NOTIFICATION OF THE RAISING OF THE BLOCKADE OF MONTE VIDEO.

Foreign Office, April 11, 1865.

IT is hereby notified, that Earl Russell, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Monte Video, enclosing a letter addressed by his Excellency Baron de Tamandaré, Commander-in-Chief of the Brazilian Naval Forces in the River

Plate, to Rear-Admiral the Honourable C. B. Elliot, C.B., Commanding-in-Chief Her Majesty's Naval Forces on that station, announcing that the blockade of the Port of Monte Video, established by the Brazilian Naval Forces, by order of the Government of that country, was raised on the 21st of February last.

The following is a copy and translation of the letter of his Excellency Baron de Tamandaré to Rear-Admiral the Honourable C. B. Elliot above referred to:—

Commando-em-Chefe da Força Naval do Brazil, no Rio da Prata, Bordo da Corveta Nitheroy, em Monte Video, 21 de Fevereiro de 1865.

ILLMO. EXMO. SNR.,

Tenho a satisfação de comunicar a Vossa Excellenza que, havendo-se assignado hontem a Convenção de paz entre o Imperio do Brazil, e o Governo de Monte Video, fica, por este faustomotivo, levantado o bloqueio deste porto exercido pelas forças navaes de meu commando; o que rogo a Vossa Excellenza se sirva fazer constar ao seu agente diplomatico, e concidadães.
