

offal or dung of any such animals, and no litter, or straw or hay which has been used for litter, of such animals shall be moved from place to place within the jurisdiction of the said Local Authority, except under the following conditions, viz.:—

Notwithstanding this notice, any cow, heifer, bull, bullock, ox, or calf, and any raw or untanned hides or skins, and any horns or hoofs, offal, or dung of any such animals, and any litter or straw or hay that has been used for litter, of such animals may be moved from place to place within the jurisdiction of the said Local Authority or to the confines of the said jurisdiction: provided that the owner or occupant of the farm or premises from which the removal is to take place shall, within three days prior to removal, make a declaration (in the form prescribed as relative hereto) in presence of and to be countersigned by a member of the Local Authority or of the District Committee (the person so countersigning not having any interest in the animal or article to be removed, and not being the owner or occupant either of the farm or premises from which the removal is to be made, or of the farm or premises to which the removal is to be made), to the effect that no cattle plague has existed during the two months immediately preceding the date of said declaration on the farm or premises from which the removal is to take place: provided further that the said declaration shall be made in duplicate, of which one copy shall be delivered at the nearest county police station at least twenty-four hours previous to any such removal, and the other copy shall be retained by the person in charge of the removal: and provided further that no animal (alive or dead), and no article above enumerated, shall be so removed by railway, nor unless it shall have been at the place from which it is to be removed for at least 30 days previous to removal: and provided further that no animal or article so removed (except in the case of a cow taken to the bull) shall be removed again until the expiry of 30 days after the date of the first removal.

As regards removal for Exhibition or Sale.

3. That until this notice is altered or revoked no cow, heifer, bull, bullock, ox, or calf, and no sheep, lamb, goat, or swine, shall be removed from any place within the jurisdiction of the said Local Authority to any other place within the said jurisdiction for the purpose of being exhibited or sold within the said jurisdiction.

All previous notices issued by the said Justices of the Peace, and by the said Local Authority, are hereby cancelled, except so far as they are in conformity with the alterations above resolved on.

Every person offending against this notice is liable to be prosecuted for a penalty in terms of the Act.

The forms to be used for removals in terms of this notice will be found at any of the County Police Stations; and at the Office of the Chief Constable, County Rooms, Edinburgh; and at the Chambers of the Clerk of Supply, 4, Thistle Court, Edinburgh.
