In Christ Church Burial Ground, Every-street, Ancoats, Manchester, to the ninth of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, on condition that the regulations prescribed by Orders in Council of the seventh of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and twenty-second of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, relating to this burial ground, be observed under the supervision of the Sanitary Committee of the Town Council of the city.
