**I**T is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Parliament, which now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the twentieth day of November instant, be further prorogued to Tuesday, the fifteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and that the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain do cause a Commission to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Parliament accordingly.

**I**T is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Wednesday, the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of

Her Majesty, chapter forty-one, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the ninth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of your Majesty, chapter forty-one, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme, for making better provision for the cure of souls in certain parishes and districts within the original limits of the parish of Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas, under the provisions of the said Act, certain monies have been and will be from time to time paid over to us by the Dean and Canons of the cathedral church of Manchester, and the same are and will be applicable towards making better provision for the cure of souls within the original limits of the said parish of Manchester.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, out of the monies so paid over to us, subject to the provisions of such before-mentioned Act, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of November and the first day of May, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being of each of the benefices named in the first schedule hereunto annexed, the annual sum set opposite to the name of each such benefice in the last column of the same schedule; and that the first of such half-yearly payments shall become and be due on the first day of November now next ensuing.

"And we further recommend and propose that there shall be paid by us out of the monies so paid over to us as aforesaid, subject to the provisions of the said Act, on the first day of November and on the first day of May now next ensuing, to the incumbent for the time being of each of the benefices named in the second schedule hereunto annexed, one moiety of the sum set opposite to the name of such benefice in the last column of the same schedule.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any
