THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received an announcement to the effect that cargo vessels from England, arriving at Alexandria, even with clean bills of health, must undergo ten days quarantine from the date of their arrival at that port, but that transit passengers and goods go through at once by quarantine trains.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Naples, announcing the imposition by the Health Office of a fifteen days Quarantine upon vessels arriving from any port in Great Britain, which may have left such port subsequently to the 28th July; and further stating, that vessels from the following ports have now to undergo a fifteen days quarantine; that is to say:—

From all ports in Great Britain, Ireland, and the Isle of Man.

Cronstadt, and the neighbourhood.

Stettin.

Stockholm.

Holland.

Belgium.

Ports on the French Coast, from Dunkirk to Nantes, and

All French Ports in the Mediterranean, except Algiers.
