LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY HAYLE, IN THE COUNTY OF CORNWALL.

WHEREAS appeal, under the Local Government Act, 1858, has been duly made to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from the district of Hayle (in the parishes of Phillack and St. Erth, in the county of Cornwall), within the boundaries of such district, as settled for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858, setting forth grounds on which the appellants dispute the expediency of the adoption of such Act by the said district, and praying for the exclusion of such district from the operation of the said Act. And whereas inquiry has been duly directed and made by Mr. Arnold Taylor, the Inspector appointed by me for the purpose, and the result thereof reported to me:

Now, therefore, I do issue the following order, and do determine the question arising on such appeal, as follows:

That, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Local Government Act, 1858, I do hereby dismiss the said appeal; and do further order that the said Act come into operation in the aforesaid district of Hayle from and after the 26th day of March, 1866.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF PARTS OF ACTS BY THE BOROUGH OF LIVERPOOL.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Liverpool, acting under and by virtue of the Liverpool Sanitary Acts of 1846 and 1854, did, on the 14th day of February, 1866, adopt various parts, sections, and provisions of the Public Health Act, 1848, the Local Government Act, 1858, and the Local Government Act (1858) Amendment Act, 1861, within their district, that is to say, sections 64 and 76 of the Public Health Act, 1848; sections 51 and 62 of the Local Government Act, 1858; and sections 14 and 28 of the Local Government Act (1858) Amendment Act (1861).

And whereas notice of such adoption of the said portions of those Acts has been duly given in writing to me as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby give notice, that the hereinbefore described portions of the said several recited Acts have been duly adopted within the aforesaid borough of Liverpool, and that in accordance with the Local Government Act, 1858, the said portions of the hereinbefore recited Acts will, from the date of
