The Queen has been pleased to approve of Mr. Thomas Allcock as Consul at Goderich, Canada West, for the United States of America.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-second year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to extend the Act of the twenty-fourth year of King George the Third, chapter twenty-six, for issuing writs during any recess of the House of Commons, whether by prorogation or adjournment;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess."

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, in the manner required by the said Act, that Sir Hugh MacCalmont Cairns, Knt., late a Member serving in this present Parliament, for the borough of Belfast, hath accepted the office of Lord Justice of the Court of Appeal in Chancery, and has been gazetted thereto in the London Gazette dated the 30th day of October, 1866, and has thereby

vacated his seat; and that I shall issue my warrant to the Clerk of the Crown, to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said borough, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Palermo, stating that the cholera quarantine upon all arrivals at that port from abroad, or from the coast of the Island of Sicily, is revoked. Vessels arriving under aggravating circumstances are however excepted from this arrangement.
