By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

#### PRESENT,

Mr. Secretary Walpole. Sir Stafford Northcote, Bart. Mr. Waddington.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, entitled "An Act to repeal "the several Laws relating to the performance of "Quarantine, and to make other provisions in lieu "thereof," it is, amongst other things, enacted as follows:

Section 2. That from and after the 1st day of June, 1825, all vessels coming from or having touched at any place from whence His Majesty, His heirs or successors, by and with the advice of His or their Privy Council, should have adjudged and declared it probable that the plague, or other infectious disease or distemper highly dangerous to the health of His Majesty's subjects, might be brought, should be and be considered to be liable to quarantine, within the meaning of the said Act and of any Order or Crders which should be made by His Majesty, His heirs and successors, by and with the advice of His cr their Privy Council, concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection as therein mentioned; and all such vessels as aforesaid should, upon their arrival at any such port or place, be obliged to perform quarantine, in such place or places, for such time, and in such manner as should from to time be directed by His Majesty, His heirs or successors, by His or their Order or Orders in Council, notified by proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and all commanders, masters, or other persons having the charge or command of any such vessels, whether coming from any infected place, or being otherwise liable to quarantine as aforesaid, should be subject to all provisions, rules, regulations, and restrictions contained in the said Act, or in any Order or Orders which should be made by His Majesty, His heirs and successors, in Council, as aforesaid, concerning quarantine, and the prevention of infection, and to all the pains, penalties, forfeitures, and punishments contained in the said Act, for any breach or disobedience thereof, or of any Order or Orders of His Majesty in Council, made under the authority thereof.

Section 3. That it should be lawful for His Majesty, His heirs and successors, by His or their Order in Council, or for the Lords or others of His or their Privy Council, or any two or more of them, by their Order from time to time, as often as they should see reason to apprehend that the yellow fever or other highly infectious distemper prevails on the Continent of America, or in the West Indies, to require that every vessel coming from or having touched at any port or place on the Continent of America or in the West Indies, should come to an anchor at certain places to be appointed from time to time by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs (who were thereby authorised to make such appointment), for the purpose of having the state of health of the crew of such vessel ascertained before such vessel should be permitted to enter the port whereto she should be bound, or any other port of the United Kingdom; but that such vessel should not be deemed liable to quarantine unless it should be afterwards specially ordered under that restraint.

Section 6. That it should be lawful for the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, to make such Order as they should see necessary and expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in any particular case or cases, with respect to any vessel arriving and having any infectious disease or distemper on board, or on board of which any infectious disease or distemper might have appeared in the course of the yoyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection, although such vessels should not have come from any place from which His Majesty, His heirs or successors, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, might have adjudged and declared it probable that the plague or any such infectious disease or distemper might be brought, and also with respect to the persons, goods, wares, and merchandise, and other articles as therein mentioned on board the same, and likewise to make such Orders as they should see fit, for shortening the time of quarantine to be performed by particular vessels or particular persons, goods, wares, merchandise, or any other articles, or for absolutely or conditionally releasing them, or any of them from quarantine; and all such Orders so made by the Lords or others of the Privy Council, or any two or more of them as aforesaid, should be as good, valid,

and effectual, to all intents and purposes, as well with the respect to the commander, master, or other person having the charge of any vessel, and all other persons on board the same, as with respect to any other persons having any intercourse or communication with them, and to the penalties, forfeitures, and punishments to which they might respectively become liable, as any Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His heirs or successors, by and with the advice of His or their Privy Council, concerning quarantine, notified by proclamation or published in the London Gazette.

And whereas, by "The Sanitary Act, 1866," it is (amongst other things) enacted as follows:-

Section 52. That every vessel having on board any person affected with a dangerous or infectious disorder should be deemed to be within the provisions of the Act of the sixth year of King George the Fourth, chapter seventy-eight, although such vessel had not commenced her voyage, or had come from or was bound for some place in the United Kingdom; and the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any three or more of them (the Lord President of the Council or one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State being one), might, by Order or Orders to be by them from time to time made, make such Rules, Orders, and Regulations as to them should seem fit, and every such Order should be certified under the hand of the Clerk in Ordinary of Her Majesty's Privy Council, and should be published in the London Gazette, and such publication should be conclusive evidence of such Order to all intents and pur-

And whereas one of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company's vessels, called the "Tasmanian," has lately arrived, from the West Indies, in the Southampton Water, in the county of Hants, and has been directed to proceed to, and remain under quarantine at, the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight, and during and in the course of her voyage from the West Indies, the Yellow Fever, being a dangerous and infectious disease, appeared on board the said vessel, and attacked several persons on board thereof, and the said vessel arrived under alarming and suspicious circumstances; and whereas several persons who were on board the "Tasmanian" on her arrival, being all the persons on board the said ship who were known to be or suspected of being affected by the said disease, have since been ordered to be removed to the Quarantine Lazarette or Hulk called the "Menelaus," lying at the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the disposition of the other persons remaining on board the said ship "Tasmanian:"

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, in exercise of the powers vested in them in that behalf, do hereby

- 1. That the said vessel, called the "Tasmanian," shall remain and continue at the Motherbank aforesaid, until the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any three or more of them shall make further Order.
- 2. That the persons now on board the said vessel called the "Tasmanian," not ordered to be removed to the "Menelaus," shall be removed to

the ship called the "Parana," or the ship called the "Æolus," unless ordered to remain on board the "Tasmanian" by the Medical Superintendent of Quarantine, at Southampton.

