The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared, and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventh day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of certain benefices between the Archbishop of York and the Right Honorable William Henry Forester Denison, Baron Londesborough, and the trustees of his family settled estates.

"Whereas the Right Honorable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, is seized in fee in right of his see of the advowson of the Vicarage of Kirkby Wharfe, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York.

"And whereas the advowson of each of the benefices next hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, of the perpetual curacy of Selby, of the vicarage of Seamer, with the chapelries of Cayton and East Ayton, and of the vicarage of Brayton, all in the said county of York, and in the diocese of York, is now legally vested in the said William Henry Forester Denison, Baron Londesborough, for his life, with remainder over to his first and other sons in tail male, with remainders over, under, and by virtue of the last will and testament of William Joseph Denison, late of Denbies, in the county of Surrey, Esquire, now deceased, in which will is contained, amongst other things, a power for the trustees or trustee, for the time being, of the same will, at any time or times after the decease of him the said William Joseph Denison, at the request and by the direction, in

writing, of the person or persons who under the limitations of the said will should be tenant for life, in possession of the manors and other hereditaments thereby devised and directed to be purchased, to make sale of or to convey in exchange for other hereditaments, to be situate somewhere in Great Britain, all or any part of the said manors and other hereditaments thereby devised and directed to be purchased, and the inheritance thereof, in fee-simple or otherwise, for such price or prices in money, or for such equivalent in manors, messuages, lands, or other hereditaments, as to them, the said trustees or trustee, should seem reasonable.

"And whereas the Right Honorable William Meredyth, Baron Athlumney, the Most Honorable Francis Nathaniel, Marquis Conyngham, and John Pemberton Heywood, of Connaught-place, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, are the present trustees of the said will of the said William Joseph Denison, deceased.

"And whereas the said William, Archbishop of York, the said William Henry Forester Denison, Baron Londesborough, and the said William Meredyth, Baron Athlumney, Francis Nathaniel, Marquis Conyngham, and John Pemberton Heywood, have signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said several benefices may be exchanged as hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances of the proposed exchange and the relative values of the said benefices and patronage, and we do hereby certify to your Majesty that the values of the said benefices respectively are as set forth in the two parts of the schedule hereto annexed.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York, as patron in right of his see of the vicarage of Kirkby Wharfe aforesaid, and with the consent of the said William Henry Forester Denison, Baron Londesborough, as such patron as aforesaid of the benefices secondly hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say, of the perpetual curacy of Selby, of the vicarage of Seamer with the chapelries of Cayton and East Ayton, and of the vicarage of Brayton, and with the consents of the said William Meredyth, Baron Athlumney, Francis Nathaniel, Marquis Conyngham, and John Pemberton Heywood (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme), we humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette

of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the advowson of the said vicarage of Kirkby Wharfe aforesaid shall be transferred from the said William, Archbishop of York, and from his successors Archbishops of York, and shall go, remain, and be to the uses, upon and for the trusts, intents, and purposes, and with, under, and subject to the powers, provisoes, and declarations in and by the said will of the said William Joseph Denison, deceased, limited, expressed, declared and contained, of and concerning the freehold hereditaments thereby devised and directed to be purchased as aforesaid, and so and in such manner as if the advowson of the said vicarage of Kirkby Wharfe had been devised by the said will, and had been originally subject to the limitations thereof; and that in exchange for the same, the advowsons of the said several benefices secondly hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say, of the perpetual curacy of Selby, of the vicarage of

Seamer with the chapelries of Cayton and East Ayton, and of the vicarage of Brayton, shall, and the advowson of each and every of them shall, upon and from the said day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid, be transferred from the said William Henry Forester Denison, Baron Londesborough, and his first and other sons in tail male, and the person or persons who shall or otherwise would be entitled thereto under or by virtue of the said will of the said William Joseph Denison, deceased, and shall become and be vested in the said William, Archbishop of York, and his successors, Archbishops of York, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-

six, in the words and figure following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, and out of the new parish of Saint Philip, Bethnal-green, in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, and of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Bethnal-green, hereinafter mentioned and described (such portions not at present containing within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship), should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, have become vested in us under the provisions of, and for the purposes of, the herein-mentioned Acts.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honorable and Right Reverend Archibald Campbell, Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we humbly recommend and propose, that all those several portions of the said parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, and of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Bethnal-green, which are respectively mentioned and described in the schedule hereunder written, and which are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of The Holy Trinity, Shoreditch.'

