The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentation shall

be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Princess.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and

with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen, for Her Majesty's approbation. The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted, that in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, burials in any part or parts of the metropolis, or in any burial-ground or places of burial in the metropolis, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued, subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that, from and after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such part or parts of the metropolis, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time, as circumstances may require; provided that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of the parishes in which any burial-grounds or places of burial affected by such representation shall be situate, or on some other conspicuous places within the part or parts of the Metropolis affected by such representation, one calendar month at the least before such representation is so considered; provided always, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and

Vestry Clerk of the parish hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, burials should be forthwith discontinued therein;

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the ninth day of March last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the above recited Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that burials be forthwith discontinued in the Friends' Burial-ground at Hammersmith.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England, beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require), that after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time, as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish;

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal

Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parish, without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials shall be discontinued therein with the following modifications ;

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the thirty-first day of March last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the fifteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act ;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parish, without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State ; and that burials in the said parish shall be discontinued (except as is herein otherwise directed), as follows ; viz. :

TUNSTALL, WOLSTANTON.—In the churchyard, on the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, except in existing vaults and walled graves which are free from water, and in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal and separately enclosed by brickwork or stone properly cemented. In the meantime the conditions under which burials are allowed in the churchyard by Order in Council of twenty-first of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, are to be observed.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Session of Parliament, held in the twentieth and twenty-first years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Burial Acts," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to order such acts to be done by or under the directions of the churchwardens or such other persons as may have the care of any vaults or places of burial, for preventing them from becoming or continuing dangerous or injurious to the public health ; and that every such Order in Council shall be published in the London Gazette, and that such churchwardens or other persons shall do or cause to be done all acts ordered as aforesaid, and the expenses incurred in and about the doing thereof shall be paid out of the poor rates of the parish : Provided always, that no such representation shall be made until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the churchwardens or other persons, or one of the

churchwardens or other persons, having the care of the vaults or places of burial to which the representation relates ;

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation having been duly given to the churchwardens of the parish of St. Pancras, or other persons having the care of the vaults and graves in the undermentioned burial-ground, has made a representation, stating that he is of opinion that, for the protection of the public health, an Order should be made for the adoption of the measures which are hereinafter set forth ;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the churchwardens of the parish of St. Pancras, do adopt, or cause to be adopted, the following measures, in the undermentioned burial-ground, viz. :—

That the entire surface of the **WHITFIELD CHAPEL BURIAL-GROUND**, Tottenham Court-road, in the parish of St. Pancras, excepting such portion as may be occupied by paths or by the covering of vaults, or by grave-stones, or monuments above the present level, respectively, be properly levelled and covered with fresh earth, on which a living vegetation shall be hereafter maintained, and that where necessary such paths be raised ; and that the fencing be repaired and maintained in proper order ; and that the churchwardens, or any persons employed by them, shall, at all reasonable times, have free access to the said burial-ground from the public road, for the purpose of executing the works hereby directed to be done, and for maintaining hereafter such living vegetation and fencing.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit ;

And whereas certain Orders in Council have been made, directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards and burial grounds hereinafter mentioned, from the time specified in such Orders ; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards and burial-grounds be postponed ;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is

hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards and burial-grounds be postponed as follows; viz.:

In Saint John's Churchyard, and in the Methodist New Connexion Chapelyard, Dukinfield, to the first of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

In the Churchyard, and in the Independent Chapel Burial-ground, Chipping Ongar, to the thirtieth of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, burials were, with certain exceptions, directed to be discontinued in the Parish Churchyard, in the Independent Burial-ground, in Saint John's Churchyard, and in Saint James's Churchyard, Wednesbury; and whereas it seems fit that the said Order be varied:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order of the twenty-fourth of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, be varied by the substitution, in the fifth and sixth, and in the eighteenth, nineteenth, and twentieth lines of that portion of the Order relating to burials in Wednesbury, of the words, "except in vaults and walled graves which can be formed and opened without," instead of the words "except in now existing vaults and walled graves which can be opened without."

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representations, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the under-mentioned parishes of *Batcombe*, *Brize Norton*, and *Hounslow*, without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that interments in the undermentioned parishes should be discontinued, with the following modifications; viz.:

BATCOMBE, SOMERSET.—Forthwith, in the church (reserving, however, to Mrs. Ernst the right of burial for *herself only* in her family vault), and in the churchyard, except in now existing vaults and walled graves in which each coffin shall be separately enclosed by stone or brickwork, properly cemented, and, except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of four and a half feet without exposing coffins or disturbing remains.

BRIZE NORTON.—In the church, forthwith, and in the churchyard from and after the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

HOUNSLOW.—Wholly, forthwith, in the church, and also in the churchyard, from and after the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, except in then existing vaults and walled graves, and in family earthen graves which can be opened at least five feet deep without exposing coffins or disturbing remains, and, in the meantime, no vault or walled grave to be made except in ground not previously used for burial; and all coffins buried in vaults or walled graves to be embedded in charcoal and separately enclosed by brick or stonework properly cemented.

BERKELEY.—In the old part of the churchyard, on the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal, and separately entombed in brick or stonework, properly cemented.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the third day of July next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said third day of July.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of the Commercial Treaty recently concluded between France and Sweden and Norway, together with a copy of the Tariffs of Import Duties into Sweden and Norway annexed to the Treaty, and of which Tariffs (which also apply to the same articles of British produce or manufacture) the following is a translation :—

DUTIES ON IMPORTS INTO SWEDEN.

THE conversion into French unities of the monies, weights, and measures of Sweden and Norway although intended to facilitate commercial operations, has not an official character. They are established upon the following bases :—
