REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a

letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentation shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a communication, stating that the Governments of Austria and Prussia have granted to the Duchies of Holstein, Schleswig, and Lauenburg, a provisional National Flag, and that Her Majesty's Government has agreed to recognise such flag provisionally, saving the rights of those States and of the German Confederation, and only until their definitive constitution.

The flag is to be composed of three horizontal stripes in blue, white and red, with a yellow field placed on the blue stripe next the flag-staff to distinguish it from the flag of the Duchy of Mecklenburg.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Royal Italian Decree, of which the following is a translation, and in virtue of which the Tuscan silver coins specified in the Decree

will cease to have legal currency from the 31st instant.

(Translation).

We, Victor Emmanuel, &c., King of Italy.

On the proposal of our Minister of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce, in concert with the Minister of Finance, ordain as follows:—

ART. I.—The Tuscan silver coins denominated pisis or francescone, *i. e.* a piece of 10 Tuscan pauls equivalent to frs. 5·60; half pisis or half francescone, *i. e.* a piece of 5 Tuscan pauls equivalent to frs. 2·80; a quarter pisis or florin, *i. e.* a piece of 2½ Tuscan pauls equivalent to frs. 1·40; Piece of 10 Florentine lire equivalent to frs. 8·40;

Ditto of 5 Florentine lire equivalent to frs. 4·20; The ancient scudo of the Republic of Lucca of frs. 5·60;

The half scudo of ditto of frs. 2·80;

Shall cease to have legal currency after the 31st March, in the present year, both in the Provinces of Tuscany and in the other provinces of the Kingdom where they have hitherto been received by the Public Treasury in virtue of the decrees of former governments, and consequently after the 1st of April, 1865. They will no longer be given or received in payment by any Government Treasury, and may be equally refused in payment by merchants or private individuals.

ART. II.—From the 21st (? 31st) of March of the present year to the 10th of next April, that is ten days after the cessation of the legal currency, the above-mentioned coins will be taken in exchange for decimal gold and silver coins at the offices of the Province of Tuscany, to be designated by the Minister of Finance.

The fractional sums below the value of 20 centimes are to be compensated in copper coin.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Copenhagen, enclosing the following translation of a Danish Law recently enacted and which regulates the amount of drawback to be allowed on the exportation of Danish and foreign brandies.

1st. A drawback will henceforth be allowed on the export of home-made brandy to a foreign or a free port, or as ships' stores of 1·6 skilling per "pot" of four degrees of strength, with an addition of 0·1 skilling per "pot" for each quarter of a degree increase of strength.

No drawback will be allowed on brandy of less than four degrees of strength.

If sugar, spice, or any such thing is added to the brandy thereby preventing the gauging of the strength, as in the case of "Aquavit," liqueur, cherry brandy, punch extract and such mixtures, the strength is considered to be eight degrees, so that in each case a drawback of 3·2 skillings per "pot" will be allowed.

2nd. The present law will apply also to the drawback allowed by paragraph 29 of the law of the 4th July, 1863, on the exportation to foreign

or free ports of foreign spirits liable to customs' duty, either pure or mixed with sugar and the like.

3rd. The conditions respecting the extent of drawback on the exportation of home-made brandy with or without sugar, contained in paragraph No. 7 of the law of February 7, 1851, are hereby repealed, but the remainder of the paragraph continues in force.

4th. So long as the law of the 5th August of last year respecting the war tax on brandies remains in force, the drawback mentioned in the above paragraphs 1 and 2 will be calculated under the conditions laid down in that law with an increase of 50 per cent.
