APPOINTMENT OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT; AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

> By virtue of an Act passed in the 13th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the consolidated Offices."

SIR RICHARD MAYNE, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby appoint Standing⁸ for Hackney Carriages at the several places hereinafter mentioned, for such number of carriages each standing as is specified, and within the boundaries set forth for each standing, provided that no hackney carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

TWENTY-ONE STANDINGS APPOINTED.

KNIGHTSBRIDGE ROAD, St. George's Place. Twenty Carriages.

To commence from the footpath-gate in Hyde Park, opposite the "White Horse" public-house, along the kerbstone, towards Apsley Gate.

TURNMILL STREET, Clerkenwell. Ten Carriages.

To commence fifteen feet North of the lamp post near the exitdoor of the Metropolitan Railway Station, in Turnmill Street, and extend along the kerbstone, parallel with the Railwaywall, as far as necessary for ten hackney carriages to stand.

DOCK STREET.

Four Carriages.

Whitechapel.

To commence opposite the lamp at the South entrance of the "Rose" tavern, and extend along the centre of the street northward as far as necessary for four hackney carriages to stand.

HACKNEY ROAD,

Four Carriages.

(East End).

Mile End.

To commence twelve yards from the Obelisk, and extend along the centre of the Hackney Road as far as necessary for four hackney curriages to stand.

NEW GRAVEL LANE,

Six Carriages. Shadwell.

To commence twenty feet South of the Dock Gates, in the centre of the road, and extend Southward as far as necessary for six hackney carriages to stand.

BURDETT ROAD,

Four Carriages.

To commence fifteen feet from the crossing in Mile End Road, and extend along the centre of Burdett Road as far as necessary for four backney carriages to stand.

CLARKE'S PLACE, Upper Street, Islington. Ten Carriages.

To commence ten yards from the kerbstone of the Urinal, and extend, in the centre of the road, towards Islington Green, as far as necessary for ten hackney carriages to stand.

GREAT CAMBRIDGE STREET, Hackney Road. Six Carriages.

In Great Cambridge Street, Hackney Road, to commence two yards South of the crossing on the South side of Gloucester and Margaret Streets, and extend along the centre of Great Cambridge Street, as far as necessary for six hackney carriages to stand.

HIGH STREET.

Six Carriages.

Kingsland.

In High Street, Kingsland, one carriage to stand on the South side of the Urinal opposite Dalston Lane, and backed close to said Urinal, in the centre of the road, horse's head towards Shoreditch Church; and five on the North side of the said Urinal, extending along the centre of High Street as far as necessary for six hackney carriages to stand.
