.manuer, be taken, used, and borne by his issue; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence acc permission to be void and of none effect

And also to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
