THE Queen, as Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been graciously pleased by letters patent under Her Royal Sign Manual and the Great Seal of the Order, bearing date this day, to dispense with all the Statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to installation, and to give and grant unto His Royal Highness The Grand Duke of Hesse, Knight of the said Most Noble Order, and invested with the Ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the said Most Noble Order of the Garter, in as full and ample a manner as if he had been formally installed, any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the order of the President, and as a means required by the public safety, directions were issued from this Department, under date of the 17th of December, 1864, requiring passports from all travellers entering the United States, except immigrant passengers directly entering an American port from a foreign country; and whereas, the necessities, which required the adoption of that measure, are believed

no longer to exist, now, therefore, the President directs that, from and after this date, the order above referred to shall be, and the same is hereby rescinded.

Nothing in this regulation, however, will be construed to relieve from due accountability any enemies of the United States or offenders against their peace and dignity, who may hereafter seek to enter the country, or at any time be found within its lawful jurisdiction.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other*

Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to authorize the alteration of the time for holding statutory meetings of Commissioners of Supply in Scotland.

An Act for facilitating the annexation of tithes to district churches.

An Act to authorize the inclosure of certain lands in pursuance of a report of the Inclosure Commissioners for England and Wales.

An Act to extend to the Court of Chancery of the county palatine of Lancaster certain of the provisions of an Act passed in the session holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to give to trustees, mortgagees, and others, certain powers now commonly inserted in settlements, mortgagees, and wills."

An Act to provide for the security of property of married women separated from their husbands in Ireland.

An Act for confirming a provisional order made by the Board of Trade under "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," relating to the pilotage of the River Tyne.

An Act to provide for the collection by means of Stamps of fees payable in the Superior Courts of Law at Westminster, and in the offices belonging thereto.

An Act to confirm certain provisional orders under "The Local Government Act, 1858," relating to the districts of Sheffield, Bradford, and Gloucester.

An Act for regulating the keeping of dogs and for the protection of sheep and other property from dogs in Ireland.

An Act to enable the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Works and Public Buildings to acquire a site for the erection and concentration of Courts of Justice, and of the various offices belonging to the same.

An Act to supply means towards defraying the expenses of providing Courts of Justice and the various offices belonging thereto; and for other purposes.

An Act to suspend the making of lists and the ballots for the Militia of the United Kingdom.

An Act to defray the Charge of the pay, clothing, and contingent and other expenses of the disembodied Militia in Great Britain and Ireland; to grant allowances in certain cases to Subaltern Officers, Adjutants, Paymasters, Quartermasters, Surgeons, Assistant Surgeons, and Surgeons Mates of the militia; and to authorize the employment of the non-commissioned officers.

An Act to authorize the Liverpool United Gaslight Company to increase their capital, and to purchase additional lands; and for other purposes.

An Act to enable the Weald of Kent Railway Company to make a deviation of their authorized line of railway; and for other purposes.

OVENDEN.—WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, after inquiry and report as to the circumstances of the case, made to me by Robert Morgan, Esquire, the Inspector appointed for the purpose, do hereby, under the provisions of the said Act, issue the following Order, and do determine the questions arising on such appeal as follows;

That it is expedient that the Local Government Act, 1858, should be adopted by the township of Ovenden aforesaid, excluding from the operation of such Act all that portion thereof outside of and adjoining to the Old Borough that lies within a boundary or line commencing at and including Old-lane Bridge on the Ovenden Brook; thence for a distance of three hundred and eight yards up the centre of Ovenden Brook; and thence westwardly, by the northerly fence of a close of land adjoining Shaw-lane, called The Holme; thence into and including the following lanes, Shaw-lane and Nursery-lane, across the Halifax and Keighley turnpike-road, by Nursery-lane, to Wheatley-lane Ends; thence by Scarr Wood-road to Wheatley Bottoms; and thence along the highway leading to the bridge over the Hebble Brook, at the bottom of Wood-lane; thence up Wood-lane to Doctor Hill-lane Bottom; thence south-westward by the fence-wall immediately opposite Wood-lane Top to Moor End-road; and thence northward along that road for a distance of thirty-three yards; and thence westward by private occupation-road leading to the Vicar's allotments; and thence south-westwardly by the fence-wall westward of that occupation-road in a straight line to the boundary between the townships of Ovenden and Warley; and thence eastward by that boundary to where that boundary meets the boundary of the Old Borough; thence by the Old Borough

boundary to the boundary of the township of Skircoat. And I do hereby further order that the Local Government Act, 1858, do come into force from and after the 15th day of July, 1865, within the township of Ovenden, exclusive of the portion hereinbefore described.
