A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 10th day of October, 1866.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT,

Lord President. Mr. Secretary Walpole. Mr. Corry.

HEREAS by an Order, bearing date the 10th day of August last, reciting certain provisions of the statute of the session held in the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty's reign, chapter 107, and that a contagious or infectious disorder, known or described as the Sheep Pox, or Variola Ovina, then prevailed among the sheep, in a certain part of the United Kingdom, and it was expedient to take measures for preventing such disorder from spreading; the Lords of the Council did make certain Orders and Regulations respecting the removal of sheep or lambs to and from the parishes of Great Oakley and Beaumont, in the county of Essex, and respecting other matters relating to such sheep and lambs;

And whereas this Order was to continue in force until revoked, and it is no longer necessary that it should continue in force:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby, from and after the eleventh day of this present October, revoke the Order above mentioned and described.
