 ved here Yefterday，with a Squadron of his Majefties Ships， from Mefinay；they were faluted here with the difcharge of a 100 Guns．＇Here is likewife annived the Cromen Frigat，having on Board the Lord Chandots，his Majefties Ambaflador teturning from Conjtantizople．Abour three days fince the Smyraz Mer－ chant came hither，in 36 days from Smyman ；the Matter where－ of reports，that it was there fpoker of，with alurance，That Sultan Hanomat cither had or would lofe his Life，fo violent－ ly were the Soldies animated tgainft him．
Venue，fanumy 3．By a ship，lately arrived，we have Letters of the 18 th of Diccmber，from Curfiantineople，which mention，that the Quefition had been put to the Mutti，Whether Mahomets Lefe ought to be Jotred！And that he had anfwered， That thoy inght for＇to foucio bis Pafor，fince be bes formerty been bhated with Succefs agata／t the Unitelievers；and that the late Misfortunes were to be coek＇d apon as $7 x d g$ mokets frem Fieaven， 2phach no Mane bars the power to preverut，or cougbt to be accourntoble jor．But by a Saique that faild from Conffantimopte，five days after the other，there is Advice dent from Singrat，That Ma－ homet and his Eldeft Son，were both itrangled，but this will need condirmation．It is not doubted but tief New Vilier en－ tred Coightantinoph，the nith of December，with about 7000 Men ；that the Army had 1 cceived three of the five Payments they were in arrear，and were promifed the reit withon few days．That the Money．was noft rais＇d out of the Confifia－ tions of the Great Men：That the Inauguration Ceremony， which conlitted only in Girting the Grand Signior wift a Sword at the Mofque of 9 tut，would be pertormed＇on the zith of Decembetr．

Vienn，Fanunry 4．Yefterday the Hungarian Prifo－ ner（ named Butterthadiy）was examined before Count Forger，Governor of this City，and the Council of tower Aliftrat ；it is not hnown what then puifled，though it is not doubted but this was one of the Perfons who had acculed Pruse Hemata of Badon，and fince dechared by what means he was wrought on to do it，charging Geckii and Commendams（the filt of which had becen an whe Techelite，and obraind hiz Pardon upon Preance of his Difcoven ies，to have tanperd with him by Fheats and

