

license no case of cattle plague had existed on the respective farms on which such animals as named in this proviso had been kept, and upon production of a written consent from the owner of such bull or boar.

4. By license first obtained from a Justice qualified as last aforesaid, any fat animals as aforesaid may be removed from place to place within the said county upon proof to the satisfaction of such Justice that for twenty-eight days previous to such removal no case of cattle plague had existed on the farm or premises from which such removal was desired; such license shall state the places from and to which such removal is desired, the route to be taken, and the time, not exceeding two days, during which such license shall be valid; and every such fat animal, if of the cattle tribe, shall, before its removal, be conspicuously marked, videlicet, by clipping off all the hair at the end of the tail, and with the letter X on the near hip; and every such fat animal for which such license is obtained shall be slaughtered within four days after such removal.
5. Every such license as aforesaid shall, during the removal of such animal or article as aforesaid respectively, be carried by the person in charge of the animal or article removed, and such person shall be bound to produce such license on demand made by any Inspector of Cattle, Police Supervisor, Parish Constable, or other person, and the owner of such animal or article shall be responsible for the fulfilment of this condition.

And notice is hereby given, that every person offending against the terms of these orders is liable to a penalty of £20 for every such animal or article so unlawfully dealt with; and in compliance with the provision contained in the Act 11 & 12 Vict. c. 107, one half of all penalties and forfeitures recovered under the Act will be paid to the person who shall sue or proceed for the same.

THE CATTLE PLAGUE.

The County of Hertford, to wit.

ORDER.

At the General Quarter Session of the Peace and Gaol Delivery of our Sovereign Lady the Queen, holden at Hertford, in and for the county of Hertford, on Monday, the 1st day of January, in the 29th year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, and in the year of our Lord, 1866, and continued thence by several adjournments to, and holden at, the same place on Saturday, the 3rd day of February, in the year aforesaid, before the Most Honourable James Brownlow, William Gascoyne, Marquess of Salisbury, K.G., William Parker, Esq., Baron Dimsdale, and others, their fellows Justices of our said Lady the Queen, appointed to conserve the Peace within the said county, and also to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and misdemeanors committed within the same.

Whereas under or by virtue of Orders by the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1865, the 16th day of December, 1865, and the 20th day of January, 1866, or by some or one of

such Orders, the Justices of the Peace for the said county in General or Quarter Session assembled, are, as the "Local Authority" empowered by notice published in any newspaper circulating within their jurisdiction, to declare that it is expedient that (amongst other things) the articles or things hereinafter specified, shall not be brought from any other part of Great Britain into any place within their jurisdiction, with such exceptions as in the said Order of the 20th January, and hereinafter mentioned, and it is by the same Order declared that it shall not be lawful for any person in contravention of any such notice to bring or send any such articles from any place beyond to any place within such jurisdiction.

Now, therefore, this Court doth declare that it is expedient that the articles hereinafter mentioned shall not be brought from any other part of Great Britain into any place within the jurisdiction aforesaid, with such exceptions as hereinafter mentioned.

And further, this Court doth order and direct as follows:—

1. It shall not be lawful for any person to bring or send any raw or untanned hides or skins, or the horns or hoofs, or the offal, of any cow, heifer, bull, bullock, ox, calf, sheep, lamb, or goat, or the hides or skins of any swine, or any dung, or any litter likely to propagate infection, from any place in Great Britain beyond the aforesaid jurisdiction, into any place within such jurisdiction.

2. The following articles are excepted out of this order:—

- A. Articles of the description aforesaid sent or carried by railway through the jurisdiction aforesaid.

- B. Articles of the description aforesaid, brought or sent with the license of any two Justices acting in and for the aforesaid jurisdiction, by any person from any land and premises in his own occupation and beyond such jurisdiction, to any other land or premises in his own occupation within such jurisdiction, during a time to be specified in such license.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 10th day of February inst., and shall be in force until the 1st day of March next.

Notice is hereby given, that any person offending against this Order will for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £20, which the Justices before whom he or she shall be convicted of such offence may think fit to impose.

CATTLE PLAGUE.

Borough of Welchpool, in the County of Montgomery.

WHEREAS by an Order under my hand, dated the 24th day of January, 1866, I, the undersigned, Thomas Jones, Esquire, Mayor of the said borough, did prohibit the removal of any cow, heifer, bull, bullock, ox, calf, sheep, or swine, to any market or fair within the said borough from any part of Great Britain (except from any other part of the said county of Montgomery), with a view to prevent the spreading of the disorder designated as the "Cattle Plague," do hereby confirm the said order; and in addition to the said order, and by this notice, do declare, that from and after the 2nd day of February instant, and until the 1st day of March next, no raw or untanned hides
