INTERNATIONAL AGRICULTURAL
EXHIBITION AT COLOGNE

In the Year 1865,

Under the Patronage of
His Royal Highness the CROWN PRINCE OF PRUSSIA.

THE undersigned Committee has met in order to organize an International Exhibition of Machinery, Implements and Productions of Horticulture, Agriculture, and Forestry, together with objects of Farmers' and Foresters' household economy. The Exhibition will be opened on the 15th of May next, in the grounds of the Horticultural Society "Flora."

The town of Cologne, situated on the banks of the most animated river in Germany, in the centre of a most extensive railway-net, in the very heart of rich manufacturing districts, recommends itself not only by its excellent situation, but also by an uninterrupted communication with the interior of Germany and all neighbouring countries.

The grounds of the "Flora," laid out by the Principal Director of the Royal Gardens, Mr. Lenné, of Potsdam, a Master and Nestor of Horticultural Science, offer, both by their extent and their suitable neighbourhood, the best gratuitous space for the reception of the richest choice of the above-mentioned objects.

We therefore invite all Manufacturers and Possessors of the same to contribute to the Exhibition, which will be organized by more specified arrangements to be made by the undersigned General Committee, aided by Special Commissions.

In calling attention to the fact that objects not long in possession of the producers are not excluded from the Exhibition, we beg leave to express the wish that the name and address of the same may be stated.

The Exhibition is to comprise the following principal divisions:—

1. Agricultural productions, including the produce of rural trade as well as collections of any kind connected with rural life.
2. Implements and machinery for agricultural purposes.
3. All trade productions concerning Husbandry and Forestry; viz.—Plans and models of dwelling and farm houses and their materials, household furniture, working implements, victuals, and objects employed for the preparation and use of the same.
4. Productions and implements of Forestry and Sport, as well as Collections relating thereto.

5. Productions and implements of Horticulture and Garden Architecture, including garden furniture, statues, aviaries, fountains, tents, etc., etc.

Care will be taken that the Machinery sent in will be put in action during the Exhibition.

The most eminent experts of Germany and of the countries the exhibitors may belong to will be chosen as members of the Jury.

Objects exposed will be purchased for the purpose of a tombola, for which the sum of at least 10,000 thalers shall be laid out. Exhibitors are therefore requested to state, on announcing objects, whether they can be bought, as also to keep in view the following conditions:—

1. The Exhibition opens on 15th May, and closes on 1st June, 1865; a fortnight's prolongation is, however, reserved.
2. On sending objects, exhibitors engage to leave them until the close of the Exhibition, and to withdraw them within a week after the same.
3. Covered space will be set apart for all objects requiring it.
4. Objects to be exposed must be announced at latest till 30th March; the reception will take place from 15th April till 5th May.
5. Good and notable productions will be rewarded, by the decision of a Jury, with Prize Medals of Gold, Silver, and Bronze, as also with Honourable Mentions.
6. A public sale (free of expense) of objects allotted by the exhibitors themselves, will take place after close of the Exhibition.
7. Free conveyance, or reduction in the same, is expected will be granted by most of the Inland and Foreign Railway Lines and Steam Navigation Companies. Transactions have been entered into for the remission of the Custom-house duty, the result of which will be published later.

Exhibition of Household Objects for Farmers and Foresters, at Cologne.

The Horticultural Society "Flora," at Cologne, in conjunction with the most eminent Experts of the Province and the Principal Authorities and Men of Commerce, will organize on 15th May next, under the Patronage of His Royal Highness the CROWN PRINCE OF PRUSSIA,

A GRAND INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION of Farming and Forestry Productions, Implements and Machinery, and intends, taking as example the Exhibitions of "Domestic Economy" held in London, Paris, and Brussels, to adjoin an Exhibition of Farmers' and Foresters' Household Implements of daily use and necessity. These objects to be divided into five classes:—

I. DWELLINGS.

Plans and models of dwellings and farm-houses, stables, wash-houses, sheds, ice-pits, and their constituent parts; viz.: roofing, walls, stairs, cellars, doors, windows, wells, pailings, etc., etc.

