

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

1. Any cattle imported from any country or place, and landed and placed for the space of twenty-eight days (or for such shorter period as may from time to time hereafter be prescribed by the Lords of the Council in respect to the country or place from which any such cattle may be imported), in sheds, pens, or other receptacles properly prepared for their reception, under the provisions of the said recited Order of Her Majesty in Council, of the 10th November, 1866, may, on the certificate of the Commissioners of Customs that all the cattle are in perfect health and free from infection, be removed to any other place or places in Great Britain, with or without a licence for such movement as may be requisite under any other Order or Statute in that behalf.

2. Nothing herein contained shall supersede, rescind, or control the authority conferred upon any Local Authority by any Order of the Privy Council in regard to the movement of cattle or sheep into or out of the district of such Authority.

3. This Order shall be construed in like manner as that of the 24th of March last; and every person who shall contravene it shall be guilty of an offence, and be subject to the provision of the said Order relative to offences; and all the other provisions of the said Order not inconsistent herewith shall apply to this Order.

4. This Order shall take effect on and after the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.
