In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen, for Her Majesty's approbation. ## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by my Proclamations of the nineteenth and twenty-seventh days of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the ports of the United States in the States of Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, and Texas, were declared to be subject to blockade; but whereas the said blockade has, in consequence of actual military occupation by this Government, since been conditionally set aside or relaxed in respect to the ports of Norfolk and Alexandria, in the State of Virginia; Beaufort, in the State of North Carolina; Port Royal, in the State of South Carolina; Pensacola and Fernandina, in the State of Florida, and New Orleans, in the State of Louisiana:

And whereas, by the fourth section of the Act of Congress, approved on the thirteenth of July, eighteen hundred and sixty-one, entitled "An Act further to provide for the collection of duties on imports and for other purposes," the President, for the reasons therein set forth, is authorized to close certain ports of entry:

Now, therefore, be it known that I, Abraham Lincoln, President of the United States, do hereby proclaim that the ports of Richmond, Tappahannock, Cherrystone, Yorktown and Petersburg, in Virginia; of Camden (Elizabeth City), Edenton, Plymouth, Washington, Newbern, Ocracoke, and Wilmington, in North Carolina; of Charleston, Georgetown, and Beaufort, in South Carolina; of Savannah, St. Mary's, and Brunswick (Darien), in Georgia; of Mobile, in Alabama; of Pearl River (Shieldsborough), Natchez, and Vicksburg, in Mississippi; of St. Augustine, Key West, St. Mark's (Port Leon), St. John's (Jacksonville), and Apalachicola, in Florida; of Teche (Franklin), in Louisiana; of Galveston, La Salle, Brazos de Santiago (Point Isabel), and Brownsville, Texas; are hereby closed, and all right of importation, warehousing, and other privileges, shall, in respect to the ports aforesaid, cease until they shall have again been opened by order of the President; and if, while said ports are so closed, any ship or vessel from beyond the United States, or having on board any articles subject to duties, shall attempt to enter any such port, the same, together with its tackle, apparel, furniture, and cargo, shall be forfeited to the United States.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by my Proclamation of this date, the port of Key West, in the State of Florida, was inadvertently included among those which are not open to commerce;

Now, therefore, be it known that I, Abraham Lincoln, President of the United States, do hereby declare and make known, that the said port of Key West is and shall remain open to foreign and domestic commerce upon the same conditions by which that commerce has there hitherto been governed.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS for some time past vessels of war of the United States have been refused, in certain foreign ports, privileges and immunities to which they were entitled by treaty, public law, or the comity of nations, at the same time that vessels of war of the country wherein the said privileges and immunities have been withheld have enjoyed them fully and uninterruptedly in ports of the United States; which condition of things has not always been forcibly resisted by the United States, although, on the other hand, they have not at any time failed to protest against and declare their dissatisfaction with the same; in the view of the United States no condition any longer exists which can be claimed to justify the denial to them by any one of said nations of customary naval rights such as has heretofore been so unnecessarily persisted in;

Now, therefore, I, Abraham Lincoln, President of the United States, do hereby make known, that if after a reasonable time shall have elapsed for intelligence of this proclamation to have reached any foreign country in whose ports the said privileges and immunities shall have been refused, as aforesaid, they shall continue to be so refused, then and thenceforth the same privileges and immunities shall be refused to the vessels of war of that country in the ports of the United States; and this refusal shall continue until war vessels of the United States shall have been placed upon an entire equality in the foreign ports aforesaid with similar vessels of other countries. The United States, whatever claim or pretence may have existed heretofore, are now, at least, entitled to claim and concede an entire and friendly equality

of rights and hospitalities with all maritime nations.

#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Postmaster-General to remit any of the rates of British postage, for the time being, payable by law on the transmission of post letters, newspapers, or other printed papers, to such extent as the Lords of the Treasury shall from time to time direct; and power is also given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British or inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant, and from time to time, by Warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal

any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof, and from time to time, by Warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

And whereas by another Act of Parliament, passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office," further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and power is also given to the Postmaster-General (amongst other things) to collect and receive the foreign and colonial postage charged or chargeable on any letters sent by the post, and also, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to require the postage, British, colonial, or foreign, of any letters sent by the post to be prepaid, either in money or in stamps, as he might think fit, on the same being put into the Post Office, and also, with such consent, to abolish or restrict the prepayment in money of postage on letters sent by the post, either altogether or on certain letters, and to require the prepayment thereof to be in stamps, and also to refuse to receive or send by the post any letters tendered contrary to any regulations thereby made; and power is also given to the Postmaster-General and any officer of the Post Office to detain any letters which should be posted or sent by the post, contrary to the regulations therein mentioned, and to open such letters, and either to return them to the senders thereof, or to forward them to the places of their destination, charged in either case with such rates of postage as the Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, should from time to time direct.

And whereas, by the laws now in force, seamen and soldiers employed in Her Majesty's service are entitled to certain privileges of sending and receiving by the post letters not exceeding half an ounce in weight, subject to certain regulations and restrictions in respect thereof, but letters exceeding half an ounce in weight, sent or received by such privileged persons, are chargeable with the ordinary rates of postage, and it is expedient to remit such ordinary rates of postage in certain cases to the extent hereinafter mentioned, and to make such regulations as are hereinafter contained.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the power or authority in us for such purpose, vested in and by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant (under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided), order and direct as follows; that is to say:—

1. That on every letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to any part of the United Kingdom, and sent from or to any seaman in Her Majesty's Navy, or any serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or private soldier in Her Majesty's Royal Marines, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any foreign or colonial station, and transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and any such ships or vessels direct or through any colony or foreign country (the sea conveyance being by British packet boat), there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform British rate of postage of one shilling.