3. That all persons so removed on board the "Menelaus" Quarantine Hulk, or who shall hereafter be removed on board the said Hulk, or on board the "Parana," or the " Æolus," and who shall have been on board the "Tasmanian," shall be kept and detained on board the said Hulk, or the "Parana," or the "Æolus," until the said Lords of the Council, or any three or more of them, shall make further order.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Rio de Janeiro, enclosing the following translation of a Brazilian Decree regulating the mode by which certain alterations made by a recent law in the character of the Bank of Brazil are to be carried out:—

#### (Decree.)

Ministry of Finance, No. 3720 of 18th October, 1866.

PUTS in execution the law, No. 1349 of 12th September last in the part relative to the emission of the Bank of Brazil, and to the payment of the

debt of the treasury to said bank.

In consideration of the Bank of Brazil having ceased to enjoy the faculty of emitting notes at sight, to bearer, because of the condition being accepted of the law, No. 1349 of 12th September last, by the Committee of the General Assembly of Shareholders of said bank, competently authorized to stipulate with the Government the renovation of the contract celebrated, in virtue of the law, No. 683 of 5th July, 1853, as shown by the agreement of 11th inst. between the Government and said Commission, and making use of the power which Art. 1st, § 10 of the 1st of the laws cited above, confers, I will and decree the following:—

Art. 1st. All paper of whatsoever quality, rendered useless or not, signed or unsigned, the respective check books (from whence the bank notes are cut), and any other thing relating to the emission of the Bank of Brazil, existing either in the bank itself or in its branches, shall be transmitted by the bank to the Sinking Fund Office.

§ 1. Both the paper and the other things of which this Article treats, shall be received by

inventory in duplicate, one copy remaining with the bank, the other in the Sinking Fund Office, after the necessary minutes shall have been made.

§ 2. After the paper and other inutilized objects shall have been taken to the Sinking Fund, they shall be then and there immediately burnt with

all the formalities enjoined by Art. 13.

§ 3. The surplus paper, both signed and unsigned of the effective emission of the Head Office (say Bank), on 11th instant, and that of its branches, on the dates indicated in Art. 10, which is in a perfect state, shall, after being received by the Sinking Fund establishment, be kept in the substitution department; in special coffers, one of which being for the signed and the other for the unsigned notes of which the same functionaries and employés of the coffers of the department shall keep the keys.

Art. 2nd. The notes of the bank taken into the Sinking Fund establishment, must not, under any pretext whatever, be emitted, except under the conditions and in cases marked in the present decree.

Sole paragraph.—Every and any functionary or employé of the Sinking Fund Office who shall cmit or consent to the emission of notes, which shall not be in substitution of those which are badly torn, or for other reasons, such as ought to be legally withdrawn from circulation, shall be punished by the penalties of Art. 175 of the Criminal Code.

Art. 3rd. The direction of the operations of changing and substituting, as well as that of other formalities relating to the emission of the bank, excepting that of signature, belongs to the administrative "junta" of the Sinking Fund Office, its members belonging thereto, and the respective service pertaining to the (service of the) substituting of notes department of the said establishment.

Art. 4th. The substitution of the notes of the bank, which from being torn, or from appearing to be forged, or from other motives, ought to be legally withdrawn from circulation, shall be made by the surplus notes, of which Art. 1st, § 3 treats, or by others of a new pattern engraved at the expense of the bank.

Art. 5th. The signature of the notes of the bank which are to circulate by substitution in conformity with the preceding Articles, shall continue to be done as heretofore.

- § 1. The necessary writing being completed, the masses of notes for signature shall be transmitted to the bank by the Sinking Fund Office, accompanied by a memorandum in duplicate with the necessary declaration as to the quantity of the masses and of the notes, their numbers, series, and value; and the bank, to legalize the delivery shall pass the competent receipt on one of the memoranda, which shall be restituted when they shall be returned to the Sinking Fund Office.
- § 2. The return of the signed notes to the Sinking Fund Office shall be accompanied by a specification of their numbers, series, value, and signers—signed by them in order to serve in any ulterior examination.

Art. 6th. For the payment of the sum of 11,000,000\$000 to which § 4 of the 1st Art. of the law 1349 of 12th September, 1866, refers, the proper edict and advertisements preceding the same, the change of notes of the bank for paper money to that amount shall be effected, the Sinking Fund Office stamping each one of the notes which shall be changed with a die of the word "inutilizada" (rendered useless), and putting them into a special coffer.

Art. 7th. As soon as the changing of the above-mentioned sum of 11,000,000,000, the inutilized notes shall be sent to the bank, and the directory of the said bank shall give to the Treasury in exchange for them an acquittance of the sum above referred to, giving back to them the documents pertaining to the loan, to which the Art. 57 of the statutes of 31st August, 1853, refer.

