid thereon at the time of the same being posted, being less in amount than the rate of postage to which such packet would be liable under and by virtue of this Warrant, every such last-mentioned packet shall be detained and opened, and, at the option of the Postmaster-General, shall and may be either returned or given up to the sender thereof, or be given up to the person to whom it shall be addressed, or be forwarded to the place of its destination. And every such last-mentioned packet, on being so returned, given up, or forwarded, shall be chargeable with the like amount of postage to which it would have been liable as a letter if the postage had been paid when posted, and such postage may be either paid by the sender or may be charged to the person to whom such packet shall be forwarded.

13. In order to prevent any obstacles to the due and regular transmission of letters by the post, any officer of the Post Office may delay the transmission of any packet posted or forwarded by the post, under the provisions of this Warrant, either for the space of twenty-four hours after the time at which the same ought to be despatched in due course of the post, or (at his option) until the despatch of the mail next after that by which the same ought in due course of the post to be forwarded by him.

14. In all cases in which any question shall hereafter arise, whether any packet or any pattern or sample contained therein, transmitted under or by virtue of this Warrant, is entitled to the privileges of this Warrant, and to be so transmitted within the intent and meaning thereof, such question shall be referred to the determination of the Postmaster-General, whose decision thereupon shall be final and conclusive upon all parties.

The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands, duly made at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, revoke or modify any of the rates of postage hereby fixed, or any of the regulations hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu

thereof, and from time to time may appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid.

17. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

Wreck of H.M.S. Bombay, in the Rio de la Plata.

IN consequence of the destruction by fire of Her Majesty's late ship *Bombay* near Monte Video, on the 14th December, 1864, the wreck of that vessel now forms a danger to vessels navigating in the channel between the English bank Flores Islet.

The wreck lies about four miles N.W. by W. of the English bank light vessel, with the Cerro lighthouse bearing N.W. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.; and Flores lighthouse N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. The bowsprit which appears above water at present serves as a beacon, and denotes the position of the wreck.

Rock near the Entrance to the South Channel of Santa Catharina.

A sunken rock has recently been discovered near the entrance to the south channel of Santa Catharina, by M. Mouchez, commander of the French vessel *Lamothé-Piquet*.

The rock is small, with 9 or 10 feet of water on it, and $6\frac{1}{2}$ or $7\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms fine sands near it, and on which the sea breaks with the easterly winds. It is said to lie with Naufragados point lighthouse, bearing N. $1^{\circ} 30'$ E (true), distant $1\frac{3}{16}$ miles; and Pinheira point S. 21° W. 6 cables.
