(No. 5.)—MEDITERRANEAN—FRANCE, SOUTH COAST.

Rovolving Light on Cape Couronne.

THE Minister of Public Works of France has given notice, that from the 1st day of January, 1867, a light would be exhibited on Cape Couronne, the eastern point of the Gulf de Foz, South Coast of France.

The light is a revolving red light, attaining its greatest brilliency every 20 seconds. It is elevated 55 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles.

The tower is stone, 38 feet high; in lat. 43° 19′ 33″ N., and long. 5° 3′ 6″ East of Greenwich.

Two Fixed Harbour Lights at Villa Franca.

Also, that from the 1st day of January, 1867, two harbour lights would be exhibited in the harbour of Villa Franca, South Coast of France:

1st. A fixed red light from a lamp-post on the terrace of the Lazaretto, elevated 47 feet above the level of the sea, and 43 feet above the ground. In clear weather it should be seen from a distance of 4 miles.

2nd. A fixed green light from a lamp-post on the extremity of the mole, elevated 26 feet above the level of the sea, and 21½ feet above the ground. In clear weather it should be seen from a distance of 4 miles.

## Fixed Harbour Light at St. Jean.

Also, that from the 1st day of January, 1867, a harbour light would be exhibited from the extremity of the East Mole of Port St. Jean, in the Gulf of St. Ospizio, on the South Coast of France.