2. That on every letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, sent from or to any seaman in Her Majesty's Navy, or any serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or private soldier in Her Majesty's Royal Marines, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any foreign or colonial station, and transmitted by the post between any such ships or vessels and any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any other foreign or colonial station, through the United Kingdom direct, or through any colony or foreign country (the sea conveyance being by British packet boat), there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform British rate of postage of two shillings.

3. That on every letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, sent from or to any seaman in Her Majesty's Navy, or any serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or private soldier in Her Majesty's Royal Marines, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any foreign or colonial station, and transmitted by the post between any such ships or vessels and any of Her Majesty's colonies or any foreign country, through the United Kingdom direct, or through any colony or foreign country (the sea conveyance between any such ships or vessels and the United Kingdom being by British packet boat), there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such letters, the rates of British postage following (that is to say):—

For the conveyance of every such letter between Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any such foreign or colonial station, and any part of the United Kingdom, a rate of one shilling; and for the conveyance of every such letter between the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet boat or vessel (not being a packet boat) conveying the same, and the colony or foreign country to or from which the same shall be forwarded, such a further or additional rate of postage as shall from time to time be charged and payable for British postage on letters exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted or delivered at the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet boat or vessel (not being a packet boat) conveying the same, and transmitted direct between such port and any such colony or foreign country.

4. That on every letter transmitted as is mentioned in this Warrant, exceeding one ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid progressive and additional rates of postage as follows; that is to say:

On every such letter exceeding one ounce and not exceeding one ounce and a half in weight, one rate and the half of another rate of postage.

On every such letter exceeding one ounce and a half and not exceeding two ounces in weight, two rates of postage.

And for every additional half an ounce in weight above the weight of two ounces, there shall be charged and taken an additional half rate of postage, and every fractional part of such additional half an ounce in weight, shall be charged as an additional half an ounce, and each progressive and additional half rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at one half the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant if not exceeding one ounce in weight.

5. That all letters which shall be sent by the post, under the regulations of this Warrant, shall be subject, in addition to the British rates hereby fixed, to the payment of any foreign postage which shall be chargeable thereon.

6. On every letter posted in any part of the United Kingdom for transmission by the post under the authority of this Warrant, addressed to any seaman in Her Majesty's Navy, or to any serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or private soldier in Her Majesty's Royal Marines, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any foreign or colonial station, the postage thereof shall be paid at the time of the same being posted, either in money or by being duly stamped with the proper postage stamp or stamps being affixed thereto, which stamp or stamps shall in every case be affixed or appear on the outside of every such letter near the address, and shall be of the value or amount of the postage duty payable thereon, under or by virtue of this Warrant.

7. On every letter addressed to any part of the United Kingdom and sent for transmission by the post, under the authority of this Warrant, from any seaman in Her Majesty's Navy, or from any serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or private soldier in Her Majesty's Royal Marines, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any colonial station, the postage thereof shall be paid at the time of the same being posted, by means of the proper postage stamp or stamps being affixed thereto, which stamp or stamps shall in every case be affixed or appear on the outside of every such letter near the address, and shall be of the value or amount of the postage duty payable thereon, under or by virtue of this Warrant.

8. If any letter shall be posted in any part of the United Kingdom for transmission by the post, under the authority of this Warrant, addressed to any seaman in Her Majesty's Navy, or to any serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or private soldier in Her Majesty's Royal Marines, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any station at any colony to which ordinary unpaid letters may be forwarded without any postage having been paid thereon, either in money or in postage stamps, every such letter shall be forwarded, charged with the amount of postage to which it would have been liable under this Warrant if the postage had been paid when posted, together with a further and additional rate of postage of sixpence.

9. If any letter shall be posted in any part of the United Kingdom for transmission by the post, under the authority of this Warrant, addressed to any seaman in Her Majesty's Navy, or to any serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or private soldier in Her Majesty's Royal Marines, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any station at any colony to which ordinary unpaid letters may be forwarded, and the postage paid thereon, or postage stamp or stamps affixed thereto shall represent a less amount than the rate of postage to which such letter would be liable, under and by virtue of this Warrant, every such last-mentioned letter shall be forwarded charged with the amount of the difference between the postage so paid thereon, or postage stamp or stamps so being thereon or affixed thereto, and the postage to which such letter would be liable as aforesaid, together with a further and additional rate of postage of sixpence.

10. If any letter addressed to any part of the United Kingdom, and sent for transmission by the post under the authority of this Warrant, from any seaman in Her Majesty's Navy, or from any serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or

private soldier in Her Majesty's Royal Marines, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any colonial station, shall be posted without any postage having been paid thereon by means of the proper postage stamp or stamps being affixed thereto, every such letter shall be forwarded charged with the amount of postage to which it would have been liable under this Warrant if the postage had been paid when posted, together with a further and additional rate of postage of sixpence.

11. If any letter addressed to any part of the United Kingdom and sent for transmission by the post under the authority of this Warrant, from any seaman in Her Majesty's Navy, or from any serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or private soldier in Her Majesty's Royal Marines, employed in any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels on any colonial station, shall be posted, and the postage stamp or stamps affixed thereto shall represent a less amount than the rate of postage to which such letter would be liable under and by virtue of this Warrant, every such last-mentioned letter shall be forwarded charged with the amount of the difference between the value of the postage stamp or stamps so being thereon or affixed thereto, and the postage to which such letter would be liable as aforesaid, together with a further and additional rate of postage of sixpence.

12. The several terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

13. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands, duly made at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, or revoke any of the rates of postage hereby fixed or altered, or any of the orders, directions, regulations, and conditions hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates, orders, directions, regulations, and conditions in lieu thereof, and from time to time appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

14. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.