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the provisions of the herein secondly-mentioned Act, the sum of two hundred pounds, and that, so soon as a church shall have been erected within such district, and shall have been approved by us and consecrated as the church of such district, and for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the further sum of one hundred pounds, making in the whole the sum of three hundred pounds; and that the said sums of two hundred pounds or three hundred pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of the consecration of such

church as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May, or the first day of November, the amount then next thereafter payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish; provided always, that if it shall appear to us to be expedient at any future time, that instead of the annual sum then in course of payment by us to the minister or perpetual curate of the said district or new parish, or instead of any part of such annual sum, any land, tithe, or other hereditament should be conveyed or secured to such minister or perpetual curate and his successors, nothing herein or in any other scheme contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing such a substitution.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of the Holy Trinity, Shoreditch, being:—

"All those portions of the parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, and of the new parish of Saint Philip, Bethnal-green, in the same county and diocese, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, from the new parish of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, in the said county and diocese, at a point in the middle of the High-street, Shoreditch, opposite to the middle of the western end of Swan-yard; and extending thence in a direction generally northward along the middle of the said High-street for a distance of two hundred and eighty yards, or thereabouts, to a point opposite to the middle of the western end of the court called Jane Shore's-court; and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of such court to its eastern extremity; and continuing thence in the same direction along the southern boundary walls of the house situate in Boundary-street, and numbered 6, and similarly numbered on the map hereunto annexed, to a point on the boundary in the middle of the last-named street which divides the said parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, from the new parish of Saint Philip, Bethnal-green aforesaid; and extending thence southward along the last-described boundary, following thereby the middle of Boundary-street aforesaid, as far as a point opposite to the middle of the western end of Half Nichols-street; and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of the last-named street to its intersection by Nichols-row; and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named row to its junction with Church-street; and continuing thence still southward across the last-named street, and to and along the middle of Club-row to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Philip, Bethnal-green, from the new parish of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields aforesaid; and extending thence westward along the last-described boundary, following thereby the

middle of Anchor-street, to the junction of such boundary with the boundary dividing the said parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, from the new parish of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, as aforesaid; and continuing thence still westward along the last-described boundary, following thereby the middle of Swan-yard aforesaid, to the first-described point in the middle of the High-street, Shoreditch, where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act, been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, and of the perpetual curacy of the new parish of Saint Philip, Bethnal-green, respectively, out of which said parish and new parish it is proposed that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas the incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch aforesaid, has taken or made certain objections or observations to or upon the said scheme, which said objections or observations have, together with such scheme, been laid before Her Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said scheme has, notwithstanding the said objections or observations, been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby, appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit;

And whereas Orders in Council have been made, directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyard hereinafter mentioned, from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discon-

tinuing burials in the said churchyard be postponed;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyard be postponed as follows; viz.:

In the churchyard of Petersham, to the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, provided that no new grave be dug in ground which has been already buried in.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish, without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that interments in the same should be discontinued, with the following modifications; viz.:

ERSOM.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church and in the churchyard of the same, except in vaults in which each coffin shall be separately entombed, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of four feet without the exposure of coffins or disturbance of entire bones.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twentieth day of August next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation, one month before the said twentieth day of August.

THE Right Honourable the Board of Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Venice, stating that the Port Lights at Trieste and Venice are to be discontinued until further notice:—

(Translation.)

The Presidency of the Central Maritime Government has the honour to inform the British Consulate, that under the actual circumstances of war, in consequence of a demand of the I. R. Commandant of the Local Division, it was ordered that the lighting of the lantern situated in the Roadstead of Trieste be suspended from this day forward till further orders.

At the same time, the before-named Consulate is informed that, from official communications up to this time received, the lighting of the maritime lighthouses of Capo Compare and Maria Art, in Legna, Punta d'Ostro (South Point), and of Lissa, in Dalmatia, was likewise suspended till further orders.
