Revolving Light on Egg Island.

INFORMATION has been received at the Admiralty, that on and after the 5th day of November, 1865, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Egg Island, south-east coast of Nova Scotia.

The light will be a revolving light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, showing alternately white and red faces. It is placed at an

elevation of 85 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of about 15 miles.

The tower is 53 feet high from base to vane, and stands about 12 yards S.E. of the keeper's dwelling, in lat. 44° 39' 51" N., long. 62° 51' 32" West of Greenwich.

The tower is 31 feet high, and rises from the centre of the keeper's dwelling, in lat. 43° 48' 31" N., long. 64° 47' 15" West of Greenwich.

INCOME TAX.
