REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S COURTS AT
BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The number of Ladies and Gentlemen attending each Court will be limited to two hundred and sixty, including those who will be presented to Her Majesty.

It is expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Her Majesty's Court only when in attendance upon the Ladies of their families.

Those Gentlemen who have not been presented to The Queen will, under such circumstances, be eligible for presentation to Her Majesty at these Courts.

The presentation of Ladies and Gentlemen will be limited to one hundred at each Court.

Ladies and Gentlemen wishing to attend Her Majesty's Courts must send in their names and addresses to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, S.W., on or after Thursday, the 21st instant, and these names will be submitted for Her Majesty's approval in the order of their receipt at the Office.

All applications must be made in writing, and no names will be received previous to the 21st instant.

Ladies and Gentlemen who desire to be presented to Her Majesty must, in like manner, send in their names and addresses to the Lord Chamberlain's Office on or after the 21st instant. A letter from the Lady or Gentleman by whom each presentation is to be made must in all cases be forwarded.

The Queen has been graciously pleased, with regard to these Courts, to dispense with the regulation that the Lady or Gentleman must attend

the Court at which they propose to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lord Chamberlain will forward to all persons who can be received under the above regulations, cards for their admission to Buckingham Palace at the Court which Her Majesty shall be pleased to appoint for their reception.

In sending in their names Ladies and Gentlemen are requested to mention the Court which they would prefer to attend.

All those Ladies and Gentlemen who receive cards of admission to Buckingham Palace are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty. In the case of presentation the name of the presenter must be inserted on the card.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's

Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levees, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council, bearing date the 24th day of March last, reciting certain provisions of the Act of the 11th and 12th years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter 107, which has been continued by divers Acts, and lastly by an Act of the last session of Parliament, until the first day of August next, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, and the appearance and prevalence of a contagious and infectious disorder, generally designated the "Cattle Plague," amongst cattle in England and Wales, and sundry other matters, the said Lords did, in exercise of the powers given by the said Act so continued as aforesaid, make divers rules and regulations, and did, among other things, order that until the 1st day of June, 1866, all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom into any town or place in England, should be marked, by clipping the hair off the end of the tail; and that no such cattle

should be removed alive from such town or place, except by sea, and that town or place in such regulation should, according to circumstances, mean, in the case of any town or place other than the metropolis or any borough, such area as might be defined by the Privy Council to constitute such town or place :

And whereas such Order hath, by a subsequent Order, bearing date the 26th day of May last, been continued and amended until the Lords of the said Council should thereafter otherwise order :

And whereas cattle may now be brought by sea to a place in the harbour of Chichester, in the county of Sussex, termed Del Quay, situated on one side of the said harbour, but without the municipal boundaries of the city and borough of Chichester, and it is expedient that the area of the said place should be defined according to the regulation aforesaid :

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby, for the purposes of the said first-mentioned Order, define the area of the said place to be all that space occupied by the landing place, wharf, sheds, and other premises now in the possession and occupation of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the city of Chichester, and no other, so that all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom, and landed at that place, shall be slaughtered within such area, and not elsewhere :

And the said Lords do further order that all the regulations of the said Order of the 24th March now in force, and not inconsistent herewith, shall apply to this Order :

And further, that the Local Authority of the said county of Sussex shall publish this Order by causing a copy thereof to be advertized in some newspaper circulating in the said county:

QUALIFICATION OF PUBLIC VACCINATORS.

WHEREAS it is required under the Regulations set forth in the Order of the Lords of the Privy Council, dated 1st December, 1859, that persons to be thereafter contracted with by the Guardians and Overseers of Unions and Parishes in England for the performance of public vaccination shall (except in certain cases) produce a certificate of proficiency in vaccination, given, after due examination, or instruction and examination, by some Public Vaccinator whom the Privy Council authorize to act for that purpose:—

Notice is hereby given, that, subject to the same conditions as their Lordships have heretofore appointed in the like matter, and subject also to their Lordships' further orders, Mr. Frederick Holmes, of 23, Boynton-street, Quarry-hill, Leeds, officiating as Public Vaccinator in the parish of Leeds, is authorised to give certificates for the purposes of the aforesaid Order to persons whom he, at his appointed station, shall have examined or instructed in vaccination.
