WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, bearing date the 24th day of March last, duly issued under the authority of the Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, c. 107, intituled "An Act to prevent, until the 1st day of September, 1850, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," and from time to time continued by divers subsequent Acts, which Order recited that a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated as the "Cattle Plague," prevailed amongst cattle in England and Wales, the Lords of the Council made various regulations for preventing the spread of the cattle plague, and, among other matters, ordered that no market, fair, auction, exhibition, or sale of cattle should be held until the 1st day of June, 1866, except otherwise excepted; and whereas by an Order of the Lords of the Council, bearing date the 26th day of May last, the said regulation was continued until the Lords of the Council should otherwise order:

And whereas it is advisable that the said regulation should be altered as regards the county of Anglesey in the manner hereinafter provided.

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Council do hereby order, that the Local Authority in the county of Anglesey may grant licences for the holding of fairs, whereat cattle may be sold, so that a separate licence be granted for every fair, and that the same shall be revocable at the discretion of the said Local Authority, and be in writing, and in such form as the Local Authority shall deem to be expedient, and at any fair, held under such licence, cattle may be sold, anything in the said Order to the contrary notwithstanding.

This Order shall be construed in like manner as the said Order of the 24th day of March last,

and all the provisions therein contained shall apply to this Order, so far as the same shall be applicable.

Bingley Gas.

Repeal or Amendment of Act; Extension of District; Increase and Regulation of Capital; Power to Purchase Additional Lands; Confirmation of Purchase and Sale of Lands already effected.

NOTICE is hereby given; that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, by the Bingley Gas Company, for leave to bring in a Bill and to obtain an Act to amend "The Bingley Gas Act, 1847," and to enlarge and extend the powers thereby conferred upon the Company, and to confer other powers upon such Company; and for that purpose:—

To enable the Company to raise additional capital, by the creation and issue of additional shares or stock, and by borrowing on mortgage, or by both or either of those modes.

to the extent of the authorized borrowing powers of the Company, and to make such debenture stock a charge on the revenue of the Company, either ranking *pari passu* with or subject to any then existing or future mortgages of the Company, and to vary and alter the rights and privileges of the present and future shareholders of the Company.

To prescribe or to authorize the Company, or the Directors thereof, to prescribe the amount and number and time and mode and terms of issue of the additional shares or stock or debenture stock to be created under the said Bill, or by virtue thereof, and to authorize the sale of all or any of such shares or stock or debenture stock by auction, or otherwise, and to prescribe the rates of interest to be attached to such debenture stock, and the rate or rates of dividend to be attached to such shares or other stock, or any part thereof respectively, and either with or without any preference or priority in the payment of interest or dividend, and with any other special privileges or advantages, and either subject, or not subject to any special conditions which the Company or the Directors thereof may think expedient:

To enable the Company to consolidate their existing shares into shares of larger nominal amount, and to convert the then existing and any future share capital into stock.

To limit the amount of shares or stock in the existing and new capital, or either of them, in respect of which proprietors may vote at meetings of the Company, and to make new provisions with respect to voting.

To make further provisions with respect to the regulation and augmentation of the capital of the Company, and with respect to the time of the holding general meetings of the Company and of declaring dividends, and to vary or alter the qualification of the shareholders, directors, and officers of the Company, and to vary or alter any other rights and privileges of the existing shareholders, directors, and officers of the Company.

To define and extend the limits or district of the Company for the supply of gas, and to enable the Company to light and to furnish a supply of gas to the whole or some part or parts of the parish of Bingley, in the West Riding of the county of York, including all or some of the following townships, hamlets, districts, and places, namely, the township of Bingley, otherwise Bingley with Micklethwaite, the township of Morton, the hamlet of Bingley, the hamlet of Micklethwaite, the hamlet of Hardeñ, the hamlet of East Morton, the hamlet of West Morton, and other townships, hamlets, districts, parishes, and places adjoining or near thereto respectively, or parts thereof respectively, and for such purposes to enlarge and extend the present gas works of the Company, and to construct additional works for the manufacture of gas within or adjoining the limits or boundaries of the existing gas works, and to construct other gas works (not being works for the manufacture of gas) in other parts of the district to be authorised by the said Bill.

and charges for the supply of gas and for the purchase or use of meters and gas fittings, and other matters sold by the Company, and of other moneys for the time being due to the Company.

To incorporate with the said Bill, and make applicable to the purposes thereof, all or some of the powers and provisions of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845;" "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845;" "The Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847;" "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860;" and "The Companies Clauses Act, 1863;" and any other provisions and Acts which may be deemed necessary or expedient for effecting the objects mentioned in this notice, and intended to be provided for by the said Bill.
