Proposed Dissolution of the Morpeth Highway District.

(Provisional Order.)

Whereas in pursuance to the provisions of the Highway Act, 1862, and Highway Act, 1864, notice was given by Addison John Baker Cresswell, Edward Collingwood, Thomas James, Thomas Anderson, James Henry Hollis Atkinson, Esquires; the Rev.
