LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY NORMANBY, NORTH RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

WHEREAS a resolution for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, has been passed by such portion of the township of Normanby, in the parish of Ormesby, in the North Riding of the county of York, as is not included within the boundaries of the borough of Middlesbrough, the said portion of such township being a place with a population of less than 3,000 by the last census; and whereas it has appeared to me, that, by reason of special circumstances, it is expedient that the said portion of such township shall be allowed to adopt the said Act, I do hereby approve of such adoption, and I do hereby further order that the Local Government Act, 1858, do come into force within such portion of such township of Normanby as is not comprised within the boundaries of the said borough of Middlesbrough, from and after the 30th day of September, 1865.

Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.