II. HOUSEHOLD FURNITURE.

Beddings, tables, benches, chairs, cupboards, washing and cleaning apparatus, ovens and other heating contrivances, lighting objects; viz.: lamps, candlesticks, lanterns, etc.; crockery, baskets, straw and rush mats.

III. CLOTHES AND LINEN.

Woolen and cotton stuffs, flax, hemp, etc., etc.; wearing apparel provided it be national, or especially adapted for certain countries or climates, head and feet covering, washing apparatus, bed-clothes, and such like.

IV. WORKING IMPLEMENTS.

Axes, saws, hammers, spades, rakes, hoes, tongs, knives, chopping-benches, grinding apparatus, etc.; harness contrivances; viz.: harness for horses, yokes for oxen, etc.; baskets for the conveyance of butter, etc.

V. VICTUALS AND IMPLEMENTS EMPLOYED FOR PREPARING THEM, AND THEIR USE.

Corn, leguminous plants, flour, sugar, pastry, butter, grease, cheese, conserved meats, wines and

other beverages, cooking and drinking objects; viz.: earthen pots, pitchers, plates, glasses, bottles, etc., etc.

The aim in exhibiting the above mentioned objects is to make them universally known, to incite the imitation and perfection thereof, to recommend the way of employing and using the same, to point out their cheap production, to expose to view the peculiarities, customs, and exigencies in some districts; in short, to give a complete insight into farmers' and foresters' household arrangements, in all countries.

Consequently, such objects can only be accepted that are recommendable by the solidity of the material and their workmanship, by usefulness and cheapness, and by statement of the wholesale and retail prices at the place where they are manufactured, produced, or sent from.

The space reserved for the above articles, only permits of single specimens of each genus being exhibited.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 22.)—MEDITERRANEAN—ADRIATIC.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Promontore Point, Island of Lissa.

THE Imperial Central Maritime Government at Trieste has given notice, that on and after the 15th day of March, 1865, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Promontore Point, the east extreme of the island of Lissa, in the Adriatic.

The light is a *fixed* white light, varied by a *flash* every *minute*, and visible through an arc of nearly 240°, or when bearing from about north round by west and south to S.E. by E.½E. It is placed at an elevation of 125 feet above the mean level of the sea, and in clear weather the fixed light should be seen from a distance of 12 miles, and the flashes at 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the first order.

The tower is octagonal, white, 92 feet high, and stands about 97 yards from the extremity of the point, in lat. 43° 4' 15" N., long. 16° 15' 20" East of Greenwich.

The limit of the light passes half a mile northward of the small islets of Vacca and Vitelli, lying outside Port St. Giorgio, Lissa.

(No. 23.)—IRELAND—EAST COAST.

Light Vessel off Wicklow Head.

THE Corporation of the Port of Dublin has given notice, that on or about the 30th day of June, 1865, a light vessel will be placed off Wicklow Head, east coast of Ireland.

The light will be a *fixed red* light, at an elevation of 39 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be visible from a distance of 9 miles.

The vessel will be moored in 12 fathoms water, with Wicklow Head bearing N.W. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W, distant 8 miles.

Discontinuance of Wicklow Head Upper Light.

Also, that on or about the above date, the Wicklow Head *upper* light will be discontinued.

Alteration of Kish Bank Lights.

Also, that on or about the above date, the Kish Bank Light vessel, which now exhibits three fixed lights, will then show a *revolving* white light only, which will attain its greatest brilliancy every *minute*.

Alteration of Arklow Bank Light.

Also, that on or about the above date, the Arklow Bank light will be changed from revolving every minute, to once every *half minute*.

These changes will be made simultaneously with the exhibition of the light from the light vessel off Wicklow Head.