Whants to own that he hiad carried Letters from Pance Herman to Teckeley；and to，affirm，what Geczit had be－ fore doclased in that matter；which，though at the fut propofing of it，be denied to have any Truthen it， 9 es being terrified with the Rack，and the Examples of fome that underwent it，he dew up fuch a Gonfeifion，as bad been directed，which was main alter＇d and corrected by Gectit，and when it was fo yminded，he bad been pre－ vatled with to confirm it with an Oath，but the Tor－ tue be fo diflonefty would have avotudg he had fince，fornd within his own Breaft in thore checks of Conicience，which gave him no refite till he had disburthened himifelf by a voluntary Acknowledgnext of his Guilt and Perjury，which he did with the fift opportunty he met with．We do not find that this is any hindrance，but that Prince fierman is ma－ king his Preparations for his．Journey to Ratisbonne； where he is expected to fupply the place of Firft Com－ aillioner．We hear that $20^{\circ} 00$ Men are put into Agria， and that the Plunder lof the Town was given to the Sol－ diersat their fint entrance，which was of no great Benefte to them，＇or there was nothing to be met with there， tout me，P Poverty，the Garifon having carried away witt them what was of any value；what Money the Turks hat
 nifhing themelves with Proy：hons；yet many of them funk and died by the way，whether it were that their liberal Feeding，after fo jong a refraint，were grown as dange－－ rovs as their fpare piet，of that they were grown feeble paft recruiting：They lett about 180 obebide them．fick in the Towns and there aie many thoufands of them fadid to have died during the＇Bluckade．The Govemor of Paiotta batli reprefented to the Emperors，That he is cer－ tanly informed that there is great farcity in Alba Regalis， and befide that the Soldiers are almoft naked，their Cloaths being worn out，and no neans of new Supplies， to that if they were but clofely prefs＇t，there is great probability that they would follow the Example of Agria； and therefore defices that the Regiments fent from thence for the Guard at Prestung，might have Orders to march back upon the removal of the Court to Vienna；and it is believed there will be Orders cent at the fame time to Bombard that place to furnifh them with a more plauti－ ble excufe for their Surrender．Publication thas been made in Schavonia td invite all the old Iuhabitants（who are fled）to return to their Dwellings，upon Promifes of fecuring then in their Poffefions，and protecting their Perfons；upon which many are gome back，and employ themfelves in cultivating their Lands．The Cantons of Daxva and Leptovitz in Iranfivazha，having made complaint to the Emperor of the oppeffive Ex－ actions and other Irregularities committed by the Troops in their Quarters anonglt them；ftrict Orders have been fent to the Officers commanding there；to re－ quire theire maintaining of Militay Difcipline，and to fuffer： nomove to be extarted from the Inhabitants than their Capitulation obliges then to pay：And it is faid，that Count Cataffagoes thither with particular Inftructions in this matter；who will pals by Mongat？to examine and report what may be clonte for the maie fueedy ie－ ducideg of that place．The Emperor has row con－
cluded and enfied into Artictes with feveral Puirces and States, for furrifhing Men this next Campagnes, upon thefe Terms, That 17 Rixdollers fall be paid for each Foot Soldier, one halif hy advance, and the other Moiety when half the number of Men agreed for thall be fent to Agria (which is the place of general Redezvous appointed for the Recruits') that every Pripe defray his Men thither; that theife be not fent fewer thah Ioo Men at one time: And that to every 600 Men there beallow'd one Cuptain, two Litentenants, and three Enfigns. That the new Levies be all fent before the end of March, who are upon their "arrival to be cloathed and paid on the fime toot with the Imperial Reginnents.
Cologne, yamiany 7 , Yefterday the Count de Caunitz appared with thic Charaeter of Envoy 'frem the Eutperors, (which he 'had not "ewned hefore)' in' an. Audience before the Grang Chapter ho tud open the subject or his Commemifon, which was to ilinade theni from proceeding to the Election of the
 Apoftolick Nuteios had, by Orders' fon the Pope, omployed
 purriag of thic Choice to a fiurther day, "reprefenting, That what inouid be donie hafein, would not be valid, wirhour Leave firtt obtain'd from his Holinefs: But none of the Reafons offer'd prevalid eidyr with thie one or the other, for thifo day being aliembied, awording tof thieir former Order; the Chapter imanimoully Elected the Cardinal for Coadjutor. There are 22 Cannors belonging to the Cathedual, but there were ofly 19 prefert, of dilwhich there was nor one dilienting Voice: Ahd phere was a Moicenger immediately dirpatched to Bon to, give the Elector Notice of the Choisc. Some few cays before, the Bifhop of Bre haid and Count Cosingefec, had pretented to the Funco their Proteffation and Appead, againft the intended EleCtion, which was according'y rectived in order to tranfriit the fame to Rome.

Paris, Janiuary 14. Here"are lately arrived Two Extraordinary Couriers from Rome, who parced both from thence the fame day on the 26 'th' $^{\prime}$ of December'; the Firft with Advice, That on Chrifmas Eve, the 'Marquis of Lavardin, in the manner ufed by all former Ambafiadors, had, with his whole Family, been at his-Devotions at Midnight-Mafs, at the Church ot st. Lewis. Ande the other brought an account, That on the fame 26 of of December, was foupd affixed bo that Church this Sentas tence of Interdift.

BThe Apofolical Authority, and the Special Command of our Holy Lord the Pope, tbe Parzfb Church of st. Lewis is acciored to be under an Eccigfiaflecal Interdsct, for that the ReFiver, Officialss anid Members of the Jaid Charch, bawe rafbly profurnd, on the Eqe of the Nativity of our Lord Jefus Chrift, io admitt to Divine service, and the Participation of the Sax critments, Henry de Beaumanoir, Marquis of Lavardm, who is Notorioufly Excommunicated.
