NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 53.)—BLACK SEA.

Fixed Lights in the River Búg.

THE Imperial Ministry of Marine at St. Petersburg has given notice, that two *fixed white* lights have been established in the River Búg; one at the extreme of the Russkaia Spit, on the left bank of the river near Sviatotoitski village, and the other on the right bank of the river, under the first ravine north of the Voloiskaia Spit.

The Sviatotoitski light is elevated 33 feet above the sea, and visible between the bearings of North and N. by E. The illuminating apparatus

is dioptric or by lenses, of the 4th order. The lighthouse is iron, and painted black.

The Voloiskaia light is elevated 69 feet, and visible between the bearings of N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. and W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., its limits passing a cable from the sandbanks bordering the elbows of the Russkaia and Voloiskaia Spits. The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the 4th order. The light is shown from a window at the angle of a house, in lat. $46^{\circ} 44' 30''$ N., long. $31^{\circ} 53' 40''$ East of Greenwich.

Vessels entering the Búg should keep within the limits of Sviatotoitski light until Voloiskaia light is seen; they will thus avoid the banks extending from both sides the river. By keeping within the limits of the latter light, they will avoid the Russkaia and Voloiskaia Spits.

SEA OF AZOV.

Fixed Light at Berdiansk:

Also, that a *fixed white* light is exhibited at an elevation of 15 feet above the sea, from the extremity of the breakwater at Berdiansk, on the north shore of the Sea of Azov.

The breakwater extends into the sea to the depth of 14 feet water. If, during heavy gales, the force of the sea prevents this light from being exhibited, there will be *two fixed white vertical* lights shown, one 13, the other 10 feet above the sea, from a vessel moored inside the middle part of the breakwater, and about 35 yards from the shore.
