LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ORDER APPROVING ADOPTION OF ACT BY MEXBOROUGH (TOWNSHIP), WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

WHEREAS a resolution for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, was, on the 26th day of April, 1866, passed by the township of Mexborough, in the parish of Mexborough, in the Lower Division of Strafforth and Tickhill, in the West Riding of the county of York, the said township being a place with a population of less than 3,000 by the last census; and whereas it has appeared to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, by reason of the special circumstances, it is expedient that the said township should be allowed to adopt the said Act, I do hereby approve of such adoption by the township of Mexborough aforesaid.
