Whitehall, August 2, 1866.

THE Queen has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal granting the dignity of a Baron of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland unto the Honourable Edward Gordon Douglas Penrhyn, and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style, and title of Baron Penrhyn, of Llandegai, in the county of Carnarvon.

The Queen has been pleased to appoint George Burnett, Esq., Advocate, to the office of Lyon King of Arms, for that part of the United Kingdom called Scotland.

Foreign Office July 31, 1866.

The Queen has been pleased to approve of M. Albert E. Denso as Consul at Kurrachee for His Majesty the King of Prussia.

The Queen has also been pleased to approve of Mr. Darius B. Warner as Consul at St. John, New Brunswick, and of Mr. Edward Maynard as Consul at Turk's Island, for the United States of America.

Whitehall, July 30, 1866.

The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto George Hampden Cameron, of Hampden, in the county of Buckingham, Esquire, second son of Donald Cameron, of Lochiel, in the county of Inverness, Esquire, deceased, by Catherine Vere Louisa, his wife, sister of George Robert, Earl of Buckinghamshire, Her Royal licence and authority, that he may (in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of his maternal uncle, the said George Robert, Earl of Buckinghamshire) henceforth take and use the surname of Hampden, in addition to and after that of Cameron, and bear the arms of Hampden, quarterly, in the first quarter, with those of Cameron, and that the said surname and arms may, in like

manner, be taken, used, and borne by his issue; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And also to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
