Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of vestry or other meetings in churches, and for regulating the appointment of vestry clerks," as relates to the providing of a room or suitable building for the purpose of holding vestry meetings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to, the said parish of Saint Margaret, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said parish.

ARTICLE II.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

North Aylesford Union.—Parish of Northfleet.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Northfleet, in the County of Kent;

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the Division or Divisions in which the said Parish is situate;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Northfleet, in the county of Kent, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas, at a meeting of the Vestry, held at the Vestry Room of the church of the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 1st day of March instant, it was resolved:—

"That the Poor Law Board be requested to
"issue an Order under their seal of office,
"directing that the Act passed on the 5th
"day of August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict.,
"c. 57), entitled 'An Act to prevent the
"holding of vestry or other meetings in
"churches, and for regulating the appoint-
"ment of vestry clerks,' shall be applied
"and put in force within this parish, as
"regards that portion of it only which
"relates to the appointment of a vestry
"clerk."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows; that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty as relates to the appointment of a vestry clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Northfleet.

ARTICLE II.—That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall, until the Poor Law Board shall otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of vestry clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of thirty pounds per annum.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such vestry clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual Feast Days in the year, namely, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, and Christmas Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

ARTICLE IV.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
