The Queen has been pleased to appoint William Henry Gosling, Esq., to be a Member of the Council of the Bermudas or Somers' Islands.

Whitehall, February 25, 1867.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto James Tovey, now residing in the Coton Hill Asylum, in the county of Stafford, Her Royal licence and authority for enabling him, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of James Tennent, of Pynacles, in the parish of Great Stanmore, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, deceased, to take upon himself and use the surname of Tennent only, and also to bear and quarter the arms of Tennent with his own family arms; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and registered in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Buenos Ayres, enclosing a copy of the New Currency Law, fixing the value of the Paper-Money of that State:—

THE NEW CURRENCY LAW.

Establishment of Exchange Office.

This Bill having duly received the sanction of both Legislative Chambers, was yesterday promulgated as law by the Executive.

Art. 1. The Provincial Bank is authorized to give 25 paper-dollars for every patacon presented to be changed.

Art. 2. It is also authorized to give the amount of specie so received at one patacon for 25 paper-dollars.

Art. 3. If paper-money should go above 25 to the patacon, and that the Bank have paid away all the specie received in exchange for the amount of the present emission, the Bank shall still continue to give gold at 25 paper-dollars to the patacon as far as its reserve of specie will go.

Art. 4. Parties indebted to the Bank or the State can satisfy their debts indifferently in gold or paper-money, at 25 dollars per patacon.

Art. 5. The Provincial Bank may emit as much paper-money as will be requisite for fulfilment of this law.

Art. 6. The Executive is authorized to receive proposals for conversion of the paper currency, and submit same in the most convenient form for the consideration of the Legislature.
