TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM TO BE HELD, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY BY HER ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCESS HELENA, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Princess.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen,

for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Princess.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance upon the Ladies of their families.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

The Queen has been pleased to appoint Robert Rawlinson, Esq., John Thornhill Harrison, Esq., and John Thomas Way, Esq., to be Her Majesty's Commissioners for the purpose of inquiring how far the present use of rivers or running waters in England for the purpose of carrying off the sewage of towns and populous places and the refuse arising from industrial processes and manufactures can be prevented without risk to the public health or serious injury to such processes and manufactures, and how far such sewage and refuse can be utilized or got rid of otherwise than by dischage into rivers or running waters or rendered harmless before reaching them; and also for the purpose of inquiring into the effect on the drainage of lands and inhabited places, of obstructions to the natural flow of rivers or streams caused by mills, weirs, locks, and other navigation works, and into the best means of remedying any evils thence arising.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Washington, enclosing a copy of the following Proclamation issued by the President of the United States, relative to the opening of the ports of the Southern States to foreign commerce:—

OFFICIAL.

Department of State.

By the President of the United States of America.

A PROCLAMATION.

Whereas, by the Proclamation of the President of the 11th day of April last, certain ports of the United States therein specified, which had previously been subject to blockade; were, for objects of public safety, declared, in conformity with previous special legislation of Congress, to be closed against foreign commerce during the national will, to be thereafter expressed and made known by the President; and whereas events and circumstances have since occurred which, in my judgment, render it expedient to remove that restriction, except as to the ports of Galveston, La Selle, Brazos de Santiago (Point Isabel), and Brownsville, in the State of Texas.

Now, therefore, be it known, that I, Andrew Johnson, President of the United States, do hereby declare that the ports aforesaid not excepted as above shall be open to foreign commerce from and after the 1st day of July next; that commercial intercourse with the said ports may, from that time, be carried on, subject to the laws of the United States, and in pursuance of such regulations as may be prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury. If, however, any vessel from a foreign port shall enter any of the before-named excepted ports in the State of Texas, she will continue to be held liable to the penalties prescribed by the Act of Congress approved on the 13th day of July, 1861, and the persons on board of her to such penalties as may be incurred, pursuant to the laws of war, for trading or attempting to trade with an enemy.

And I, Andrew Johnson, President of the United States, do hereby declare and make known that the United States of America do henceforth disallow to all persons trading, or attempting to trade, in any ports of the United States in violation of the laws thereof, all pretence of belligerent rights and privileges; and I give notice, that from the date of this Proclamation, all such offenders will be held and dealt with as pirates.

It is also ordered, that all restrictions upon trade heretofore imposed in the territory of the United States east of the Mississippi River, save those relating to contraband of war, to the reservation of the rights of the United States to property purchased in the territory of an enemy, and to the 25 per cent. upon purchasers of cotton, are removed. All provisions of the internal revenue law will be carried into effect under the proper officers.

TROWBRIDGE, WILTSHIRE.

WHEREAS notice, in writing, was duly given to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the Local Government Act, 1858, had been adopted by the parish of Trow-bridge, in the county of Wilts; and whereas appeal has been duly made to me, under the provisions of the said Act, by owners and ratepayers in the said parish, against the said vote of adoption, and praying that a certain portion of such parish, that is to say, the tithing of Staverton, should be excluded from the operation of the said Act. Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, after inquiry and report as to the circumstances of the case, made to me by Robert Morgan, Esquire, the Inspector appointed for the purpose, do hereby, under the provisions of the said Act, issue the following Order, and do determine the questions arising on such appeal as follows :-

That it is expedient that the Local Government Act, 1858, should be adopted by the parish of Trowbridge aforesaid, excluding from the operation of such Act all those portions of the tithing of Staverton which lie between the Kennet and Avon Canal and the River Avon; and that all parts of such tithing lying south of the said canal form part of, and be comprised in, the district of the Trowbridge Local Board.

And I do hereby further order, that the Local Government Act, 1858, do come into force from and after the 30th day of June, 1865, within the Trowbridge Local Board District, as settled by this Order.
