**TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S COURTS AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.**

*By Her Majesty's Command.*

The number of Ladies and Gentlemen attending each Court will be limited to two hundred and sixty, including those who will be presented to Her Majesty.

It is expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Her Majesty's Court only when in attendance upon the Ladies of their families.

Those Gentlemen who have not been presented to The Queen will, under such circumstances, be eligible for presentation to Her Majesty at these Courts.

The presentation of Ladies and Gentlemen will be limited to one hundred at each Court.

Ladies and Gentlemen, wishing to attend Her Majesty's Courts must send in their names and addresses to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, S.W., on or after Thursday, the 21st instant, and these names will be submitted for Her Majesty's approval in the order of their receipt at the Office.

All applications must be made in writing, and no names will be received previous to the 21st instant.

Ladies and Gentlemen who desire to be presented to Her Majesty must, in like manner, send in their names and addresses to the Lord Chamberlain's Office on or after the 21st instant. A letter from the Lady or Gentleman by whom each presentation is to be made must in all cases be forwarded.

The Queen has been graciously pleased, with regard to these Courts, to dispense with the regulation that the Lady or Gentleman must attend

the Court at which they propose to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lord Chamberlain will forward to all persons who can be received under the above regulations, cards for their admission to Buckingham Palace at the Court which Her Majesty shall be pleased to appoint for their reception.

In sending in their names Ladies and Gentlemen are requested to mention the Court which they would prefer to attend.

All those Ladies and Gentlemen who receive cards of admission to Buckingham Palace are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty. In the case of presentation the name of the presenter must be inserted on the card.

*By Her Majesty's command.*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's

Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levees, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, an Extract from the "Moniteur," relative to the importation into France of Peruvian guano and borax, of which the following is a translation:—

ARTICLE I.

AN Arrangement relative to the importation of Peruvian guano into France and the French colonies having been signed, December 2, 1866, between France and Peru, the aforesaid Arrangement, the substance of which follows, has been approved and will receive its full and entire execution:—

ARRANGEMENT.

The Government of His Majesty the Emperor of the French and the Government of the Republic of Peru, wishing to facilitate, by new arrangements reciprocally advantageous to the two countries, the development of the consumption of Peruvian guano in France and in the French colonies, have agreed to substitute the following

stipulations for the Arrangement concluded between France and Peru, January 15, 1864 :

Dating from the day when this Arrangement shall have been approved by the Government of His Majesty the Emperor, guano imported from Peru under all flags will be admitted without payment of the custom-house duties into the ports of France and the French colonies.

Commencing from the same date, the price of Peruvian guano sold in France and the French colonies, whatever the amount sold, will be reduced to three hundred francs per ton of one thousand kilogrammes.

Whenever the sale price of this guano in the European markets shall be increased or diminished the price of three hundred francs fixed for France shall be raised and lowered in the same proportion. The same will hold good in the French colonies in case of an increase or diminution in the actual prices of sale in the markets of the neighbouring English possessions.

Commencing from the same date, borax imported direct from Peru into France will be admitted, under whatever flag it may be imported, free of custom-house duties if it is raw, and at a duty of five per cent. of its value if it is half-refined.

The present Arrangement will have a fixed duration of five years, dating from this day (December 2, 1866), and after that date it will remain binding from year to year until one of the two Governments may have announced, one year beforehand, its intention of putting an end to its powers.

(No. 9.)—NOVA SCOTIA.

**Fixed Lights on East Ironbound Island.**

THE Colonial Government of Nova Scotia have given notice, that two lights are now

exhibited from the lighthouse recently erected on Ironbound Island, entrance of Mahone Bay.

The lights are two *fixed* white lights placed horizontally, 25 feet apart, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The lighthouse is a square wooden building, painted white, in lat.  $44^{\circ} 26\frac{1}{2}'$  N. long.  $64^{\circ} 4\frac{1}{2}'$  West of Greenwich.

The keeper's residence is in the lighthouse.

#### *Fixed Light on Amet Island.*

Also, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Amet Island, Tatamagouche Bay, Northumberland Strait.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 44 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The tower is a square wooden building 32 feet high, painted white. It is in lat.  $45^{\circ} 50\frac{1}{4}'$  N. long.  $63^{\circ} 10'$  West of Greenwich.

The keeper's residence is in the lighthouse.

#### *Green Island Light.*

Also, that from the 1st day of October, 1866, the light on Green Island, at the entrance of the Gut of Canso, was changed from a *fixed* white light to a *fixed* red light.

#### *Egg Island Lighthouse.*

Also, that from the 1st day of October, 1866, the lighthouse on Egg Island off Ship Harbour, formerly painted *white* was painted *black and white* in vertical stripes.
