LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY THE CHAPELRY DISTRICT OF SAINT JOHN THE EVANGELIST, FARSLEY, YORKSHIRE.

WHEREAS notice, in writing, was duly given to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the Local Government Act, 1858, had been adopted by the chapelry district of Saint John the Evangelist, Farsley, in the township of Calverley with Farsley, in the county of York; and whereas appeals have been duly made to me, under the provisions of the said Act, by owners and ratepayers of such district, against the said vote of adoption, and praying that if such Act be adopted, the boundaries of the district should be altered. Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as aforesaid, after inquiry and report as to the circumstances of the case, made to me by Robert Morgan, Esquire, the Inspector appointed for the purpose, do hereby, under the provisions of the said Act, issue the following Order, and do determine the questions arising on such appeals as follows:—

That the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted by the chapelry district of Saint John the Evangelist, Farsley aforesaid, and that the said appeals be dismissed; and I do hereby further order, that the said Local Government Act, 1858, do come into force from and after the 15th day of March, 1866, within the aforesaid chapelry district.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty, cap. 45, entitled "An Act to provide for the Collection by means of Stamps, of Fees payable in the Superior Courts of Law at Westminster, and in the Offices belonging thereto," it is provided by the third section thereof, that the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, with the concurrence of the Lords Chief Justices and of the Lord Chief Baron, may, from time to time, make such rules as seem fit for regulating the use of these stamps under this Act, and particularly for prescribing the application thereof to documents from time to time in use or required to be used for the purpose of such stamps, and for insuring the proper cancellation of adhesive stamps and keeping account of such stamps.