Art. 8th. As the Treasury Bills which the bank now has in its safe to the amount of 3,837,700\$000 fall due, they shall be paid to the bank in its own notes, previously stamped and inutilized in the Treasury, which shall emit a like sum, in lieu of them, in paper money which shall be furnished by the Sinking Fund Office, in conformity with Art. 1st, \$ 5, of the before cited law of 12th September of present year.

Art. 9th. Within 6 months' date of the publication of this decree, the Bank shall cause the bullion which it has in its vaults to be sold, converting its product into notes of said Bank which shall be immediately stamped and inutilized; and as fast as the said notes become inutilized, they shall send them to the Sinking Fund Office with an account of the sale of bullion.

§ 1. The Sinking Fund Office shall, in conformity with Art. 1st, § 5th of the above cited law, go on delivering to the Treasury in paper money, a sum equal to the inutilized notes

received in virtue of this Article.

§ 2. The term of 6 months, marked in this Article, having elapsed, the Sinking Fund Office shall transmit to the Treasury, an account of the notes inutilized, as also of the bullion sold invested in the cancelling of the notes referred to.

Art. 10th. The bullion existing in the coffers of the branches of the Bank of Brazil, shall also be sold within the period of 6 months, to commence from the day in which the Presidents of the respective provinces shall present to them an authentic copy of this decree, and the product of the same, converted into notes of the same branch, in conformity with the preceding Article, and the said notes, as fast as they become inutilized shall be taken in, and together with the account of sale of the bullion, remitted to the Treasury which will transmit them to the Bank, and this again to the Sinking Fund Office.

Art. 11th. The Minister of Finance, consulting with the Directory of the Bank, shall determine as to the proportion between the quantity of notes, of the head bank, and that of each one of the branches that ought to be cancelled, with the product of the reserved bullion of the same bank; which bank may effect the carrying from one to another (of the coffers of the branches) the portion of bullion (or its equivalent in paper money) which it may judge necessary for that effect.

Art. 12th. The Bank shall also transmit to the Sinking Fund Office, being previously stamped and inutilized; the notes which it may cancel in virtue of § 6, Art. 1st, of the above cited law of 12th September, and the amount of which shall be fixed yearly by decree of the Government, in the ratio of 5 to 8 per cent. of the emission of the same bank, which may remain in circulation after the dispositions of Arts. 6, 8, 9, and 10, shall be carried into execution.

Art. 13th. The burning of the notes substituted or inutilized, of which Arts. 6 and 8 treat, shall be effected in the bank, in presence of a delegate of the Government, and the others in

the Sinking Fund establishment, in presence of the respective "junta," and a representative of the bank—the competent edicts and advertisements preceding the operation, and the necessary minutes made in duplicate for the bank and for the Government, or for the Sinking Fund Office.

Art. 14th. When the bank shall have occasion to proceed to the substitution of its notes, the Sinkering Fund Office shall announce by edicts, affixed to public places, and transcribed repeatedly in the periodical journals, the time within which the said substitution should terminate, from which time forward the notes shall only be substituted for ten months, at a discount of 10 per cent. in each month, until they become of no value whatever, in conformity with Art. 5th of the law No. 54, of 6th October, 1835.

Art. 15th. The abatement or total value of the notes not substituted shall revert to the bank, in benefit of same.

Art. 16th. As soon as the discount shall commence, in conformity with the preceding Articles, the notes changed in the bank and in its respective branches, at their value, and remitted by the bank to the Sinking Fund Office, where they shall be changed for others of an equivalent nominal value.

Art. 17th. The operations of which the present decree treats, have nothing in common in the treasury, in the treasuries of finance, and Sinking Fund Office, with the operations of the public funded debt, and substitution of paper money, and the respective books shall be kept entirely separate and distinct.

Sole paragraph. In the books relating to the changing and substitution of the notes of the bank, the rules established for similar operations

in paper money shall be observed.

Art. 18th. The responsibility of the employés of the Sinking Fund Office, as to the value of amounts consisting of notes and other objects of the emission of the Bank of Brazil; their duties and obligations, and the method to be used in the changing and substitution of the notes shall be governed by the disposition of the rules and decisions of the Government, on the changing, substitution and cancelling of paper money.

Art. 19th. The treasurer and other employes of the department for substituting notes in the Sinking Fund Office, who are obliged to give security, shall ratify for the due effect of the present decree, and within the term which may be marked for them, the security given to the public treasury.

Art. 20th. Should the employes of the substitution department of the Sinking Fund not be sufficiently numerous for the operations of which this Decree treats, the Minister of Finance shall name, ad interim those who shall be indispensable, preferring the employes of extinct departments, and those pensioned (for long service,) and arbitrating to them reasonable gratuities. Zacarias Goes de Vasconcellos, of my Council, Senator of the Empire, President of the Council of Ministers, Minister and Secretary of State for the affairs of Finance, and President of the Tribunal of Ministers—say the National Treasury. Let him so have understood it, and cause it to be put in execution.
